PREFACE

About 1980, some family conversations seemed to center on family ancestors. It was fascinating to hear how much information could be remembered about great grandparents, going back to the early parts of the 19th century. We all seemed fascinated about the old times, and going back to the civil war, and even before, seemed so easy. Of course, most persons, and things discussed were rather sketchy, and a lot of names, dates, and events had been forgotten.

Mrs. Geneva Clarke Guss remembered her early childhood in the Ridge area of Henrico County, her family moving to Amelia County, when but a teenager, and how their family life changed, especially with the early death of her father, "Dave" Clarke (the Clarke family always spelled their name with an e!) "Dave" had been a stonecutter, and one of his jobs was on the Richmond City Hall. From his occupation he suffered the stone cutter's disease. Her grandfather John Wesley Clarke had moved to Richmond, from Williamsburg a long time before she was born, but she knew that he had an accident in the James River and had drowned. Her grandmother Clarke, who died as a young woman in Williamsburg, was, before her marriage, a Ball. One of her older brothers had an accident on the RF&P Railroad, as a teenager, and he was killed instantly.

Her mother was Annie Jackson Wilkinson, born in Powhatan County, but like many others, her father, a Confederate soldier, for a livelihood had to move to Richmond to survive. The Wilkinson home, in Powhatan County, was known as the "Milky Way Plantation". The fact that the name has not survived has no bearing on how great that plantation was.

James "Jim" Corbett Guss could look back on his family life and tell how his grandfather John Guss had bought a farm in Powhatan County, sight unseen from a friend, while living in Wood County, Ohio, near Toledo, Ohio. They moved here, puting their belongings in a wagon, and managed to move 550 or so miles by "horsepower". They might have expected to find the old southern plantation, but instead they found red clay to cultivate, and a hard post Civil War economy to face. When his father died in 1912, "Jim", his mother, and sisters (one not yet born) times were really hard.

With this, just as starters, the road to searching for the unknown ancestors and the unknown information, seemed such a real challenge, and source of enjoyment. It would be a great understatment, to say that the search has been enjoyable. I hope this book will bring you a little bit of the joy I have experienced in the research and writing of this book.

HOW TO USE THIS BOOK

As the title of this book, MY WIFE'S FAMILY, would suggest, the purpose is to tell about her family, and her ancestors. Her ancestral chart is listed on pages 10-a through 16c.

The amount of information about each ancestor varies, but the location of this information is listed under the Table of Contents.

A few abbreviations are listed in the family trees. These are bborn, d-died, m-married, dau-daughter, bur-buried, bapt-baptized, (1)first spouse, (2) second spouse, c-circa, and div-divorced. In addition months and states are abbreviated.

An attempt has been made in this book to list all members of families, at least until two families merge, by marriage, into one new family. Where family histories have been published, the names of such books are listed. The numbering system, used in this book, is not a unique one, and a number of books on family histories employ the same system.

The purpose of the system is to assign a number to each person in a family. The first (single) digit identifies the earliest known person, or persons, in a family history, with number 1 being the oldest known ancestor, and the other single digits being brothers or sisters of #1. For families with 10 or more children, X will be the tenth person. Starting with the llth person, the alphabet will be used starting with A as the llth person, B as the 12th person, etc.

The children of each person of the first column, will be listed in like manner in the second column: so the first child of the first ancestor will be 11. The first child of 11 will be 111 (grandchild of #1). The second child would be 112, etc.

An example of the way the system works may be shown by looking up the ancestors of Dennis Collins (Wilkinson family):

CHARLES GUSS

Charles Guss was born in Baden, Germany in 1732. When he was 18 years of age, in 1750, he immigrated to Trappe, Pennsylvania. By education and training he was a teacher and a scrivener. On July 12th, 1761 he married Mary Shunk, who was born on May 4, 1741 and they lived on French Creek, Chester County, Pennsylvania. According to their tombstones, Charles died on September 1, 1795 and Mary died on April 30, 1821. However, the inventory of his estate was dated 30 August 1794, at which time he was termed "deceased" and his will was dated 9 August 1794, so he must have died between those two dates. Mary was the daughter of Simon Shunk and Anna Magdalena Shymer.

As was common with the names of many persons of German origin, Charles Guss and his descendents had their last name spelled in different ways. Guss has been written Gass, Gos, Goss, Guess, Gus and Gust. One member of the Gust family was stopped in his research of the family name, as he ran into the name Guss and knew that that was not his family!

An early tax record in Pikeland Township, Chester County, Pennsylvania in 1765 listed Charles as being a school master and owning one cow. The same year, Pastor Handschuch, in his report to the Lutheran synod said, "In Vincent township there is a good school, an excellent teacher, and about sixty scholars". The "Lutheran Observer" of 17 October 1884, also stated, "In those early days in the Lutheran Church, the school went hand in hand with the church, and in accord with the custom of that age, when the schoolmaster stood next to the minister, Charles Guss often officiated at religious meetings in the absence of the preacher..." While no record has been found showing which church Charles attended it is thought that he substituted at Augustus Lutheren Church in Trappe, Upper Providence Township, Montgomery Co, as it appears to be less than five miles from where Charles lived.

On 30 September 1765, Charles Guss, Upper Hanover Twp., Philadelphia Co., was naturalized under Act of 13 George II, "giving those qualified by seven years residence in any colony, with a few limitations, the rights of natural-born subjects of Great Britain upon their taking the prescribed oaths before the Chief Judge or other Judge of the colony wherein they had resided"

The following is the will of Charles Guss:

"In the name of God Amen. This 9th day of August in the year of our Lord 1794 I Charles Guss of the Township of Vincent, County of Chester and State of Pennsyia. Husbandman being Sick of body but of Sound mind and Memory praised be the Lord for the Same, Do make and Ordain this my last will and Testament in the Manner and form following that is to Say first and Chiefly I Recommend my Soul into the hands of my Creator Almighty God that Gave it; and my body I commit to the Earth to be Decently buried at the Discretion of my Executors hereafter Named, and as for what Temporal Estate it hath pleased God to bless me with in this Life I give and bequeath thereof as followeth that is to Say; first I order that my Just Debts and

funeral charges be first paid by my Executor, also I give and bequeath unto my Eldest Son Charles Guss one English Shilling Sterling which Shall be his full Shear of my Estate thirdly I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Mary Guss full Power and Enjoyment of this my Plantation we live on Situated in Vincent Afore Said Together with my Personal Estate To Do with it what She Pleases During her Natural Life and after her Decease what is left Shall be Divided into Six Equal Shears within one Quarter of a year that is to say one full Sixt shear to my daughter Magdalain Smith for her sosort During her Natural Life, and after her Decease (what is left shall be divided -- nearly illegible) Equal Shears Alike Among her lawfull begoten Living Children Excluding Yeost Smith from having one mite thereof Item, I give and bequeath unto my Deceased Daughter Rachels children one Sixt Shear to be Equally Divided also to my Son Simon my three Daughters Namely Catharine Elizabeth and Sarah Each of them one full Sixt Shear Lastly I do Constitute make and ordain, my afore Said wife Mary Guss and my aforsd. Son Simon Guss joint Executors of this my last will & Testament and Do hereby Impower my afore Said Executor Simon Guss after my wifs Decease to Sell my Lands and Convey a Lawfull Title to the Buyer and if in Case my wifs Decease to Sell my Lands and Convey a Lawfull Title to the Buyer and if in Case my wife Should See Proper to Sell my Land in her life time I also Impower Said Simon Guss to Convey a Title as afore said and I do hereby Utterly Revoke and Disannul all other wills and Testaments heretofor made. Reatifying and Confirming this and no other to be my last will and Testament.

Then Personly appeared Conrad Shunk & Peter Shunk and on their solemn affirmation according to law did depose declare and say that they were present and did see and hear Charles Guss the testator within named sign Seal Publish Pronounce and Declare the within Testament of writing as and for his last will and testament and that at the doing thereof he was of a well Disposing mind and memory to the best of their Understandings.

CHARLES GUSS (Jr.)

Charles Guss (Jr.) was born 3 January 1765 probably in Vincent Township, Chester County, Pennsylvania. The date is unknown but he married Martha Limburg. Possibly the name of Limburg had other spellings, and possibly George Limbert, who arrived on the ship Chesterfield 2 September 1749 in Philadelphia was her father or other relative.

Charles lived with his great grandfather, Conrad Shymer, and great grandmother, Anna Margareta Scheimer, as a boy, at least until 1780, when his great grandfather died. Conrad Shymer's will provided that should Charles stay with his great grandmother until her death that he would inherit their place and moveable assets. By 1786 he had moved to Windsor Township in Berks County, paying taxes, which record showed that he was married at the time. In 1800 he was living in Tulpehocken Township, Berks County.

Charles had moved to the borough of Hamburg, where he was listed in both the 1810 and 1820 census. In 1830 Charles was listed as a mason and a citizen of Hamburg, Pennsylvania, in a Berks County history. Charles and Martha's children Samuel, John, Casper, Lewis, Christiana and Sophia Catharine are listed as members of the Lebanon Evangelical Lutheran Church, later known as St. Paul's (Smoke) Union Church, Windsor Township, Berks County, Pennsylvania. The church record list Sophia Gossin, Johannes Goss, Catharine Gossler, Kasper Goss and Christina Gass so we see some of the variant spellings of Guss in one church's record. In the early 1830's Charles moved to Schylkill County, where he died near Pine Grove.

Son John Guss moved to Louisiana, Casper moved to Sandusky County, Ohio; Lewis moved to Winimac, Pulaski County, Indiana, and Samuel moved to Schuylkill County, Pennsylvania.

Samuel Guss was buried in Kimmel's Churchyard, East Brunswick Township, Schuylkill County, Pennsylvania. His daughter Elmira married William F. Voute and moved to Chicago, Illinois. His son Wallace was born 28 January 1843 in Pine Grove, Schuylkill County, Pennsylvania and was a very prominent citizen, and in 1872 was elected to the Pennsylvania General Assembly.

It is believed that at least some of the daughters moved to the counties of Juniata and Susquehanna in Pennsylvania

CASPER GUSS

Casper Guss, the son of Charles Guss (Jr.) was born c1796 in Berks County, Pennsylvania and married Mary Magdalena Seltzer, the daughter of John Seltzer, was born c1793 in Windsor Township, Berks County, Pennsylvania. In 1834 they moved from Windsor Township, Berks County, Pennsylvania to Sandusky County, Ohio. At that time all transportation in this section of the country was done by wagon, and it is quite probable that the wagon was the family home until a log cabin could be erected in the forest where the new home was located. Mr. Guss was one of the hardy pioneers of Sandusky County and he labored assiduously in the clearing and development of his farm. He was a hatter by trade, but gave his attention to agricultural affairs in his Ohio home. Recreational activities were limited but, one activity he enjoyed, which also supplied food, was fishing!

After moving to Ohio, Casper Guss bought the following land recorded in deed book volume G, pages 542 and 543, of Sandusky County, Ohio:

"This Indenture made this first day of October, in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and thirty four, between Jacob Roszell of the County of Summerset and State of New Jersey and Lydia, his wife of the first part, and Casper Guss, of the State of Ohio of the Second part, Witnesseth, that the said party of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of two hundred and seventy five dollars money of the United States, to them in hand were and truly paid, by the said party of the second part, at and before the Sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt Whereof is hereby acknowledged, and the said party the first part herewith fully satisfied, content and paid: have given, granted, bargained, sold, aliened. enfeoffed, conveyed and confirmed, and by these presents do give, grant, bargain, sell, alien, enfeoff, convey and confirmed to the said party of the second part, his heirs and assigns forever, all that tract, piece or parcel of land situated in Township four, in the District of Delaware, and State of Ohio, containing eight one acres and seven hundredths of an acre. Whereas, Hezekiah Kilbourn, of the State of Ohio, has deposited, in the General Land Office, of the United States a certificate of the Register of the Land Office, at Delaware in Ohio whereby it appears, that full payment has been made, by the said Hezekiah Kilbourn, according to the provisions of the Act of Congress, of the 24th of April 1820, entitled an act making further provision for the sale of the public lands, for the East half of the Northwest quarter of Section thirty one, in Township four North of the Base line of Range fifteen in the District of Delaware and State of Ohio containing eighty acres and seven hundredths of acre, according to the official plat of the Survey, of the said lands, returned to the General Land Office, by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been purchased by the said Hezekiah Kilbourn reference thereunto being had will more fully appear Together with all and Singular, the profits privileges and advantages, with the appurtenances to the same belonging or in any wise appertaining also all the Estate right to the interest property claim-and demand whatsoever, of the said party of the first part of in and to the same; and of, in and to

every part and parcel whereof: To have and to Hold all and singular whether in described tract or lot of land and premises, with the appurtenances, unto the said party of the second part his heirs and assigns, to the only proper use, benefit and behoof of the said party of the second part his heirs and assigns forever. And the said Isaac Roszell, and Lydia, his wife, the said party of the first part doth for themselves, their heirs Executors and administrators, covenant and grant, to and with the said party of the second part, his heirs and assigns, that they the said Isaac Roszell and Lydia, now are the true, lawful and right owners of all and singular the herein described land and premises, and of every part and parcel thereof, with the appurtenances, thereunto belonging and that the said land, and premises, or any part thereof, at the time of sealing and delivery of these presents are not encumbered by any mortgage, judgement or limitation, or by any encumbrance whatsoever, by which the title of the said party of the second part, hereby made, or intended to be made for the above described land and premises, can or may be changed, charged, altered, or defeated in any way whatever. And also, that the said part of the first part, no where gave right, full power, and lawful authority to grant, bargain, sell and convey the said land and premises in manner aforesaid. Also that the said Isaac Roszell, and his wife Lydia, the party of the first part, will warrant, secure, and forever defend, the said land and premises, unto the said Casper Guss, the said party of the second part, his heirs and assigns forever, against the lawful claims and demands of all every person and persons, freely and clearly rec'd and discharged, of and fromall manner of encumbrances whatsoever. In witness whereof, the said Isaac Roszell, and Lydia his wife have hereunto set their hands and sealed the day and year above written.

While Isaac Roszell lived in New Jersey, others in the Roszell moved to Sandusky County, and were neighbors of Casper and family.

At the time of his death, in politics he was Democrat and in religion a Lutheran. He died 2 July 1860 in Jackson Township, Sandusky County, Ohio intestate and many of the articles were kept by Mary which included:

The following sales were made:

John Gust bought 1 set matched planes \$40, 1 large spining wheel \$25, 1 gun \$3.

Mary M. Gust (widow) bought 1 cooking stove \$1.25, 4 chairs for \$.81, 1 kitchen cupboard \$1.31, 1 fanning mill \$1.00, 1 cutting box 6¢, 1 buggy \$10.00, and 1 heifer for \$11.87.

Otho Lease bought a hoe & auger 6¢, 1 barrel churn \$1.12, and 1 shovel plough \$.31.

Others who attended the sale bought a 3 gallon jug for .15, 1 pair hand irons .15, 1 woodsaw & auger .25, 1 dining table .00, 1 piece of chain 7¢, 20 bushels of oats .70, 77 bushels of oats .18.10, and 4 hogs .17.00, and a walnut cupboard valued at .3.

Several relatives & friends owed Casper Guss money, for which he held notes, totaling \$188.39

After Mary Guss died 17 December 1871, also intestate, another sale was held, with John Guss buying tumblers for 15¢, dishes for 40¢, pictures for 25¢ and 30¢, a clock for \$1.00, curtains for \$1.90, a carpet for \$4.50, a coverlet for \$5.75, a chest for 65¢, and table cloths for 55¢ and 60¢.

Also, Casper Guss, Samuel Guss, T. G. Lease, George Guss, George Fry, A. Guss, George Sherer, Otho Lease, F. M. Winters, were some of the relatives buying items at the sale. Many neighbors and friends also bought some of the items for sale. After collection of all accounts due, there was a total of \$421.80 due the heirs and each heir received \$46.84

JOHN GUSS

John Guss, the son of Casper Guss and Mary Magdalena Seltzer, was born 20 October 1819 in Hamburg, Windsor Township, Berks County, Pennsylvania and died 20 September 1901 in Powhatan County, Virginia. He married Angelina Rollins, who was born 1 September 1824 in Ohio and died 25 January 1903 in Powhatan County, VA. Both are buried in the Genito Presbyterian Church Cemetery.

John Guss was a friend of Charles Richards, who also lived in Wood County, Ohio. After buying a tract of land in Virginia, Charles Richards was successful in selling this land, sight unseen, to his friend John Guss. The copy of the deed follows:

"Know all men by these presents that we, Charles Richards and Phebe his wife, of Milburn, County of Wood, State of Ohio, Richards. in consideration of the sum of Three thousand two hundred & twenty two dollars to us in hand paid by John Guss of Lake Township, County of Wood, State of Ohio, the recipt whereof is hereby acknowledged do hereby bargain, sell and convey to the said John Guss and his heirs and assigns forever the following described real estate viz., Bounded as follows on the North to Butterwood Creek, on the East by land formerly owned by James Cornick, Thomas Dorsett and E. Blankenship and R. & D. RR on the South by West by the Appomattox River known as the Jones' Tract-party of the first part reserving the family graveyard on the tract & crops also on the same described Jones tract to contain four hundred and forty seven acres, more or less of land, To Have and to Hold the above granted and bargained premises with the appurtenances thereto belonging unto the said John Guss his heirs and assigns forever to his and their own proper use and behoof and use, the said Charles Richards and Phebe Richards do for our heirs executors and administrators covenant with the said John Guss and his heirs and assigns that at and until the unsealing of these presents we are well seized of the promises as a good and indefensiable estate in fee simple, and have good right to bargain and sell the same in manner and form as above written and that the same be free from all encumbrance whatsoever. And furthermore we the said Charles Richards and Phebe Richards do by these presents bind our heirs forever to warrant and defend through _____ the above granted and bargained premises to the said John Guss and his heirs and assigns against all lawful claims and demands whatsoever, and I, the said Phebe Richards do hereby remmise, release, and forever quit claim unto the said John Guss and his heirs and assigns all of my right and title of dower in the above described premises.

In Witness whereof we have hereunto set our hands & seals this 25th day of July in the year of our Lord 1879. Signed seal & delivered Chas Richards (seal) in presence of Phebe Richards (seal) H. D. Grove & Frank Richards The State of Ohio, Wood County ss:

Be it remembered that on the 25th day of July in the year of our Lord 1879 before me, the subscriber a Justice of the Peace with in and for said County personally came Charles Richards the grantor in the above conveyance and acknowledged the signing and sealing thereof to be his voluntary act and deed for the purpose therein mentioned. And the said Phebe Richards being examined by me seperate and apart from her said husband and the contents of said deed made known and explained to her did declare that she did voluntarily sign, seal and acknowledge the same is and that she still satisfied therewith as her act and deed for the uses and purposes therein mentioned.

JAMES CORBETT GUSS

James Corbett Guss, the son of George Montgomery Guss and Lena A. Knabe was born 1 April 1891 Powhatan County, Virginia, in the log cabin on the Guss estate which his grandfather, John Guss, had purchased. On 12 February 1920 he married Geneva May Clarke, the daughter of Octavious Clarke and Annie Jackson Wilkinson, who was born 5 September 1899 in Henrico County, Virginia. The whole family farmed and their cash crop was tobacco. In 1924 he was hired by the Southern Railroad and he worked for them until 1940 or 1941. Most of the time he boarded in Richmond, so he was separated from the family a lot of the time, except for weekends. What was left over, after paying for room and board, helped the family at home. During the World War II years, he worked part time, locally, at Wagner's stave mill.

While still a boy, his father cut enough oak timber off the farm to build a home for them. He contracted Chesley Dorsett, a local builder, to build the home. The Guss family moved into the new house about 1905. His son, James Guss, Jr. and wife Charlene, remodeled the house in the 1970's, where they now live.

After the death of George Montgomery Guss, times were very hard for the family. John Guss and his wife, Lena, helped the family by taking Clara into their home to raise; and so doing, filled some of the loneliness of their lives as they were childless.

About 1924 James had the log cabin remodeled and added a kitchen onto the back, and frame siding was added to the home. The family soon moved back into the "new" home. Jane had her hands full taking care of the children, growing her garden, and milking the family cow. They lived in the house until 1937, when a neighbor, who worked in New York, offered them his home, in which to live, and the farm for their use. They lived there until 1951, when the neighbor sold the farm and they then had to find another home.

They soon found a farm in Henrico County about 2 miles west of Laurel on the southside of Hungary Road. Jane was so happy to have a home of her own. The three story frame house, with an English basement, might have been built a hundred years before, but it had a lot of space, and at one time or another all the children, and most of the grandchildren, came back home and lived for a while. In the 1970's James health became a source of real concern, and after an operation, he lived for about 2 years, before dying on 21 May 1977, at St. Lukes Hospital, Parham Road, Henrico County. James was buried in the Genito Presbyterian Church Cemetery, Powhatan, Virginia.

When sister Annie was going to business school in Richmond, she met Henry West, a career army soldier, who bacame her husband. Sisters "Lizzie" and Kate moved to Richmond in 1940, where they still live. Sadie continued to live on the home place until her death in 1948. Mother Lena continued to live in the home that she and her husband George had built until 1954, when it was necessary for her to have some assistance. She moved to Richmond and lived with daughters Lizzie and Kate until her death in 1957 James C. Guss and Geneva May Clarke had the following children:

HAZEL MAY GUSS

Hazel May Guss was born 14 September 1920 on the Guss estate, the first child of James Corbett Guss and Geneva May Clarke. She was born prematurely and only weighed about one and a half pounds. Hardly anyone, including the family doctor, Dr. Burton, thought it possible that she would survive. However, at her first birthday she weighed twelve pounds.

In 1926 she started to school at the Genito School, which she attended for 3 years. Before the time of school buses, it was necessary for her to walk to school, much of the winter starting for school before the sun rose, a distance of three or four miles! The roads during the winter could be muddy and rutted, or covered with ice, or frozen water. It was sure quite a lot different from todays modern roads and heated and air conditioned buses! In 1929 she attended another school, the Clayville School, which was a little closer, and she could walk down a comparatively good rail road track to the school. This school she attended until 1932, when she was transferred to the beautiful brick school at Powhatan Court House, which accomodated the upper grades for the entire County of Powhatan. While in high school she played on the girls varsity high school basketball team. She was graduated from Powhatan High School in the class of 1939.

Not long after her graduation from school, since there were no opportunities of employment in Powhatan County, she went to Richmond, and secured employment in the Crawford Manufacturing Company. She lived in a boarding house about 18 blocks from where she worked, and most of the time she walked to and from work to save the seven cents it cost to ride on the street car. Later her sister Blanche and then aunts Lizzie and Kate also moved to Richmond and worked at Crawford Manufacturing Company.

The company was not always flourishing with work, but the beginning of World War II brought a flood of work, and full time work was available for all employees, and new labor was always sought. The work was piece work, which enabled the hard worker to make more money.

Hazel like so many other young women of the day, joined the USO, which took time. She attended some functions, and one of these was a trip to the City of Petersburg in the fall of 1944. There she met a soldier by the name of Noah "Harry" Bradley, who was in the Signal Corps, stationed at Camp Pickett, Virginia. Shortly, thereafter, he was transferred to Ft. Bragg, North Carolina. Later, he was transferred, on detached service, to Fort Leonard Wood in Missouri. After his return, his outfit was sent to Okinawa, and after the war to Korea. During all this time, the letters went back and forth between the two, and on March 2, 1946 they were united in marriage at the Methodist Church parsonage in Chester, Virginia.

By June 1946 Hazel and Harry had moved to Bowling Green, Ohio where he attended Bowling Green State University in business administration. Both of them also worked for Thomas Ohns in the restaurant business. They bought a home, added a couple of rooms to the rear of the house and had a half dozen college students living in their home. They were busy.

After college they moved to Cairo, a little town north of Lima, Ohio and lived with Harry's parents for a while, while he was employed by Westinghouse Corporation. On a visit to Virginia, they found out about a restaurant, in Powhatan County, that they could rent, so the next move was back to Virginia, where Hazel, Harry, and Hazel's brother, James and his wife, Charlene, went into partnership in the operation of The Sandwich Shop at Flat Rock, Virginia. After about a year, James went to work as a mechanic, and Harry went to work for the Continental Life Insurance Company. Both families had the births of their first children, with Douglas Bradley, and Michael Guss making their parents happy.

ALEXANDER R. GUSS #1241

Alexander R. Guss, the son of Casper Guss and Mary Magdalena Seltzer, was born 16 September 1814 in Hamburg, Berks County, Pennsylvania. He did 26 April 1889 in Elmore, Ohio and was buried at the Union (Guss) Cemetery. He married on 23 March 1848 Eliza Ann Sarnes, the daughter of William & Mary Sarnes, who was born on 17 August 1824 in Pickaway County, Ohio and died on 12 August 1906 in Elmore, Ohio and buried next to her husband.

He lived in Pennsylvania until 1831 when his father moved, with the entire family, to lower Sandusky County. For some years he lived and farmed on Wolf Creek some miles south of Fremont and moved to Elmore in 1860.

The Guss Cemetery Association was formed in 1871, on land purchased originally from Alexander Guss, at a meeting held in the office of John Jenney. Six trustees and a clerk were elected. Every person purchasing a lot would become a member of the association. The lots were laid out 20 feet square and were to bring \$10.00 each when sold. A portion of the ground was sold to the township trustees in 1872 "consisting of three tiers of lots the entire length of the cemetery, for which they paid \$280." These lots were to be known as "potter's field." An ordinance was passed in 1896 changing the name to Union Cemetery.

In the Fremont Journal, 3 May 1889, the following death notice was written: "Thursday morning about seven o'clock Alexander Gust an old resident of Elmore, was found dead in his barn yard. Mr. Gust was feeding his stock when he suffered a stroke of heart disease, and died instantly. Mr. Gust was well known and highly respected, and is a brother of George Gust of this city. The deceased was 78 years old and leaves a wife, two sons and two daughters.

Mr. Gust and daughter, of this city went to Elmore last night to attend the funeral."

The following is the obituary account published in the Fremont Daily Messenger, January 28, 1908:

"Frank Guss Dropped Dead in His Chair

Frank A. Guss, one of the best known and most popular of the citizens of Elmore, and of Ottawa county, died in Fremont Monday evening at the home of his cousin, Ralph L. Gust on Napoleon street. The death was a very sudden one and was a sad surprise to the relatives, although the deceased had not been in good health for some time. He had been suffering from a cancer of the tongue which caused him to have hemorrhages. He had been doctoring with Dr. Reiff of this city for some time and Monday came to Fremont to consult him. In the afternoon, Mrs. Gust and her sister, Miss Maud Tuttle, of Clyde, went down town, Frank Guss remaining at the house with Grant Smith and "Brownie" Ellison. Mr. Smith had been partially taking care of him and assisting him when the severe attacks of pain would seize him. About 5 o'clock Mr. Guss went out for a short walk returning in about ten minutes. He removed his overcoat and rubbers and sat down in an easy chair to rest. As he sat down he threw his head back and instantly became motionless.

Ellison and Mr. Smith hurried to his side and found him dead. The family was informed as soon as possible. His relatives were greatly shocked to hear the news. The dead man was an Odd Fellow and a Mason and a prominent member of the Elmore lodges. This morning three members of the mason order, Mr. Elisha Sarns, an uncle of his: Henry Puffenpaugh, and Mr. Burnham, of Elmore came to Fremont and carried the remains to Elmore, where the deceased will be buried with service of the Masonic order.

Frank Guss had many friends. His was a whole souled genial personality which readily attracted friends. Everybody in Ottawa county knew him and liked him. He gained considerable local fame as an auctioneer at horse and cattle sales and always kept the crowd in a good humor while making profitable and rapid sales. He was an expert horseman and made buying and selling horses a profession.

He has always made Elmore his home. He was born there about 1860. He attended the Elmore public schools and broadened his education with considerable travel. He often visited the larger eastern cities, his profession taking him around the country in various localities. He was a good Democrat and served several times as central committeeman. His mother and father are both dead and the later years of his life he spent in batchelor apartments which he rented in Elmore. His relatives in Fremont include Mr. and Mrs. Ralph Gust, Mr. and Mrs. George Gust and Frank Stahl."

ELIZABETH KATHERINE GUSS #12414

Elizabeth Katherine Guss married Frenk E. Stahl. The following is the obituary account which appeared in the Fremont Daily News, November 29, 1913:

> "OLDEST ODD FELLOW WAS CHRISTIAN STAHL WHO DIED FRIDAY AT THE AGE OF 86

Funeral of Prominent Pioneer Will Be Private Owing To Illness of His Aged Wife - Was the Youngest in Family and Last to Die

The funeral of the late Christian Stahl, whose death took place Friday afternoon at his home on Croghan Street, will be held Monday afternoon at 2 o'clock at the late residence. Owing to the serious illness of Mrs. Stahl who is in a serious condition, the funeral services will be private. The Odd Fellows will have charge of the funeral services at the grave in Oakwood cemetery. Those wishing to view the remains may do so between the hours of 2 and 4 o'clock Sunday afternoon.

Christian Stahl was the youngest of a family of four brothers and one sister, who with their parents in 1832, crossed the Atlantic in fiftyfour days in a sailing ship, and was the last member of his family to die. Mr. Stahl was born on March 7, 1827, at Guerstheim, in the province of Alsace, France, and upon arrival in America with his parents, lived for several years at Tonawanda, near Buffalo, and then came to Ruggles Beach, where he lived until 1842, at which time he came to Sandusky county, in which county he has since claimed his home.

In 1843 he learned the cooper's trade from his brothers. John C. and Philip Stahl, and became and was known as one of the best tight barrel coopers then working at the trade. After learning his trade he travelled extensively throughout the United States, working at his trade in making molasses barrels at New Orleans and along the Mississippi river in the winter time and fish barrels at Mackinac in the summer time.

In 1858 he was married to Miss Julia Tyler, and to them was (sic) born five children, four of whom survive their father and are living in the city of Fremont, namely; Cora A., Frank E., Nettie Margaret, and Harriet M., one son, Harry H. having died in 1888. He is also survived by his three grandchildren: Marguerite, Robert and Dorothea, children of his son, Frank E., of which grandchildren he was very fond.

After Mr. Stahl's marriage, he settled on his farm two miles southeast of Fremont, where he resided until 1882, when he removed to Fremont and at once, with his son, Frank E. Stahl, became actively engaged in the buying and shipping of hay, grain and farm produce, in which business he was very successful. He retired from business several years ago, and spent the balance of his life in the enjoyment of his family circle and many friends.

In early life Mr. Stahl became affiliated with Croghan Lodge, No. 77, 1. O. O. F., and after the death of C. R. McCulloch, was the oldest living member of the Odd Fellows fraternity in this city, both in age and in years of membership, residing in Sandusky county. In politics, Mr. Stahl was an ardent Republican and thoroughly believed in the principles of the Republican party and was steadfast and unswerving from his party's principles and platform.

Mr. Stahl's father, after fourteen years service in the French army, and after the fall of Napoleon at Waterloo and the accession of Louis Philip to the throne, emigrated to the United States with his family in order to prevent any of his four sons from serving in the army under a Bourbon king; and these marked characteristics of the father of fidelity to principles, was always strongly marked and noticeable in the subject of this sketch."

CHARLES GUSS #12421

Charles Guss, the son of John Guss and Angelina Rollins, was born 12 August 1844 in Ballville Township, Sandusky, Ohio and died on 7 March 1925 in Michigan. On 14 March 1872 in Whitley County, Indiana he married Hulda L. Munger who was born 1843 and died 10 March 1911. Both were buried in the Medina Cemetery

Charles Guss was a Union Civil War veteran, a private in Co. F., 8th Regiment of Ohio Volunteer Infantry. He volunteered at Fremont the 7th day of June 1861, for the term of three years and was honorably discharged at Camp near Harrisons Landing, Virginia on the 24th day of July 1862.

"That while in mid service in the line of his duty at Woodstock in the state of Virginia, on the 1st day of April 1862 he was attacked by brain fever produced by exposure while on duty and removed to Hospital at Strasburg, Virginia and remained there nearly four months. That during the attack of this fever, he became deaf and lost the entire use of his hearing, and still remains deaf and entirely unable to hear." Information is from his pension application #49796 of the Department of the Interior.

ELLIS L. GUSS #124212

The following obituary, from an unknown newspaper, gives the account of death of Ellis L. Guss:

"DEATH and BURIAL OF Ellis Guss.

Virac, P. I.

Mr. and Mrs. Chas. Guss,

Medina, Mich.,

Dear Friends:

It is my sad duty to inform you that Ellis has passed away. He died this morning at ten minutes of two. For several days he had been improving and we thought he was out of danger, but Tuesday he was suddenly taken worse and from then until last evening he grew steadily worse. He as conscious up to within a few hours of his death.

He told us several times that he did not expect to get well, but said he was prepared to die. He often talked of you all, and told me to tell you all good-bye and to meet him in heaven. He said he wished it had been possible for him to come home again, but as he could not he was willing to submit to the Lord's will.

Ellis had the best care during his illness. The doctor visited him several times a day, and did all that could be done. He had the best of nursing, both by the men at the hospital and by the men of his company. Everything was done for his comfort that possibly could be done. He was buried this afternoon, at five o'clock, with military honors. I will describe the funeral procession: First came the company musicians; then the firing squad, who fired the salute; then the pall bearers with the coffin draped in the stars and stripes; next the officers, and last came the company marching in columns of fours, all dressed in full uniform and wearing side arms. After reaching the grave, the 5th chapter of Romans was read by Theodore Harris, of Philadelphia, a member of the Methodist church. After lowering the coffin in the grave a salute of three volleys was fired and taps were blown by the musicians.

Several Spaniards attended the funeral, also a number of Chinese, and any number of natives, all of whom showed the greatest respect.

Ellis's death has been a sad blow to the company, as every man was his friend.

The officers respected him as a non-commissioned officer, who did his duty at all times as a true soldier. His comrades respected him as a true comrade as well as a true friend. As for Sam and I, words cannot express what we feel. Since we enlisted Ellis had been more a brother to us than a friend, and being separated from home, he seemed to take the place of a father to us. If we were in doubt about anything, we would go to him and he was always willing to help us in any way; not only with advice, but he helped us many times to keep up courage when we were about ready to give up.

I find I cannot put into words what I would like to express. I feel as if I had lost a brother, as, indeed, I have. I have often imagined what a happy day it would be when we all came home, but now I know the joy of that day will be mingled with sorrow, because the Lord has seen fit to take one of our number into His own care and keeping. Deep as I know your sorrow will be, you will have one comfort, and that is that he was prepared to go. Only a few days before he died he said to tell "father, mother, Lewis, Carl and Florence good-bye," and for you all to meet him in heaven. He seemed to find great comfort in the Lord's prayer, saying it was the prayer his mother had taught him.

He said if any one had any grudge against him he wanted them to forgive him; and he forgave all who had ever wronged him in any way. When I am called to go hence I hope I may have the assurance he had that all is well with my soul. I know if we live right we shall meet him above, and much as we miss him. I feel as though his was the better lot. He has risen above the troubles here below, and with him all is now peace. I cannot at present say more. His burial here was, of course, only temporary. His remains will be sent home.

I was with him almost all the time during his illness and have much to tell you if I am permitted to go home

You have lost a noble son; his many friends have lost a good friend; we, his comrades, a true comrade, and his company a brave soldier and loyal patriot.

It is also my will that if the said Ida Havens should die before the final settlement of my Estate or before she becomes 18 years of age, the above bequested \$700 be paid by my Executor in Equal shares like the rest of my Estate as hereinafter directed

Item 2. I will and bequeath that all the proceeds of my Estate, personal and real, after the payment of my lawful debts, and subject to the provisions of the foregoing item or paragraph be paid by my Executor to my five children, or in the event of their deaths to their lawful heirs by birth and blood, Henry Fry, Samantha Winters, Catharine Bowe, Thomas Fry and George S. Fry, in Equal portions-share and share alike; provided, however, that any portion or portions already advanced, or that may hereafter be advanced by me, Evidence of which will be found by my Executor in the form of receipts or notes, shall be so considered and recovered by him in final distribution

Item 3. I do hereby nominate and appoint Rev. J. I. Swander, now of Fremont, Ohio the Executor of this my last will and testament, hereby authorizing and empowering him to compromise, adjust, release, and discharge, in such manner as he may deem proper, the debts and claims due me. I do also authorize. empower and direct him to sell, at private, or public sale, at such time or times, and upon such terms as to him may seem most proper, any part, or all of my property, and to make deed or deeds to purchaser or purchasers of my real estate.

MARY GUSS #12433

"FRANCIS M. WINTER is a representative farmer of Jackson Township, Sandusky County, Ohio, and is the owner of the forty acre tract on which he lives, and another farm of 108 acres on which his son lives. He was born in this township, April 18, 1845, and is a son of Jacob and Elizabeth (Strayer) Winter, who were early settlers of this county.

Jacob Winter was born in York County, Pennsylvania, in 1806, and in

1830 moved with his wife to Wayne County, Ohio, where they lived three years. They then moved to Sandusky County and purchased a farm of 160 acres in Jackson Township, on which he lived until his death in 1886. His wife, who also was born in York County, Pennsylvania, died on the same farm on March 23, 1864. They were parents of the following children: Harriet, widow of John Bauman; Sarah Jane, wife of John M. Vorhies; Jeremiah; William, who was a member of the 21st New York Vol. Inf. during the Civil War, was killed in the second battle of Petersburg; Francis M., and Jerome, who is deceased.

Francis M. Winter has never lived outside of Sandusky County except the time he was in the service during the Civil War. He attended the district schools and followed farming from his early boyhood. On May 4, 1864, he enlisted at Fremont as a member of Company H, 169th Ohio Vol. Inf., and was stationed at Fort Ethan Allen. He was discharged at Cleveland, Ohio, September 4, 1864. In that year he purchased the farm of 108 acres on which his son now lives and made his home there for a period of thirty-four years. He made all the improvements on that place as well as some on the place where he now lives, which he purchased of H. Dundore in 1900. He has a gas well on each farm, operating them for private use, and has also the many conveniences and modern improvements so necessary for the successful prosecution of farm work. He is located one-half mile east of Burgoon.

The following is a letter of Samuel Gust to his brother, John Guss, living in Powhatan County, Virginia:

"Fremont, O. Feb 20th, 82

Dear Brother,

We received your letter and was very glad to hear that you were all well. I gave your letter to Tom Fry. If you know of a good piece of land that is cheap please let me know as it may tempt me to come out and look at it, that is if it can be had at a bargain, for \$1,500 or \$2,000 cash, as I am getting old working around by the day goes hard with me, and thought perhaps I could farm but you could advise me on that as you have farmed more than I have. All the relatives are pretty well except Aleck who has not been able to be out much this winter.

I would like to change climates on account of my dissease, the Chronic Diorhea, which I have had ever since I had the Typhoid fever. We have got annother new railroad in Fremont from Wheeling, Virginia to Toledo for which company I have been working all winter up to the present time.

I Hope you are all well. Write soon and let me know how you all are. Your Brother affectinately

"HIS LIFE ENDED

Last night at midnight Samuel Gust met his death off of the Lake Shore Railway bridge, on the ice forty feet below. The manner in which the sad event occurred cannot but impress upon all a doubt as to whether it was accidental or that he crossed the bridge with suicidal intent. For some twenty years the effects of a severe attack of typhoid fever hs been noticeable on the deceased, and each year he grew more morose and despondent, his fancy latterly being that he was wanted by the law and must go to the penitentiary. To escape his fancied punishment he wanted to leave Fremont. In company with Geo. Gust he visited Elmore yesterday, returning with his brother. About midnight he went out of the house and was seen to pass the window. He ran up the railroad track and across the bridge, being closely followed by his friends. Reaching within a few feet of the east end of the bridge some one shouted to him to turn to the right on account of a train and a moment afterward he reeled from the bridge, falling headlong, and was found in a few minutes dead, his neck being broken. It would seem that if he desired to commit suicide he would have done so as soon as the bridge was reached. No inquest will be held upon the body and the funeral will take place Thursday at 3 p. m." Fremont Daily News (Ohio) Jan 3, 1888 page 4 col 4

CASPER GUSS (Jr.) #1247

Casper Guss, the son of Casper Guss and Mary Magdalena Seltzer, was born 4 January 1831 in Berks County, Pennsylvania and died 21 September 1904 in Tiffin, Ohio, and was buried in Greenlawn Cemetery. On 8 April 1855 he married Malinda (Bookworth on marriage license) Bookwalter, who was born 8 May 1834 and died 22 February 1864. On 17 March 1870, inSeneca County, Ohio, he married Annie C (Nemire) Nienuir, who was born 9 November 1835 in Prussia, and died 30 November 1905 in Tiffin, Ohio, with burial in Greenlawn Cemetery, Tiffin, Ohio.

"Casper Guss was a boy of 3½ years when his father and family moved from Pennsylvania to Ohio. His educational opportunities were few, on account of the conditions of the time and place, although he took advantage of all that he could secure. When he was nineteen years old he went to Fremont, Ohio, where he remained at work in a blacksmith shop for two years, but, finding that this line of work was injuring his health, he returned to the farm. Here he remained until his father's death, and then managed the estate for his mother until 1871, when he purchased a farm of eighty acres in Pleasant township, which he operated for five years. Selling this farm, Mr. Guss bought another containing sixty five acres, in Eden township, and this he managed with success until he decided to somewhat limit his activity, and sold it, purchasing his home on Greenfield Street, Tiffin. Here he had enough land to enable him to take exercise in the raising of his choice fruit and vegetables, and to also enjoy the comforts and conveniences of city life. He was Democrat and during his residence in Sandusky County held a number of the local offices. He was a member of the first Reformed Church". I am So very glad that I can wish you all a happy, new year, I have thought many timees to write to you but for want of the proper Address it has been neglected but I got your address and I hope my letter will reach you all right and you and your family all in good health although I did not hear from you I did not know wether you was in the land of the liveing any more or not the rest of our Brother and Sisters here have died except us 3 yonges boys we are Still here. I hope they are in a better world where troubles and Sorrows never comes my folks are all well except myself I Sometimes think it almost a myricle that the good Lord has Spared me through what I have gone but I am Still here but my health as very poor my complant is catarrh in my head and Asthma. I can Scarcely go out of the house at times when the weather is cold or damp I hant been able to do any work for the last 3 years or more So we are liveing in Tiffin for over 2 years we are all enjoying ourselves very well with good luck the Lord has blessed me So far in worldly treasure, So I can get along without working any more. my oldest boy Rufus is working in the paper mill here in Tiffin and Frank is going to School. how are all your children? I Suppose they are all married. I hope you will answer my letter without delay and let us know how you all are doing So good bye I again wish you all a happy new year

I could not get all in this letter I wanted to write but the rest I will write next time"

Dear Brother and all. I received your kind letter of the 4th and was very glad to hear from you all and to hear that you are all So well and enjoying yourselves So well espesily you and Angeline in your declining and advanced years. my folks are all well but myself I am feeling very bad today I am Scarcely able to get out of the house I have a very bad cold the weather is changeible here yesterday it rained and today is is cold.

Such changes in the weather always is hard on my Catarrh Asthma I have my trust all in God. He does all things well doctors cant help much only give me ease for a time of course I use medicine all the time well as for my girls they are both married Evie is at Eagle Mich. Evie has 1 boy and 1 girl the boy is 10 years old and the girl b as near as I know and Lottie is in New York City. Lottie Married a very wealthy man in new york City his name is Reuben Hoyt. her education She says done it all. DIED AT TIFFIN

Casper Guss died at the home of his daughter, Mrs. Hill, 281 Water Street, Tiffin, early Monday morning, after a nine months illness, which was the result of a complication of diseases. The deceaed was aged 73 years, 8 months, and 17 days. He was born in Berks County, Pennsylvania, having removed to Tiffin about fifteen years ago.

Besides a wife, three children survive him: Rufus, Frank and Mrs. Eva Hill, all of Tiffin.

Funeral services Friday afternoon at 2 o'clock at Grace ReformedChurch, conducted by Rev J. H. Steel. Interment in Greenlawn Cemetery. The deceased had a number of relatives in Fremont. The Freemont News, Fremont, OH 23 Sept 1904

CHARLOTTE "LOTTIE" GUSS #12475

Charlotte "Lottie" Guss was born on 26 September 1867, and like her brothers and sisters, in a log cabin, the fifth child of Casper Guss and Malinda Buckwalter. By the time of Lotties' birth, her three older brothers had died as infants or small children. Only her older sister Eva lived into adulthood. Her mother and father were people who were described as being poor, and it was a struggle to survive. Charlotte, from all that was said later in her life, was a young girl who was exceptionally beautiful, excitable, intelligent, and a person with a strong desire to learn.

Shortly after her birth, her mother died, and in 1870 her father remarried. Probably this made an impression on the young girl. Both Casper and Annie, her stepmother, loved Lottie very much, and if Lottie lacked for anything, it was probably discipline. Her step-mother had known her father for 7 or 8 years before they were married, so Lottie probably knew her very well. Mrs. Guss helped Lottie as much as she could and would cut up her own clothes and make them into garments for her.

Lottie had some habits that were of real concern to her parents. She had a habit of going away from home frequently, without the consent of her father or step-mother. Sometimes she would be away for a whole day in Tiffin, and sometimes she would be absent for a week or ten days at a time. Every time she would be located with her uncle, Romanus, in Fostoria. Also, she was very untidy and concerned her parents by going to bed with her shoes and stockings on.

When, but 15 years of age, she was teaching school in the public schools of Seneca County, Ohio, near Elmore. When she was nineteen years of age, she left, without telling her parents, and went to Michigan and it was three or four weeks before they learned of her whereabouts. Her only reason for going, they found out, was that she objected to their concern about her going into Tiffin, with no reason for going. She staid at the home of her sister, Eva, and brother-in-law Daniel Hill. While in Michigan, she sought employment as a school teacher, and caused real concern to her sister, Eva, as she kept company with a man, Marshall Wood, who they considered a man of poor reputation. The romance, however, ended with a disagreement between Lottie and Eva, and Lottie went to Chicago. When Charlotte "Lottie" Guss went to Chicago, she stayed with Mrs. E. W. Barney (a relative?), St. Laureine (Lawrence ?) Avenue, Chicago, 111inois.

She soon was employed by a Mr. Bair, a wealthy man of the wholesale millinery firm of Bair and Stettheimer, as governess of his home. Soon she met, was courted, and married to a wealthy business man in Chicago by the name of Morris (Maurice?) C. Stettheimer, a partner of Mr. Bair, on January 16, 1891, at Wesley M. E. Church. He was very interested in having her with him in his social life, but was concerned about her lack of education to be in society. For this purpose he sent her to Europe, where she acquired polite knowledge and a conversational knowledge of French. Upon the return trip she met Reuben M. Hoyt, who was a passenger on the same boat with her and a relationship sprang up between them which led to a divorce between her and her Jewish husband.

Reuben M. Hoyt, the millionaire cosmetic manufacturer, married Charlotte Guss Stettheimer, November 30, 1891 in the Transfiguration Chapel, in New York. Charlotte's father-in-law was so delighted with her as his new daughter-in-law that he gave her \$25,000 as a wedding present. She used this money to buy herself a nice home at 326 W. 88th Street in New York City. Later she bought real estate on Lamartine Terrace in Yonkers, New York City. Lottie's marriage to Ruben Hoyt was one, in which money was, apparently, no problem. Apparently, she bought whatever she wanted, and she seemed to have securities to fall back on when her money supply would get low. She assumed the management of the Hoyt home, and was very excellent in her supervision of the affairs of the home. Lottie in private conversations told of her trips to Europe. She was introduced to the court circles of England, and on one trip had met Queen Alexandria.

From the time she went to Michigan until she married Reuben Hoyt, in New York, she had no communication with her parents. After her marriage to Reuben Hoyt, she came to Tiffin frequently, and was always friendly with her father, stepmother and two half-brothers. She purchased a home for her father on at 246 South Greenfield Street in Tiffin.

In 1901 she moved to Tiffin, Ohio. On May 15 the following article appeared in the Tiffin Advertiser newspaper:

"LIVED LIKE A QUEEN

FAIR YOUNG GRASS WIDOW IN TIFFIN IS SUED FOR DIVORCE

Millionaire Husband Says Wife Got Quarter of a Million of His Wealth, and He Wants it Back

Tiffin, O., May 15 -(Special)- A handsome young woman came to Tiffin, last winter, from New York. She engaged a splendid suite of rooms at the leading hotel, surrounded herself with a corps of liveried servants, drove stylish equipages every day, and lived the lavish life of a queen.

For months she has been the most conspicuous figure in the city, yet practically nothing was known of her. Her presence and style of living has created a mild sensation, and she has been talked about in every home in the city.

At last, however, the mystery which surrounded her identity has been cleared. She is Mrs. Charlotte Hoyt, of New York, the wife of Reuben M. Hoyt, who inherited a large interest in the \$12,000,000 estate of Jesse Hoyt, the cologne manufacturer.

Hoyt is suing for divorce, and has also started suits in New York to have the courts set aside transfers of property to her. Hoyt alleges that his wife received too much attention from Ralph S. Townsend, a rich and handsome young New Yorker.

Hoyt says he transferred to his wife a \$40,000 house, \$5,000 worth of furniture, \$88,000 in securities, his interest in a trust fund which

yields her \$5,000 a year, and his interest in an \$80,000 estate.

Hoyt says that after his wife got this property, in her own name she became addicted to intoxicating drinks. He says that he was forced to leave his own home, at times, because of his wife's condition. In addition to this he says she had a habit of having large bills charged to him, until he notified dealers not to extend credit to her and expect him to pay. Mrs. Hoyt denies all the allegations and says she hopes for a speedy trial of the property cases."

The following day a followup article appeared in the Tiffin Advertiser as follows:

*MAKES A COMPLETE DENIAL

"Does Mrs. Charlotte Hoyt When Interviewed by an Advertiser Reporter

Says that She is the One that Has Been Wronged and Makes Many Startling Countercharges, Which She Claims Will be Proven at the Trial.

Mrs. Charlotte Hoyt, mention of whose divorce proceedings in New York City was made in Wednesday's Advertiser, was seen by a representative of this paper in her home on Melmore street Wednesday evening and at her request.

She was greatly chagrined at the publicity which the article has given to her domestic affairs, but greeted the reporter kindly, only expressing regret that the matter had gotten into the paper.

She vehemently denied all of the allegations set forth in her husband's petition, and in order that the people of Tiffin might know her version of the affair, voluntarily gave the following statements for publication:

She said that she was married in 1887, when but 19 years of age, to a Jewish gentleman in Chicago, by the name of Stettheimer, a member of the well-known mercantile firm of that name. They lived together for a number of years until 1891, when she obtained a divorce from him in New York.

Soon afterward she married Hoyt, her present husband. She asserts that they lived together until Oct. 13, 1901, when, because of his vicious habits, she was forced to leave him. Among other things she claims that he is a degenerate of the very worst order, drank to excess, beat her cruelly, and consorted with other women, three of whom are named as corespondents in her cross petition for a divorce.

In reference to getting goods charged to her husband, she denies the statement vehemently, and refers to the well-known firms of Tiffany & Co., Stearns, Louise & Co., the Knickerbocker Trust Co., and her counsel, Josepht T. Brown, Jr., all of New York, to substantiate her statement.

Regarding the alleged attentions of one Ralph S. Townsend, hinted at in the former article, she said that he is an architect, and that he superintended the building of six houses on her property in Yonkers, a suburb of New York; that by reason of her husband's dissolute habits, she herself, was forced to attend to the business, and was thrown constantly in contact with the architect, and that their relations were simply those pertaining to the business.

It is said that Mr. Hoyt was in Tiffin for several days three weeks ago. In reply to the question of his mission here, Mrs. Hoyt said that he came here for the sole purpose of making up with her, but that his treatment toward her in the past had been such that she could not entertain his proposition to live together again.

In regard to the divorce proceedings, she said that the trial would come up some time in June and that it would develop some startling facts, which would not redound to the credit of the plaintiff in the case.

It was sought by Hoyt to have the hearing in chambers, which means before the judge in private, but Mrs. Hoyt has, through her attorney, secured a jury trial, and full publicity will be given to all proceedings. She expressed a determination to contest the suit at every step, and expected to go to New York today to assist in the preparation of the case.

It is also said that Mrs. Hoyt has a suit pending to enforce the payment of trust funds which have been made over to her and which her husband is attempting to have taken from her custody.

The Advertiser has now given both sides of the story of this most interesting case, and in the meantime the outcome of the trial will be watched with unusual interest."

One doctor from New York, a Dr. Polk, stated that he had seen Lottie on a number of occasions for small matters from 1892 to 1901, but her primary concern was that she seemed to be sterile, and she could not have children for her husband. This was so much upon her mind, the doctor stated that she resorted to anodynes so that she could sleep. At times, perhaps in her fancy, Lottie imagined herself as a Russian spy, and at other times she would think that she was a French spy.

While in New York City, she became a member of St. Ignatius Church. She became very devoted to the church and remembered it in her will. After moving to Tiffin, she attended the services of the church and was very devout in her devotions, however, she never moved her membership to the Tiffin Episcopal Church. Apparently, her ties to New York City were very strong.

Somewhere, in the course of her life, she started drinking alcoholic beverages. During the time of her education in Europe, this habit became an increasing problem. During the early part of her marriage to Reuben Hoyt, the drinking, was not a serious problem, but it became an increasing problem, and probably led to her estrangement with Reuben Hoyt and her moving to Tiffin, Ohio. Before leaving for Ohio, she sued for divorce, but it was agreed that she would go to Ohio, and that once there she would seek the divorce through the Ohio courts.

It was in Tiffin, Ohio, that she asked brother Rufus Guss for a recommendation for a lawyer, and he advised her to go to Judge Jacob Frederick Bunn. Judge Bunn had been the probate judge of Seneca County from 1878 until 1884. At the time he was a widower, his wife having died in 1880. On June 14, 1901 she soon went to Judge Bunn's office and presented her business card to him, telling him that she wanted a divorce

from Reuben Hoyt.

Lottie then bought the most prestigious home, called the "Maples", in Tiffin, and made extensive improvements on the home. The home had been the family estate of the John Loomis family, located on Melmore Street. She contracted Lewis Ullrich, a Tiffin florist, to place boxes of flowers on the portico and on the roof surmounting it. She liked palms, and had them included in her plans for the grounds.

She made a big impression very soon in Tiffin. She was the local girl who had returned to her home and was now a socialite, wealthy, and a curiosity. If she had wanted to be inconspicuous, her elegant green dress, her open green carriage, her coachman (who also wore green) were enough to draw the attention of everyone. She was seen almost every day coming into downtown Tiffin, and naturally she became known as the "lady in green". She shocked the "Proper Tiffinites", by walking into the saloon of Ben Wullenschneider at 19 Court Street and ordering her shot of whiskey, just like any man.

After leaving New York and coming back to Tiffin, her lifestyle had changed dramatically and she was known by many as a person who drank to excess much of the time. Employees of Mrs. Hoyt had seen her open eight bottles of champagne in a day and she had been known to drink a quart of brandy in a single day. Also, she was known to be a constant user of morphine.

Her relationship with Judge Bunn grew from him being her attorney to being her companion much of the time, and he became a nightly visitor to visit Lottie. He would go riding with her in her carriage, and would seem to be in complete charge of her life. At other times, Lottie would comment to Eva, while being helped by Bunn, "You support me sister, and relieve Judge Bunn." A few moments later she made the remark to Bunn, "Get away from me, your hair dye smells!" She talked to her sister and made accusations that Bunn "wanted to get all of her people away from her."

As her relationship became stronger with Bunn, her attitude became unfriendly to her family. It even caused a temporary separation of her father and step-mother who had now been married for 33 years. She said her stepmother was too old and "that she should go away and live some where else. Mrs. Guss left accordingly and returned to her home on Greenfield Street. She staid there a week and then went to live with her sister, Mrs. Baker".

The relationship of Lottie with sister, Eva, had been very cool during the time of her stay in Chicago and New York, but when Lottie moved back to Tiffin, the sisters were closer. Eva and her family moved in with Lottie at the Maples, and were of great assistance to her. However, the closeness ended, after having first established a line of credit for Eva at the Griggs Company in Tiffin, she called the store, and told them not to give any more credit to Eva, while she was in the midst of making purchases at the store. The call was made after the family learned that Judge Bunn knew of Eva being in the store, and going to Lotties before the telephone call. Lottie was a person who had a very strong attachment to animals. In one case she had a dog called "Bobbie", considered more than just one of the family. He not only was permitted in the dining room when Lottie ate, but had a place at the table, provided with a napkin, fed with a spoon, and was instructed to eat the things which did not suit his canine taste, simply because they were good for him.

Ross Heabler stated that he "acted as sexton at the funeral of Mrs. Hoyt's horse, which met its death in the crash which occurred on Washington Street in April of 1902, between Mrs. Hoyt's carriage and a rig belonging to the Warrensents. The obsequies over the dead horse was laid beneath an apple tree, at the Maples, on Melmore Street. A grave had been dug and the interring was done at night, by the light of a solitary candle. Mrs. Hoyt and Judge Bunn both stood beside the grave while Mrs. Hoyt wept and sobbed exclaiming 'look at my eyes and see how deep is my grief'. The horse was wrapped about with several thicknesses of sheets brought from the house. Before the animal was lowered into the grave Mrs. Hoyt cast herself upon the carcass and kissed the head of the dead animal repeatedly, though the nostrils were running with blood because of the length of time that the horse had been dead. When the carcass was in the grave Mrs. Hoyt bent over the opening, supported by Judge Bunn. She asked the privilege of casting in the first earth, inquiring of Heabler if that would be proper. The ceremonies completed she and Bunn returned to the house. Heabler did not observe that Mrs. Hoyt was intoxicated."

Paul Lehman, an employee of Lottie, added to the story of the burial of the horse, "adding to what has been told before about this peculiar ceremony, that Mrs. Hoyt had placed a wreath of flowers in the grave after the horse had been placed therein." He "would occasionally see Mrs. Hoyt kneeling beside the graves of her dead animals and she would continue in the attitude of devotion for ten and fifteen minutes at a time.

Dr. Washburn, said that when Mrs. Hoyt brought her horses to Tiffin she committed them to his keeping, stating to him that the horses were well bred ones and she wanted them to have special care. He was present at the stable when Mrs. Hoyt's horse was brought there after it had been injured in the runaway and collision on Washington Street. On that occasion Mrs. Hoyt wept, prayed and cursed. She damned the people of Tiftin and later she damned the person who had brought her to Tiffin.

Leo Warnement was driving the rig that collided with the carriage of Mrs. Hoyt, when her horse was killed. On three occasions he went to see Mrs. Hoyt about paying him for the damages to his rig. On the second visit her reply to him was "Who is to pay my damages?" Not hearing a reply that he would pay for her horse, she showed him the door.

Frank Lang said that he "saw Mrs. Hoyt discharge one of her male servants on the spot for throwing one of her cats out of the house. Mr. Lang said that he had been shown her animal cemetery by Mrs. Hoyt. There was a concrete walk about the spot where the horse was buried and the grave was grown with myrtle."

Before her death, she told brother-in-law Daniel Hill that she was going to get a divorce from Reuben Hoyt, just to teach him a lesson and that after the divorce she intended to marry him again. To her friend and employee, Miss Ella Manley, Lottie, a short time before her death stated that she wanted to be buried in the Hoyt lot in Greenwood Cemetery, Brooklyn, New York. Also, she was convinced that at her death, her will would be contested, and she said, "My dear girl, there will be a big fight which my people will institute. You will live to see it and I wish I could." Also, Miss Manley told of Lottie owning a red dress, which she called her fighting dress. Lottie said she called it her "fighting dress" because she had a fight everytime she wore it! Judge Bunn found it convenient, before Miss Manley, a woman of color, gave her testimony at the trial, to give her a nice chicken!

While in Tiffin, she was a very generous person, and the fact was well known in the city. One of her last conscious acts was her giving each of here nine servants a check for \$25.

Mrs. Charlotte Guss Hoyt died on January 17, 1903. Private funeral services were held in the home, after which the body was taken to New York and buried on the Hoyt lot in Greenwood Cemetery, Brooklyn.

After the death of Lottie, and due to the fact that one will (of at least five that Lottie had written) gave most of the assets to Judge Bunn, the matter wound up in court, as Lottie had predicted.

One will, written in November, 1900, contained provisions for her relatives and for her dogs and was extremely long and painfully complicated.

Another will written May 16, 1902 and made in Tiffin, Ohio provided for her dumb animals and gave the bulk of the estate to Rufus Guss, her half-brother.

Still another will written July 8, 1902 gave to the St. Ignatius Episcopal Church, of New York, all of her estate, real and personal, the condition that the church pay \$100 a month for the care of her dogs, in addition, there was a bequest of \$50,000 to Judge Bunn.

A will dated August 2, 1902 gave her father \$100 a month, and made provision for her cats and dogs and \$30,000 was set aside for these purposes. There was a clause in the will giving to Judge Bunn \$50,000. The balance of the estate was given to St. Ignatius Church.

On August 9, 1902, another will gave Casper Guss \$100 a month and an additional \$200 to be paid at his death and \$50 to be paid at his death and \$50 a month was given to the care of her animals. The fifth clause of the will gave Judge Bunn \$50,000 but across the face of the will was written the words: Void, All paid.

The following is the will of Charlotte M. Hoyt accepted by the court:

"I, Charlotte M. Hoyt do make and publish this my last will and testament, hereby revoking all former wills by me made.

First: It is my will and I direct that all my just debts and funeral expenses be fully paid; that I be given a simple but respectible burial in Greenwood Cemetery, New York, in case I should die without remarrying, and in case I should re-marry then with my said husband or such place as he may select; and that a sufficient fund be provided and set aside out of my estate for the perpetual maintenance of my grave in a suitable manner.

Second: I give and bequeath to my father Casper Guss one hundred dollars (\$100) per month for and during his natural life, payments to be made monthly beginning immediately after my death, and an additional two hundred dollars (\$200) to be paid after his death for funeral expenses.

Third: I give and bequeath to the Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals of the City of New York fifty dollars (\$50) per month for the care and maintenance of all cats and dogs of which I may die the owner, payments to begin at my death and to continue so long as they shall maintain any of said animals.

Fourth: It is my will and I hereby direct that at least thirty thousand dollars worth of good securities or productive real estate remain under the management of my executor until the provision of items two and three of this will are fully carried out.

Fifth: The residue of my estate, real and personal, I give, devise and bequeath to my friend J. F. Bunn of Tiffin, Ohio.

Sixth: I hereby nominate and appoint my friend Joseph T. Brown, Sr. of the Knickberbocker Trust Co., New York, as Executor of this my last will and testament.

Witness my hand this 9th day of September, 1902.

Charlotte M. Hoyt (seal)

The foregoing instrument was signed, declared and acknowledged by Charlotte M. Hoyt, as and for her last will and testament, in our presence on this 9th day of September, 1902.

Raymond L. Simpson (seal) Robt. E. Swigert."

Shortly after probation of the will, Judge Bunn offered Mrs. Hill a settlement, supposedly \$15,000, and also offered monetary provisions for Rufus and Frank Guss. At first, Mrs. Hill seemed to approve the offer, but changed her mind, discharged her lawyer, and hired another lawyer from Fremont.

In order to try to void the will, Reuben Hoyt, Eva, and her half brothers contested the will. However, before the case came to trial, Reuben Hoyt removed himself as a plaintiff in the case. Then the other plaintiffs tried to have Lottie found insane as this was their only hope of winning. Eleven people, many of whom were relatives, stated that Lottie was insane, but the defense had 51 witnesses who declared Mrs. Hoyt as being sane.

When the verdict was handed down in the case Judge Bunn was awarded everything that the approved will gave him. Judge Bunn certainly profited by his association with Mrs. Hoyt. However, both he and Dr. R. E. Swigart, her physician, were in disgrace. It was the firm opinion of the informed gossips that both of these men had deliberately abetted Charlotte in her weakness by keeping her supplied with her favorite brand of whiskey. But this was gossip and not acceptable evidence, and there was not a case for the Grand Jury. Both Dr. Swigart and Judge Bunn found it advisable to leave Tiffin."

FRANK MILAN GUSS #12477

Frank Milan Guss, the son of Casper Guss and Anna C. Nemire, was born 1 November 1878 Wood County, OH and died 14 December 1942. He was buried in Green Lawn Cemetery. On 31 July 1899 in Pittsburgh, PA he married Harriet E. ROMANUS GUST #1248

Romanus Gust, the son of Casper Guss and Mary Magdelena Seltzer was born cl834 and died 30 May 1899 in Toledo, OH. On 1 August 1858 in Fremont, OH he married Mary E. Lease, the daughter of Joseph Lease and Delilah Olmstead.

"Romanus Gust, of this city, died Monday evening about five o'clock at the Toledo State Hospital, of paralysis of the brain, he having been taken there from this city about three weeks ago. The health of Mr. Gust had been failing for some time and at last reached such a stage that he was taken to Toledo as a last resort in the hope that he would become better, but to no avail. The remains were brought to this city yesterday and the funeral will be held from his late residence on Wood street at four o'clock this afternoon. Rev M. D. Hollington officiating. Mr. Gust leaves a wife and a daughter, Mrs. John P. Ashley, to mourn his loss. He was formerly in the furniture business here but of late was not able to do anything. He was a member of Fostoria Lodge 288, F. & A. M. He was 65 years old."

GEORGE M. GUST #1249

George M. Gust, the son of Casper Guss and Mary Magdalena Seltzer was born 1 April 1838 in Sandusky County, OH and died 3 Aug 1896 in Fremont, OH. On 16 September 1859 he married Jane Ann Lease, the daughter of Otho Lease and Belinda Lease, who was born 23 December 1839 in Seneca County,OH and died 25 March 1905 in Fremont, Ohio. Both are buried in the Oakwood Cemetery.

The following notice of his death appeared in the Fremont newspaper: "George A. Gust, Fremont's pioneer monument and marble dealer, met with a sudden death Monday afternoon, the news of which was a great shock The hour of his death was about 5:40 o'clock. At the time mentioned he was in St. Ann's Cemetery having driven there a short time previous to do some work for Mrs. McCormick.

Reaching there in advance of the lady, he sat down in a shady spot and read a paper. In a few moments he looked up and saw Mrs. McCormick approaching across the cemetery and spoke to his son Ralph who was with him, "Our lady is coming." These were the last words he spoke. He folded his paper, started to get up on his feet when he staggered and fell and would have fallen to the ground but that he was caught by his son and tenderly laid on the ground. He neither spoke nor moved after he fell and expired immediately. Heart disease was the cause. Last winter an attack of the grip affected the heart and from time to time since he has complained of heart fluttering. The remains were removed from the cemetery to his late residence on Napoleon Street.

George A. Gust was one of Fremont's best known business men, having been prominently identified with the city's business interests for the past 30 years. He was a native of Sandusky County, having been born in this county the first day of April 1838. He was brought up on a farm and learned the marble trade starting when but 17 years of age. He was married to Miss Jennie Lease, who with three children survive. The children are George A., Minnie M., and Ralph L. Gust. The deceased was a member of the Odd Fellows and the National Union.

The funeral services will be held at the late residence Thursday afternoon at 2 o'clock. Interment at Oakwood."

He was the proprietor of the City Marble Works.

RALPH LEASE GUST #12493

The following is the obituary notice of Ralph Lease Gust:

"FUNERAL SUNDAY

Tumor on the Brain, Not Meningitis, Caused Ralph Gust's Sudden Death

The funeral of the late Ralph Lease Gust, whose sudden death was announced in Thursday's News, will be held at the late residence on Napoleon street, Sunday afternoon at 2 o'clock, under the auspices of the Woodmen of the World, to which the deceased belonged. Rev. Frank Roudenbush, of St. Paul's Episcopal church, will officiate. Following the services at the house, the remains will be interred in the family burial plot in Oakwood cemetery, beside the remains of the young man's parents and sister.

As was previously announced, Mr. Gust died at 3:10 o'clock Thursday afternoon, following an illness of but a few hours. For several weeks the deceased has not been well and was troubled considerably with sharp and severe pains in his head, combined with a dull headache. He consulted physicians and was given relief, but it was only temporary. Retiring as usual Wednesday evening, Mr. Gust was taken seriously ill and several physicians were summoned and consultations held. The patient was unconscious and remained in that condition for several hours, finally passing to the sleep that knows no awakening. A hemmorhage of the brain was the real cause of his death and was brought on by a tumorous growth, with which Mr. Gust had been afflicted for some time. It was first believed that his illness and death was due to spinal meningitis, but later developments showed the real cause to be tumor of the brain.

The deceased was one of the well known business men of the city and was associated with his brother, George Gust, in conducting the Gust Monumental works on Justice street, established by their father many years ago. In business Mr. Gust had been very successful, due to his honesty, integrity and hustling abilities. His circle of friends and acquaintances was a large one and not confined to Fremont or Sandusky county along, but extended throughout this section of Ohio. Among all his friends and acquaintances the news of his sudden death was received with a feeling of sadness and profound regret.

Ralph Lease Gust was born in Fremont in the house where he died, the son of George and Jane Gust, both deceased, June 15, 1876. He was the youngest of three children and one sister preceded him to the grave. Ralph attended the local schools and then entered his father's shop and learned the business of monument making, stone and marble cutting. After working at the trade for several years, he took up the office work, the business having grown in the meantime, and has since been manager of the concern's business.

Mr. Gust was married September 19, 1901, to Miss Frank Tuttle, one of Clyde's popular young ladies, who with two children Maude May and Ralph Freeman, are left to mourn the death of a loving husband and father, and the sympathy of all goes out to them in their sad hour. One brother, George, also survives."

Frances Tuttle Guss, the widow of Ralph Guss, continued to opearte the Monumental Works until 1918, when she began to teach the mentally retarded children in the Fremont Public Schools. After five years, she became the principal of the Columbus State School for the Feeble Minded. Her dedication to her work resulted in her writing a book, TEACHING MENTALLY RETARDED CHILDREN IN THE COLUMBUS STATE SCHOOL FOR THE FEEBLE-MINDED. Her obituary, written in FREMONT NEWS follows:

"Mrs. Frances Tuttle Guss of 710 Birchard avenue, first executive secretary of the Sandusky chapter of the American Cancer Society and former principal of the State School in Columbus, died Friday at 4:20 p. m. in Memorial hospital. She had been admitted December 29 after falling at her home.

Surviving are a daughter, Miss Maude Gust, at home, and one sister, Mrs. Ridgeway Bartlett, Hayes avenue. A son, Ralph, preceded her in death.

Mrs. Gust was born July 3, 1877 in Clyde, a daughter of Freeman and Mary Harnden Tuttle. She was married to Ralph Lease Gust in 1900 in Clyde. Mr. Gust died in 1908. Mrs. Gust was a 50 - year member of St. Paul's Episcopal church and a member of the Women's Guild of the church. She was also a member of Women's Auxiliary of Memorial hospital. She was in charge of mental testing at the state school, where she had been employed for 28 years and served as secretary of the local chapter of the Cancer society for eight years.

Friends may call at the Keller and Son funeral home beginning Saturday at 7 p. m. Services will be held Monday at 1:30 p.m. in St. Paul's Episcopal church with the Rev. Donald I. Judson officiating. Burial will be in Oakwood cemetery.

The family suggests memorials be contributions to the Church Guild."

MYRTLE MAUDE GUST #124931

Myrtle Maude Gust was graduated from Fremont High School and also from Oberlin University. She also attended summer school at the University of California, Berkeley, and Bowling Green State University for additional courses.

She taught third grade students at Stamm School, Sandusky County, and also was the principal of the New Croghan School in Fremont, for 36 years until her retirement.

After her retirement from teaching she was very active in the Episcopal Church of Fremont and was active with the Red Cross bloodmobile.

RALPH FREEMAN GUST #124932

The following obituary notice appeared in the Fremont newspaper: "RALPH F. GUST, Former County Treasurer, Dead

Five Year Illness Ends Long Career In Public Service

Ralph Freeman Gust, 53, assistant chief accountant for the Ohio Public Utilities Commission and a former Sandusky county treasurer, died in his sleep, Thursday night in his Birchard avenue home.

Death of the widely known Fremont man was discovered by Mrs. Gust shortly after 7:30 a.m. Friday. Mr. Gust had recovered from a number of previous heart seizures during a five-year cardiac ailment.

Prominent in civic, political, lodge and church interests, Mr. Gust had resigned his position as Sandusky county treasurer in 1946 to accept the post of assistant chief accountant for the Public Utilities Commission with headquarters at Columbus. He had served in the county office from 1940.

During World War II, with William M. Haynes, Fremont banker, he conducted War Bond drives in successful campaigns. He was a one time member of the Republican Executive committee and a Past Master of the Fremont Masonic Lodge. A member of St. Paul's Episcopal church, Mr. Gust served as treasurer of the congregation.

His fraternal affiliations included membership in the Masonic and Elks lodges and the American Legion Post. He served with the U. S. Army from 1942 to 1943.

Born in Fremont August 24, 1905, he was a son of Mrs. Frances Tuttle Gust, of Ewing street, and the late Ralph L. Gust. He was graduated from Fremont high school and attended Ohio State university and Tiffin Business university, having been a member of the faculty and a basketball coach at the latter school. He was affiliated for a time with the City Loan Company here.

His marriage to the former Myrtle Shawl took place 23 years ago. Surviving with his widow and mother are a sister, Miss Maude Gust, principal of Croghan school, and an aunt, Mrs. Ridgeway Bartlett, all of Fremont.

Friends may call at the Keller and Son mortuary after noon saturday. Funeral services are arranged tentatively for 3 P. M. Monday in St. Paul's Episcopal church. Interment will be in Oakwood cemetery.

In lieu of flowers his family has suggested memorial contributions to the Heart Fund or St. Paul's Episcopal church.

The Gust residence is at 710 Buckland Avenue."

LEWIS GUSS #125

Lewis Guss was born about 1797, probably in Berks County, Pennsylvania. While living in Pennsylvania he moved frequently. In 1820 he and his family were living in Northumberland County, in 1830 they had moved to Union County (now Snyder County); and in 1835 he was in Middleburg. In all of these places he was listed as Lewis Gust. In 1835 his occupation was a tanner, but when he moved to Indiana his trade was as a tailor.

Lewis married twice while in Pennsylvania. The name of the first wife is unknown, but his second wife was Sarah Frain, the daughter of Peter Frain and Rebecca Bilger, who was born 20 March 1807 and died 6 February 1893 in Winamac, Indiana. Lewis was her second husband. While they were married they were the parents of 18 children, of whom 8 were still living in 1899.

The following information was gleaned from information in Pulaski County, Indiana and concerns descendents of Lewis Guss, but the information is not sufficient to identify the individuals to the proper descendent:

PETER GUSS 1253

Peter Guss was born 3 April 1836 in Swinefordtown, Pennsylvania, the son of Lewis Guss. Peter married Sarah Louisa Foss on 29 January 1860, Jennie Murray as his second wife, and Sarah Rosetta Rearick on 9 Oct 1899 as his third wife. The children of his first wife were Joanna, Edward and Minerva and seven other children who died before reaching adulthood, with all being buried in Winimac. In his second marriage to Jennie Murray, they had two children Belle Marie and Henry Lewis. Both of the first marriages ended in divorce, and in the second marriage Jennie Murray was awarded custody of Belle Marie and Peter the custody of Henry Lewis.

Peter enlisted in the Union Army on 15 October 1864 at Michigan City, Indiana, and served until he was discharged on 27 June 1865. During his service he was a private unassigned in the 23rd Indian Infantry.

SIMEON GUSS #16

"He was born February 15, 1773, and was five years old when the patriot army lay near by, at Valley Forge. His trade was that of a shoemaker and he resided near Kimberton (in East Pikeland Twp.). In 1803 he moved near Landisburg, Perry County, near where Holman, the husband of his sister, and Zachariah Rice, Jr., the husband of his wife's siser, had moved previously. In 1815, Simon Guss and his son Abraham came over the Tuscarora Mountain to Milord township, in Juniata County, after the customs of those days, when tailors, shoemakers and such tradesmen did their work from house to house. Being pleased with the country and the business outlook in that region, the family moved over the next year.

Simon Guss married Barbara, daughter of Henry Knerr, who came to America a poor boy, in 1752, served his time to pay his passage with Conrad Selner, and as the result of a prosperous life, he died about 1805, leaving an estate worth near ten thousand dollars. In returning from a trip to Chester County, Barbara brought with her one time, tied on behind the saddle on which she rode, two small sweet cherry trees, one black and the other red, which were planted at her residence, where Ephraim Guss now lives, and were the first fruit of the kind planted in the region." CASPER SHUNK

Casper Shunk (also spelled Schunck, Schunk, Shunck) was a tax payer in Vincent Township, in 1734. He was probably the father of Simon Shunk.

SIMON SHUNK

Simon Shunk arrived in America on 24 September 1737 on the ship "Virtuous Grace" from Rotterdam. He was living in Vincent Township, Chester County, Pennyslvania by 1753 when he was listed as one of the taxables. In 1774, tax records showed him as owning 130 acres of land plus buildings, with 3 horses, 4 cattle and 7 sheep, for which he paid taxes of 1-0-3. By 1774 Simeon (probably Simon) Shunk and Conrad Shunk were listed as land-owners. They were the children of Simon Shunk as was Mary Shunk who had married Charles Guss, the immigrant. Peter Shunk and Isaac Shunk were appointed as two of the administrators of Simon Shunk, when his estate was ordered to be probated on 23 December 1785, in Chester County, Pennsylvania.

The early records of the Reformed Congregation of Vincent Township, show that the first church of that name was an old log building was built and consecrated in May 1758. Simon Shunk was a member of the vestry of that church. From its beginning in 1758 until 1833 735 persons were baptized. On November 1st, 1812 the congregation of the church met in their school-house, and elected a new building committee for the proposed new church edifice. In the graveyard, located next to the church grounds, are buried many of the early settlers in the vicinity. One of them, Peter Shunk (uncle of Governor Francis Rawn Shunk) has his birth year of 1756 and his death year of 1814 on his tombstone.

ANNA MARIA SCHUNCK

Anna Maria "Mary" Schunck was born 4 May 1741, and christened in the Reformed Church, Spring City, Pennsylvania on 4 June 1741. The witness to her christening was her mother Anna Maria Schaumerin (Shimer, Shymer).

She was married, on 12 July 1761 in Chester County, Pennsylvania, to Charles Guss, the immigrant. Mary died on 30 April 1821 and is buried in the cemetery of Rhodes Church near Spring City, Chester County, Pennsylvania.

JOHN CONRAD SHIMER

John Conrad Shimer (also spelled Shymer, Schamerin) came to America in 1732, with his wife, Anna Margaret, and daughter, Maria. They came on the ship "Johnson of London" which sailed from Rotterdam, September 19, 1732.

Conrad Shimer, as he was known, settled in Vincent Township, Chester County, Pennsylvania, where he acquired considerable property and was a prominent citizen. In the 1764 taxes of Vincent Township, he was listed as having 520 acres of land with buildings. Also he was the owner of a grist mill, 4 horses 6 cattle and three sheep. He also had one servant.

Upon his death the following will (a translation, as the original was written in German) was ordered to be recorded in Chester County, Pennsylvania:

"In the name of God, Amen. I, Conrade Shymer of Vincent Township, Chester County and State of Pennsylvania being sick in body but of perfect mind and memory thanks be to God for the same do make and ordain this my last will and testament in the manner following viz;

First: I give and bequeath to Anna Margaret Shymer my beloved wife, this my place or plantation whereon I now live to have and to hold the same with all the movables in her possession during her life. And to keep with her Charles Guss, Junior, for him to farm this place during her life and he to receive for his trouble the one third part of the income of the place and after her death he the said Charles Guss, Junior, shall be the only one heir of this place and moveables.

Secondly: I give and bequeath to my grandchildren Isaac and Peter Shunk my place in Pikeland Township to be equally divided between them and each of them to give of their one half of that place to my grand child Conrade Shunk one hundred pounds, lawfull money of Pennsylvania in the following manner, viz; namely twenty-five pounds per year. And the payments to begin at the time they get possession.

Thirdly: I give and bequeath and ordain to be given out of my estate to the Protestant Lutheran Church in Pikeland Township this side of French Creek, two hundred pounds, lawfull money of Pennsylvania.

Fourthly: Isaac Shunk and Anna Margret Shymer whom I hereby constitute make and ordain my executors shall sell and cause to be sold after my death my place in Vincent Township whereon George Snyder now lives as also my right over place in Philadelphia County.

Fifthly: The above name executors shall lawfully gather and recover all moneys to me due by either bonds, notes or book accounts and distribute or divide it all equally among my six grand children in equal shares, but yet so that the above said Isaac, Peter and Conrade Shunk draw the above mentioned shares first before such common and general distribution take place.

In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this twentieth day day of July, one thousand seven hundred and eighty, 1780.

Signed, sealed and published and declared by the said Conrad Shymer as his last will and testament in presence of us. John Hause Conrade Shymer (Seal) John Myers

A True translated Copy of the Original JM. John Myers (seal)

Provd. August 31, 1780"

While the will directs that the farm on which he lived was to become the property of Charles Guss, there is no court record to verify this. However, when Conrad Shimer died, Charles was not of age, and the following document was recorded in Chester County Court:

"To the Honourable Justices of an Orphans court to be held at the Red Lion the 16th of October anno Domini 1780.-

The Petition of Charles Guss Junr of the Township of Vincent in the County of Chester and State of Pennsylvania Most Humbly Shews

That your Petitioner is Grand Son to Conrad Shimer late of the Township of Vincent aforesaid, Deceased, who in his Last Vill and Testament left and Bequeathed unto your Petitioner Sundry Lands and Tenements, Together also with Several Valuable Stock and Farming Utensils, and as he is yet under age and Incapable of acting for himself he humbly Requests that your Honours would be pleased to appoint John Moyer and Henry Akor of the Township aforesaid as a Guardian to Act for him until of Lawful age as he appehends there is an Immediate necessity Respecting the Land &. And he is in Duty Whale pray.

When the inventory of his personal estate was presented to court it included many items. Two thousand three hundred sixty one pounds, 18 shillings and 6½ pence were owed to him by bonds, notes and book accounts. It was noted, however, that of this amount, 2013..7..6 which was lent in Continental money-in his life time.

He had a riding horse with saddle and bridle; two red cows, two black & white cows, and two young red cows, a red heifer and two spring calves. Also, he had a young black horse, an old gray horse, a black mare, and 13 sheep. He had a walnut chest (value about \$2!), a walnut table (value a little over two bucks!). He had a sermon book, and a large Bible; two spinning wheels so that his wife could have something to do! He had a cross cut saw, which kept the house warm, and him also! He also had cooper tools so that he could make his barrels. His many personal items were appraised at 2796 pounds, so he was financially well off.

HANS JACOB SELTZER

Hans Jacob Seltzer was born in 1732 in the Upper Rhine Province, near Coblentz, in the vicinity of the famous Seltzer Springs in Germany. At the age of 20 Hans Jacob Seltzer sailed for America on the ship "Edinburgh" from Amsterdam, Netherlands and later from Cowes, England arriving in Philadelphia 19 September 1752. The same day he took the Oath of Allegiance at the State House in Philadelphia, signing his name "Hans Jacob Seltzer". He settled in Heidelberg Twp. where afterwards Womelsdorf, formerly Middletown, was laid out. The Seltzers were among the first settlers of Womelsdorf and were enterprising folk of the Tulpehocken region. They supplied the other settlers with flour made at Seltzer's Mill, which was located on Tulpehocken Creek at the lower end of Womelsdorf. This mill was an old landmark. He married Catherine Hiester, of Bern Township, about 1753. She was born 20 February 1735 and died 5 June 1817 in Berks County, Pensylvania.

Hans' name appeared on the tax list in 1759, and from 1767 to 1785. He was taxed for 25 acres of land, one horse and one cow in 1767. In 1768 he was taxed for a tavern, one horse and one cow. In 1779 he was taxed as an innkeeper with 65 acres of land, two horses and two cows. In 1780 and 1781 he still had the inn, and the horses and the cows, but his land increased to 67 acres. In 1784 and 1785, no longer was he taxed for the inn, but he had 60 acres of land and two horses and two cows.

In 1762 he built the first house in the newly laid out town of John Womelsdorf, which later was operated as the inn for which he was taxed. The inn, or tavern, was known as the Seltzer House, as it is still known to this day. The original building was replaced by a two story building of large limestone blocks. George Washington and party slept here on the 13th of November, 1793. The old road ran diagonally across what is now the Main or High Street of Womelsdorf.

His Revolutionary War service is as follows: He was delegated to attend the public meeting of the Militia of Berks and other counties held at Lancaster, July 4, 1776, consisting of officers and privates of fifty-three battalions of the Associators of Pennsylvania, to choose two Brigadier Generals to command the Pennsylvania forces. He was then a private in the 5th battalion of Col. John Patton and Lt. Col. John Rice. In September, 1777, he served as a Committeeman on the Council of Safety, to collect arms and clothing. He also served in Capt. Benjamin Weiser's Company of Heidelberg in a German regiment commanded by Col. Nicholas Hausegger, 8th class. He is mentioned as having served as a Court Martial man in the 6th battalion, western section of Berks Co., commanded by Co. Henry Spyker in the company of capt. Conrad Weiser (4th Co., Heidelberg), June 14, 1777.

He died in 1788 in Berks County, Pennsylvania. Both are buried in Zion's Cemetery, Womelsdorf, Berks County, Pennsylvania.

Hans & Maria Seltzer were the parents of: Michael, Jacob, Elizabeth, Eva Catharine, Mary, and Catharine Seltzer. Michael Seltzer was born in 1753 and baptized 13 August 1753 and confirmed in 1772. He married Magdalena Lantzert, the daughter of George Lantzart, and died cl807. She married Frederick Waltz, after the death of Michael. Michael Seltzer was a Revolutionary soldier, serving under Capt. John Spohn and Co. McGaw. On 26 Aug 1776, Michael Seltzer enlisted as a sergeant in Michael Wolf's Company. He was taken prison 16 Nov 1776 at the Battle of Long Island and died in prison. One of his comrades brought back to his family the news of his imprisonment and death.

"My grandmother told me many times about her grandfather who went to war and was captured by the British and died in captivity either from exposure or starvation. The story of his imprisonment was brought back to the family by one of the prisoners from their section of the country who had escaped. He left a widow with three young sons of whom her grandfather, Abraham was one. John and Jacob being the names of the other two.

In later years this information and knowing that at the time they lived in Berks County, near Reading, I began the search through the War records in the Historical Society of Pennsylvania and the Pennsylvania Archives of the Revolutionary War in the Philadelphia Public Library.

The following are scattered accounts all relating to him and the conditions under which he lived and suffered during his short time in the war.

The Middle Dutch Church in New York City had 3000 prisoners, taken at Long Island and Fort Washington. Sick and wounded and well were huddled together by hundreds and thousands and large numbers of whom died by disease and many were poisoned by their attendants for their watches and silver buckles.

For many weeks the dead cart visited the prison every morning and took away from eight to twelve corpses which were dumped into ditches on the outskirts of the city.

Of the numerous prison pens in the New York City during the revolution (among which were the old sugar houses) only two yet stand like charred and battered monuments of cruelty and tyranny. The North Dutch Church on William Street and the Middle Dutch Church (The present Post Office). In the former edifice 800 prisoners were incarcerated without fuel or bedding during two of the coldest winters New York has ever known. Their provisions were scanty and of the poorest quality and as a natural result many died from cold and starvation.

There was not a fire except in the lamps and not a pane of glass in the windows and nothing to keep out the cold except the iron grates.

Adolph Mayer, a prisoner, said their allowance was one loaf of bread, one quart of peas, half a pint of rice and one and a half pounds of pork for six days.

Many prisoners died from want. No care was taken of the sick and if they died they were thrown at the door of the prison and lay there till the next day when they were carted out to the entrenchments beyond the Jews burial ground, where they were thrown into a hole promiscuously."

HISTORICAL NOTES

The following 4th Co. of Berks County Militia were on duty during August to September 1776 at South Amboy, New Jersey at the mouth of the Raritan River opposite the southern extremity of Staten Island. They were at that place during the Battle of Long Island.

In the battalion of John Patton: a Michael Seltzer was a sargent in Michael Wolf's Co. They were Bathel and Tulpehocken Townships. (Page 106, "Berks County in the Revolution")

A Peter Daubert of Reading enlisted in 1776 in Capt. Biler's 3rd Regiment captured by the British at Ft. Washington and taken to New York and confined in a French Church.

Record of Michael Seltzer (Found in the PA Archivess of the Revolutionary War, 5th series Vol 5 and Berks County in the Revolutionary War, at the Pennsylvania Historical Society, 13th and Locust Street, Philadelphia.

Three companies from Berks County were in service at New York and in that vicinity in 1776. Two of them formed part of the 5th Battalion of Pennsylvania troops which were under the command of Col. Robert Magaw of Carlisle. The Captains were John Spohn and Peter Decker both residents of Reading. The men of Spohns Company were from Reading, but those of Deckers Co. were mostly from the districts surrounding Reading. In the roll of Spohns Company were a private Michael Selser (Seltzer), a Jacob Miller, and a Peter Miller. The command of the company was from Jan 5th 1776 to Nov 1776.

On the 11th of June 1776 congress ordered this battalion with the 5th, Col. Magaw to New York. On the 15th they marched, reaching New York from the 20th to the 25th and on the 29th they were put under the command of Brig. Gen. Mifflin.

Both Battalions were marched towards Kingsbridge, encamped upon the ground on which Fort Washington was erected, and immediately employed in the construction of that fortress under the command of Col. Rufus Putnam. They remained there all summer.

Sickness prevailed towards fall to so great an extent that little more than half of the men were fit for duty. They remained undisturbed until Battle of Long Island on the 27th of August when they were marched down to New York reaching the City in the afternoon after the battle was over. Early on the 28th they were transported to Long Island, marched down to the entrenchments at Brooklyn and posted at the left, extending to the Wallabout. Here annoyed by continual rain without tents they lay upon their arms keeping up incessant skirmishing with the British. After dark on the 29th of August orders were received to hold the battalion in readiness for an attack upon the enemy, but this only an artifice, these battalions with the Maryland battalions being detached to cover the retreat of the main army from the Island. On the 31st of August they marched beyond Kingsbridge toward the Sound, and crossed the Bronx, encamped about 18 or 20 miles from the City. After this post was sufficiently strenghtened, the two battalions reoccupied their old ground at Ft. Washington.

The main army remained on the heights of Harlem a period of five weeks. Magaws battalion constituted a part of it and did duty accordingly.

For further information on the capture of the fort, etc. see Graydons Memoirs, for an account of the captivity of the officers, 230 of them being posted. Lieutenant Forest escaped.

Also Historical Magazine, New York City 1857, page 73

Capt. John Spohns Co enlisted at Reading, Pennsylvania on the 28th day of May, 1776. His company numbered 78 men including officers. The entire battalion including Spohns company were captured at Ft. Washington

Extracts from Graydon's Memoirs: "While from the advantage of bearing commission, we had the benefit of free air and the use of our limbs. Our poor devoted soldiers were enclosed within walls, scantilly supplied with provisions of bad quality, wretchedly clothed and destitute of sufficient fuel, if any. Disease was the inevitable consequence of such a situation, and their prison of course soon became hospitals. A fatal malady was generated and the mortality was deplorable. Once only I ventured to penetrate within these abodes of human misery and despair, but to what purpose repeat my visit, when I had neither relief to administer nor comfort to bestow.

On the 16th of November 1776 Ft. Washington on the East Bank of the Hudson near New York City after a desperate resistance on the part of the Americans was surrendered by Col. Magaw of the Pennsylvania Line. Look up Lessings Field Book of the Revolution."

Michael Seltzer and Magdalena Lantzart were the parents of: George Michael Seltzer born in 1771, Abraham Seltzer born in 1773 and Johannes Seltzer born in 1777.

JOHANNES SELTZER

Johannes Seltzer was born 28 January 1777 in Windsor Township Berks County, Pennsylvania. Johannes married Maria Elizabeth Faust who was born 13 August 1785. Johannes died 3 Aug 1854 and Maria Elizabeth Seltzer died 15 April 1859. They are both buried at Drehersville, Pennsylvania.

They were the parents of the following children: Elizabeth b 2 December 1814, Benjamin born 20 September 1825, William, Jacob, John, Francis b 1827, Katie, Susan, Mary Magdalena, Lydia, Phoebe, Angelina, and two children, names unknown.

MARY MAGDALENA SELTZER

Mary Magdalena Seltzer was born c1793 in Windsor Township, Berks County, Pennsylvania. She married Casper Guss, the son of Charles Guss and Martha Limburg, about 1812. In 1834 they made the long move from Berks County, Pensylvania to Sandusky County, Ohio. Casper Guss died July 2, 1860 in Sandusky County, Ohio. Mary died 17 December 1871 in Jackson, Ohio. Both are buried in the Hill Cemetery, about 3 miles south of Fremont, Ohio.

HIESTER FAMILY

The Hiester families of Pennsylvania were descended from John and Catharine Hiester of Elsoff, in the domains of the County of Witzenstein, province of Westphalia, now in Germany. John Hiester came to America in 1732 and Joseph and Daniel followed in 1737. They came to Philadelphia and settled there. That area is now in Montgomery County, Pennsylvania.

Daniel Hiester settled in what is now Berks County, but in 1796 he moved to Maryland, and then to Washington, where he died in 1801/2. John moved to Chester County as a young man, and he and his family lived in Pottstown until his death.

While Daniel and John moved from Berks County, Joseph stayed in Berks County, and many of his descendents. From the list of descendents of John and Catharine Hiester lists a lot of men, at least in the early days, records were not very complete for the women born into the Hiester family. One of the women was Maria Catharine Hiester who was born 20 Feb 1735, who married Hans Jacob Seltzer. Possibly, she was the granddaughter of Joseph, as he remained in Berks County.

The Hiester family was prominent in the affairs of the Montgomery, Berks, and Chester Counties area. Many of their sons enlisted in the army during the Revolution. After the Revolution, they became involved in politics and served their country in the governing bodies of Pennsylvania and the United States. Joseph Hiester, the son of John, became Governor of the State of Pennsylvania. The family was industrious and labored hard and invested in the land of the area and besides being involved in the government they became financially well off.

PETER FAUST

Peter Faust, the immigrant, came to America in 1733 from Rotterdam on the ship Elizabeth and landed in Philadelphia, PA 27 August 1733, and on the same day took the oath of allegiance to the King of England, b 1689 Germany d Nov 1745 Exeter Township, Berks Co., PA m Anna Elizabeth ______ b c1693 in Germany. When they arrived in America they listed the following seven children:

On the same day of the arrival of Peter Faust, he took the Oath of Allegiance to the King of England, a fact recorded in the Pennsylvania Archives.

Peter, after three years, bought 100 acres of land in Oley Township, Fhiladelphia County, Pennsylvania. The warrant (number 42) is dated October 26, 1736. He obtained another 100 acres on November 9, 1736. In 1741 Oley Township was split into two townships and Peter's property was then in Exeter Township. Later, after Peter's death Exeter Township became part of Berks County.

Peter died in November 1745. His will, filed in Philadelphia on January 22, 1745 was written in German, and translated as follows:

"This 22nd day of January, anno 1745, I, Peter Faust, made my last will and testament. If the loving God should call me out of this world.

First, Peter shall have the plantation and all what is on it, horses, cows, sheeps, swines, and all the household goods, except the mother's bed. Peter shall also give to the mother every year. First, fifteen bushels of wheat and 14 bushels of rye; fifteen pounds flax; and a cow, which she likes best of all the rest, and he must fodder the cow like his own creatures; also, a fat swine; the garden near the old house to her use; and every year, the wool of one sheep; one gallon of rum; and half a gallon of molasses; the third part of the apples; and every year five shillings in money; and shall have the use of the kitchen ware during her lifetime as much as Peter, and all that she does not want of these things above mentioned shall be Peter's.

Johannes shall have fifteen pounds in money. Five pounds shall be paid to him by Peter, anno 1750, and five pounds, anno 1751, and five pounds, anno 1752, and he shall give him a cow, anno 1749, and a black mare colt now immediately.

Michael shall have the thirty pounds which he had of his father for his portion, but the money he borrowed from Jhannes Schneider's widow he shall pay if he comes again. Witnesses: Christoph Beyer Hans Martin Gerligh Peter Faust (seal)) Martin Allstatt Martin Wealler Translated by Conrad Weiser

Heidelberg Township, Dec. 4, 1745. Then personally appeared Christopher Boyer, Hanns Martin Gerigh, and Martin Allstatt, three of the witnesses to the foregoing codicil and on their oath did declare, they saw and heard Peter Faust, the testater, therein named, sign, seal, publish, and declare, the same codicil, for and as his last will and testament, and that at the doing thereof, he was of sound mind, memory, and understanding, to the best of their knowledge. CORAM"

PHILIP FAUST

Philip Faust, the son of Peter and Anna Elizabeth Faust, was born in February 1713 in Germany. After arriving in America he married Magdalena Albrecht, the daughter of Johannes and Anna Barbara Albrecht, in Pennsylvania. "Phillip took the Oath of Allegiance to the United States of America June 12, 1778.

He bought his first land, fifty acres, in Bern Township, Lancaster County (later Berks County), on 17 May 1742. Then on June 2, 1746, he bought another 176 acres in the same township. On August 29, 1766, he bought another 71 acres of land. In 1785-86 Philip deeded all the above land to his son Ludwig who signed bonds totaling 600 pounds. This 600 pounds was to be divided among the other heirs of Philip faust. This farm remained in the Faust family until 1889, a total of 147 years. This homestead was located 2 miles northwest of Centerport on the road leading from Mohrsville to Shartlesville, Pennsylvania.

Philip was very active in the Reformed Church as were the other early Fausts. Philip was one of the organizers of St. Michael's Church, organized August 6, 1769, just 2 miles from where he lived. Philip was one of the first elders.

Philip Faust was a Revolutionary War Patriot. His grave is marked by a historical marker. He is buried in the old St. Michael's cemetery beside his wife, Magdalena. Their tombstones are in German. Philip's tombstone says "Here rests Philip Faust b. Feb. 1713, with his wife, Magdalena, he produced 6 sons, 4 daughters. Two sons of these in the everlasting. Died April 19, 1786." Magdalena's tombstone reads, "This is the resting place of Magdalena Faust b. 1716, d. 1789. Age 73 years, 6 months, and three days. She lived in marriage 48 years. Produced 10 children, of which 8 are yet living, namely 4 sons and 4 daughters."

On July 3, 1786, letters of administration in the estate of Philip Faust were granted to John Faust and Heinrich Moll of Bern Township, Berks County, Pennsylvania. Final distribution took place on January 22, 1789." The children of Philip Faust and Magdalena Albrecht were:

- Jacob Faust born 25 December 1757 died 27 July Brunswick Township Schuylkill Co. buried Zion Red Church Cemetery near Orwigsburg, Schuylkill Co. married Elizabeth Kieffer in 1782
- 8. Ludwig Faust born 12 January 1760 Bern Township died 27 April 1806 Bern Township buried St. Michael's Church Cemetery, Tilden Township Berks County married Hannah Kieffer on 11 October 1784

PHILIP FAUST

"Philip Faust was born in 1750 in Berks County, the son of Philip Faust and Magdalena Albrecht. He served as a soldier in the Revolution and is listed in the Upper Company of the Berks County Militia commanded by Col. Balzer Gehr. He owned 160 acres in Bern Township, Berks County, until 1792. He then moved to East Brunswick Township (later Schuylkill County) as did his brothers Johannes and Jacob. Only his brother Ludwig stayed in Bern Township. In 1792 he bought 100 acres from Richard Willits on the Little Schuylkill River in East Brunswick Township. He lived on this land the rest of his life, the property being near New Ringgold, Schuylkill County. In 1874 the land was patented to Simon Marburger, the husband of Philip's granddaughter, Catherine Seltzer Marburger. However, some of the land Philip sold on March 20, 1830, to the Little Schuylkill Navigation and Canal Company for the right-of-way for the famous canal. Philip lived to a very ripe old age and was highly respected in this area. His wife was named Susanna but her maiden name is not known. Both Philip and Susanna are buried at Freiden's Church Cemetery at New Ringgold, Schuylkill County, Pennsylvania. Beside them rest the remains of three of their grandchildren, son of their son, Peter Faust."

FRIEDRICH ANTON KNABE

Friedrich Anton Knabe was born 5 October 1805 in Prussia and died 21 June 1886 in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. He married Anna C. _____ who was born cl808 in Prussia

WILLIAM KNABE

William Knabe was born in 1836 in the Royal-Prussian Province of Saxony and died the 10th of March, 1905, in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. He married Catharine Berger on the 23rd day of April 1861 in East Birmingham, Allegheny County, Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, by Herm. Gilbert, the Pastor of the Evangelical Lutheran St. Paul's Church . Christ Knabe, Sara Ermin and Caroline Hartmann were witnesses of their wedding. Catherine was the daughter of Christ Berger and Catherine Ittel, and she was born in 1838 in the Royal Bavarian Palatinate in Germany. She died on the 7th day of February 1916 and is buried in the Genito Fresbyterian Church Cemetery in Powhatan County, Virginia.

William Knabe enrolled in Company G, of the 5th Pennsylvania Heavy Artillery Regiment on 23rd day of August 1864, as a private, and served until 30 June 1965 when he was honorably discharged at Vienna, Virginia. On the 28th day of August 1909 he applied for a pension for "chronic articula rheumatism" which occurred at Piedmont, Virginia in February 1865. He slept all night in an open field, and during the night his blankets froze to the ground.

While in the Union Army he was stationed in Virginia and one of his assignments was to blow up the bridge over the Appomattox River, which went from Powhatan County to Amelia County, very near his future home in Powhatan County. His future home fronted on Petersburg Road, which was the retreat route of General Robert E. Lee's army to Appomattox Court House.

In his application for a pension, the following information was given by Dr. A. J. Barchfeld:

"Oct 21, 1889 Hon. James Tanner Commissioner of Pensions Washington, D. C.

My dear Sir,

In the claim for Invalid Pension No 693393 of Wm Knabe, he states his residence to be 1502 Washington Street 28th Ward Pittsburg Pa. that his occupation has been from the time of his discharge up to within seven years ago (1883) that of an Iron Bundler when in 1883 he moved to a farm in Powhatan County, Virginia, from which he returned to this city in March 1889 and resumed his old occupation that of an Iron Bundler at which he is at present engaged.

During the fall of 1864, while on duty near Piedmont, they were

ordered to lay down for the night without making any alarm or camp fires. Wm Knabe states that during the night a very heavy frost fell and when he awoke in the morning he found his shoulders and hips almost He managed to stay around that day but, the next morning was stiff. compelled to seek relief from the company's surgeon. He, however, found himself greatly improved on the first medicine and in a few days was again doing service with his company, and stayed with them, until the Regiment was mustered out at Vienna C. H. in the spring of '65. After his discharge he went to work as an Iron Bundler but was compelled at different times, to resort to treatment which was furnished him by Drs. Duff & Phyloschody and myself the two former of which have however died several years ago. When he removed to Va. it was thought that the change of climate would be beneficial to his joints, particularly the right shoulder, elbow and hip-joint which were sore and inflamed that it was impossible for him to raise his hand above his head. This was in the spring of 1883, necessitating his withdrawal from manual labor for six weeks.

Any further information you should desire on this point will be cheerfully answered by

In 1883 William and Catharine Knabe moved from Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania to Powhatan County, Virginia. Catharine Knabe bought a large farm described in the following deed:

"This Deed made this 18th day of January in the year 1883 between E. C. Cady and Sarah A. his wife of Powhatan County, Virginia of the first part and Catharine Knabe of Pittsburg, Pennsylvania of the second part. Witnesseth, that in consideration of the sum of Five Thousand Dollars, the said parties of the first part do grant unto the said party of the second part with General Warranty all those tracts or parcels of land owned by them in the County of Powhatan and Known as being a part of "The Haskins Plantation" and lying between the Petersburg Road and the Appomattox River in Huguenot Township in said County in the State of Virginia, and bounded as follows, to wit: beginning at the South East Corner on the Petersburg Road at a white oak tree, the corner of Michael Langlers land, thence S. 58/4 degrees, West 192 Poles to the Appomattox River, thence up the River 167 poles to a stake, thence W. 67 degrees E 260 Poles to the Petersburg Road, thence down the Petersburg Road 124 Poles to the place of beginning containing One Hundred and Ninety (190) acres of land; also that certain other tract or parcel of land containing Two Hundred (200) acres of land, more or less and is further Known as land conveyed in 1878 by Charles Richards to John Sapish and is bounded on the East by the Petersburg Road and West by the Appomattox River and on the North by the land of Geo T. Cline. The said E. C. Cady

& Sarah A., his wife, covenant that they have the right to convey the said land to the Grantee; that they have done no act to encumber the said land; that the grantee shall have quiet possession of the said land, free from all incumbrances, and that they, the said parties of the first part will execute such further assurances of the said land as may be requisite. Witness the following signatures & seals.

William Knabe visited friends and relatives in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, and while there became ill and died on 16 March 1905. He left the following will

"In the name of God Amen: I William Knabe of Clayville, County of Powhatan and State of Virginia being of sound mind and memory do hereby make, publish and declare this to be my last will and testament in manner and form following: Hereby revoking any will or wills heretofore made by me. First. I direct all my just debts and funeral expenses be fully paid and satisfied, as soon as conveniently may be, after my decease. I give, devise and bequeath to my beloved son, Frederick Knabe all cash money I have about my person or which I may have on deposit in any Bank at the time of my death.

As to the remainder of my estate I give devise and bequeath to my wife Catherine Knabe the full one third (1/3) part thereof be the same more or less real, personal or mixed and wheresoever the same my situate at the time of my death her heirs and assigns forever. This bequest to my wife being in lieu of my dower interest she has in my estate. As to the residue of my estate I give, devise and bequeath the same share and share alike to my beloved children namely: Frederick Knabe, William Knabe, Frank Knabe and Philip Knabe and Lena Knabe, their heirs and assigns forever. I hereby nominate, constitute and appoint my son Frederick Knabe to be the executor of this my last will and testament.

In witness whereof I have to this my will set my hand and seal this 13th day March A. D. 1905.

To my daughter Lena A. Guss I give the bedstand and its ticks, boosters, pillows and covering complete, the same being the bed on which I sleep, and all of my clothes and wearing apparel, my gold spects and any jewelry I may own, my trunk and father's picture.

To my son Frederick I give Ten dollars. To my son Frank A. Knabe, I give my interest in the parlor furniture. To my son Wm. C., Phillip and Frank A. Knabe I give my interest in the machinery and farming implements and also what interest I may have in the team and stock on the farm at my death. All the rest of my property of every kind and character, of which I may die seize, and possessed, including any money in hand, I leave in equal proportions, share and share alike, to my four children, viz Wm. C. Knabe, Phillip H. Knabe, Frank A. Knabe and Lena A. Guss.

I appoint my son Frank A. Knabe Executor of this my last will & request that the court will not require any security of him as such.

Gradus Van de Reit, Patricia's great grandfather, was born on February 21, 1830 in the Netherlands (Holland). He married Johanna van de Mart who bore him three sons including John who was born on June 7, 1869. Two of the sons died in Holland, Johanna died later during the birth of a baby girl who also died.

Gradus acquired a farm, in Amelia County, in 1869, built a large new home on the property, and began his life in America.

Gradus married Geertje Brinks, daughter of the wealthy Brinks family of Amelia County, and settled down to raise a family in America. The family consisted of:

Like members of the early family of Gradus, one girl lived three years, one lived twenty and one lived eighteen years.

John Van de Reit constructed a home on a piece of the original tract and married Hattie Mae Reams who was born November 14, 1906. They raised five children- Richard, Johanna, Johnnie and the twins Luther and Louise. Mary Louise, the daughter, was adopted as a baby by Frank and Jane Knabe, and was raised as one of the family. She was born April 23, 1918. Hattie Van de Reit died on June 14, 1946. John Van de Reit died on October 12, 1962.

Gradus was an extremely religious man. His activities including building a beautiful altar in present use in the Mattoax Presbyterian Church.

Gradus, Geertje and the oldest 2 daughters, Johanna Girridina and Frances were buried behind the Mattoax church, which Gradus dearly loved.

Diena Van de Reit and William Irwin Murphey were married on October 2, 1909, in Amelia County VA at the Mattoax Memorial Church. Born of this union were:- Wade born October 10, 1910; Raymond, May 1, 1915 and Milton born March 25, 1921.

The Murphy family lived near Pine Grove Presbyterian Church in Amelia County.

MATTOAX PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH

The following article appeared in the 15 December 1961 issue of the Farmville Herald:

"Mattoax Presbyterian Chruch is located on Genito Road in Giles District about eight miles from Amelia Court House. Sunday School rooms have been added in recent years.

In the fall of 1868, six families of Hollanders came to Mattoax from Michigan, with the Rev. A. Van Raalte as their leader and colonizer. In the spring of 1869, eighty more families came from Holland. Thirty of these families settled in the neighborhood of Mattoax, and the remainder settled near Amelia Court House.

A church was organized in July 1869. This was known as the "Dutch-Reformed Church of America". The organization and the installation of officers of the church was done by the Rev. Van Raalte and Dominie Bolks of New York City, N. Y. The following officers were chosen: elders- Mr. Holsobos, Mr. J. Devries, Mr. K. Baltz, and Mr. P. Zuidema, and deacons-Mr. G. Van de Reit, Mr. J. Greelings, Mr. P. Van Dyke, and Mr. Donkers.

In 1870, a Mr. Edward Gleason who owned a farm near Mattoax known as "Clifton", gave three acres of land on the south of the Genito Road, and about two miles from the Mattoax railroad station. It was given with the understanding that it must be used for church and school purposes. In the latter part of the same year a log meeting house was built on the land. It was built of logs cut by the people and measured 22 feet by 40 feet. It served the purpose of church and school for many years, and was not torn down until about 1907.

 Ω n December 27, 1780, a preacher was called from Holland, Mich., the Rev. John Huisings. There was a flourishing congregation, but times were very hard, and conditions became very discouraging. As a result, many of the Dutch settlers left. Some went back to Holland, Mich., and others moved farther west. By 1872, only a dozen of the original families remained here. It was difficult to raise enough money to pay the pastor and support the church. Early in 1876, Mr. Huisings received a call from a church in Nebraska, which he accepted. When he left about seven families went with him.

There were only about five of the original families left to carry on the work and to keep the church alive. It seemed that everything would come to naught, but a little flicker of light kept burning. Those left behind met every Sunday in the church. They sang, prayed, read the Bible, and sermons by the Rev. Charles Spurgen were read. Most of the sermons were in the Dutch language. Of course these sermons did not have the same force and effect as they would have had if they had been delivered in person. If it had not been for the goodness of the Rev. Hartwell Harrison, who came to preach for them once a month, the church could never have held together. He was a Baptist minister and a good friend to them. Later a student was engaged to preach for them.

In the spring of 1885, after due consideration, Mr. G. Van de Reit suggested that they unite with the Amelia Presbyterian Church. This was agreed upon, and they became Mattoax Presbyterian Church. The following were the members: Mr. and Mrs. G. Van de Reit, Mr. and Mrs. William Stapelkamp, Miss Josephine Harvie, Mr. and Mrs. M. Zuidema, Mr. and Mrs. Peter Zuidema, Elder G. Van de Reit, Mr. and Mrs. W. L. Mason, Mr. and Mrs. J. Geerlings, Mrs. W.O. Harvie, Mr. A. T. Leistra, Mr. J. Leistra, and Deacon William Stapelkamp. The Rev. G. H. Denny was the pastor.

According to Mr. Peter Zuidema, now living in the vicinity, he immigrated from Holland with his parents when he was nine years old. (He is now in his seventies). There were about 100 families on the immigrant train when it reached Mattoax. He said that the Dutch minister who promoted the movement to America, and the settlement in Amelia was a chaplain in the Federal Army, and saw service in the country during the war. As a result, Amelia County was selected as a desirable place to plant a colony.

According to Mr. Zuidema, the original log church, built in 1870, was not torn down but was sold about 1907 to a colored man named Jack Jones. It was moved about a mile up the Genito Road and located on the north side of the road where it now stands, the home of the man who purchased it. The logs are now covered with weather-boarding, but in all respects it is the same as it was when it served as a church.

The Rev. George H. Denny was the pastor of the Amelia Church at the time of the union of the two churches, and consequently became the pastor of the united churches. He was succeeded by the Rev. Joseph R. Rennie, who in turn was succeeded by the Rev. D. P. Rogers.

The next minister was the Rev. Charles W. Kernan. Later when Mr. Kernan accepted a call to Morefield, W. Va., Dr. Christian was the supply pastor. The next minister was the Rev. D. D. Wilkinson, who organized the Amelia Parish Plan. He was pastor of all the Presbyterian Churches in the county, and each church had a student pastor, who came out from the Seminary in Richmond and worked under Mr. Wilkinson. When Mr. Wilkinson left, he was followed by the Rev. Milton Reid. After a while the student plan was given up, and each church was left on its own, Mr. Reid staying with the Amelia Church.

After being without a pastor for a while, the Rev. Harry D. Painter accepted the call November 13, 1960. He is the present pastor of Pine Grove and Mattoax Churches."

LETTER OF PETER ZUIDEMA

"PETER ZUIDEMA 3008 Peronne Ave. Norfolk, Va

June 14, 1941

Mr. W. Wichers, Holland, Michigan

Dear Sir:

In compliance to your request I am writing a synopsis of the Holland Settlement in County of Amelia, State of Virginia. It came about in the following manner to the best of my memory.

In March of 1869 some agent in The Netherlands received a letter from Reverend A. C. Van Raalte at the Amelia Court House in Virginia telling of the wonderful opportunities there of establishing a Holland Colony. That he, Dr. Van Raalte, had been in the South during the war between the States and was deeply impressed by the mild and even climate, the beauty of the country, the comparatively easy clearing of land and it's fertility, and the cheapness in price, as land could be bought for from five to te dollars an acres. But, he stressed the fact that as all the slaves had been freed, labor was cheap. So he advised that those contemplating to come should have enough money to buy some land enough money to carry them overe at least one year and not to purchase more than they could pay for. Those that came with little or no money should either rent land on shares or go to the City, eight Richmond or Norfolk, to obtain work.

Now what Dr. Van Raalte's reason for coming here was whether he was a Chaplain in the Union Army or visiting his son, Ben, who was a soldier in the army, I am not sure of. But in the spring of 1869 about fifty families left the Netherlands for the New World as they called it. Ι, the writer of this, then a boy of eight years old was among them with my father & mother, two sisters and two brothers. The rest went on to Amelia Court House ten miles further on, which was located on the then known Richmond and Danville R. R. When we arrived we found here were some Hollanders already there who welcomed us and provided a good dinner for all and boy were we hungry. There also were some at Amelia Court House who had previously come with the Dominie from Holland, Michigan among whom were a Mr. Brink and family. Well, we arrived at these respective places on the 9th day of May and in the fall some more came from Michigan and all were enthused over the prospect of a prosperous settlement. According to the traits of true Hollanders they followed the example of the Patriarch Abraham of old. The first thing they thought of was a church where they could worship the God of their fathers according to the dictates of their own conscience and sing the

good old Psalms in their own tune.

So, in the spring of 1870 a Dominie Bolks of New York came here and he with Dr. Van Raalte organized a church at Amelia and also one at Mattoax. I do not know much about the one at Amelia, but at Mattoax the following Elders and Deacons were elected and installed. Elders Henry De Vries, M. Hulsabos, Jan Geerlings, and M. Zuidema (my father). Deacons Gradus Van der Riet, Klaas Bultje, Teunis De Vries and Pieter Van Dyke. Besides these men and their families there were Henry Maarten, C. Blink, G. Koster, M. Pluimer, Mr. Mykamp, J. Donkers, T. Leistra, Baker Van der Riet, Mr. Bodewyk, H. Koert, Mr. Wierenga, and Mr. Biefsma. There were more but I do not recall their names. Now soon after the organizing of the church & installation of its officers, they got busy building a house of worship. First one hewn of wood, not fancy to be sure, but large enough and warm. It served the purpose of church service and school.

Now it seemed all would be well. But, alas, some soon became dissatisfied. They either had misunderstood or not heeded Dr. Van Raalte's advice. Many of them came without money and as unskilled laborers could not obtain work or at least find work which would pay enough to decently live on. So quite a number left in the summer and autumn of 1870. Some back to the old country, others to Chicago, New Jersey, Iowa, Michigan, and so on. But some before leaving avenged their wrath on Dr. Van Raalte and threatened bodily harm, blaming him for their own mistakes. Then on top of that 1870 was the driest year that had been experienced for many years in Virginia. As a result there was a shortage of crops.

But now let us leave Mattoax for a look at the settlers at Amelia Court House. There was not as large a number of Dutch people there as there were at Mattoax. The men with their families as I remember were Jan Brinks, G. Oldgere, Mr. St. Haver, Oege Spoelstra, J. Veltman and a Mr. Leis. There a few others whose names I cannot now recall. But Jan Brinks, who was the most prominent and wealthiest of them, and G. Oldgers were the two Elders chosen. I do not know who the Deacons were. They did not build a house for worship, but held meetings one Sunday at one member's home, the next at another, and so on. I was with my father one Sunday at one of those meetings at the home of Mr. Brinks. As a boy of nine years then, it was there I saw Dr. Van Raalte, and fine looking and mild mannered old gentleman who appeared to me a man in his late fifties. There was also at Amelia at that time a Mr. Gillmore who I believe was a son-in-law to Dr. van Raalte and also a preacher, as I always heard him spoken of as Dominie Gillmore. If I am not mistaken he was to be the Professor of the Theological School of Amelia. I remember the building well. It was called the Amelia College and was an old time building having previously been used for a school before the war. I remember only one young man who entered the new seminary as a student, and that was young John Brinks who later went to Holland, Michigan to complete his studies for the ministry. But the college soon came to naught and the building was converted into a hotel. The dissatisfied

settlers _____oed so much ado about their disappointments that Dr. Van Raalte fearing mob violence went back to Holland, Michigan. This was sometime in 1871. A few years later we heard of his death no doubt feeling sad and disheartened if not disgusted with the whole scheme of which he had fostered such great hopes. I think Dominie Gillmore also went with him or went somewhere else, I am not sure, and can give you no further information regarding the church at Amelia.

So now I'll take you back to Mattoax. As stated before, on account of failures and disappointments, quite a number left. But there were still enough left to keep up the church work. We got a preacher from Holland, Michigan, a single man by the name of Johannes Huizenga, who preached for us Sundays and taught school during the week. He was an ideal man for the job as most of his pupils were Dutch and could not speak English. He was a great help in getting us to learn the meaning of words sooner than we possibly could have without such aid. So everything appeared to be for smooth sailing from then on. But again as a result of the mistakes that had been made by those who had bought land, they had been advised and urged by a man whose name I prefer not to name who posed as Hollandche Land Agente (may I explain that it was not Mr. Brinks who was also a land agent) to buy about 4 or 5 times as much as they could pay for because they were led to believe that land would soon be unobainable because of soaring prices. For example, one man bought 1200 acres for \$25.00 per acre, paid ten thousand cash, balance three equal annual installments at 8% interest. Well, naturally to make those payments was as impossible as fling to the moon on a wheelbarrow. So some of those most venturesome farmers lost all they In the meantime, Dominie Huizenga went on a visit to Michigan and had. a month later returned bringing his bride with him from Zeeland, Michigan who before her marriage was a Miss Boonstra. Then I think it was during 1876 or 1877 that some more left and went to Nebraska and after they had been there a year or so, our Dominie received a call from there and accepted. So now we were without a pastor but kept up the services in the Holland language by the Elders reading C. H. Spurgeon's We then were too few in number to maintain a preacher. sermons. Ve younger ones had learned enough English to understand the sermons and after carrying on half in Dutch, half in English for four more years, a Presbyterian minister from Amelia paid us a visit and after having full knowledge of the situation, suggested for us to join the East Hanover Presbytery with membership and property thus assuring us of regular services conducted by a minister. So we called a special meeting of all the then remaining members with Mr. G. Van der Riet and M. Zuidema the only two remaining Elders presiding. We took a vote by ballot over this matter and the vote was unanimously in favor of going over to the Presbyterian Church and have a certain Mr. Denny for a minister. Soon thereafter we were able to build a very nice and commodious church building as many of the American people became members and we were in much better financial shape than before. The church is now known as the Memorial Presbyterian Branch Church of Amelia.

This being about all the information I am ale to give you about the Dutch settlement in Virginia by Dr. Van Raalte, I hope this may be of service to you and hope the God of all the earth may ever bless you people of Holland and hope that after having served our time here on earth, we all hear the welcome voice saying "Come ye blessed of my Father, enter thou into the joy of my Father", the place he now is preparing for his saints.

In 1969, the following information was given to Mrs. Elsie Knabe about Mattoax Presbyterian Church:

"In the back of the present pulpit was found a yellowed piece of paper with the following notation:

"This pulpit was made in 1893 by Gradus Van de Reit, from ceiling scraps of the present church. Mr. Van de Reit was an Elder of Mattoax Church. W. L. Mason, Sr., also an Elder in Mattoax Church donated the heading and corner posts for the pulpit. Deinna and Jane, daughters of Mr. Van de Reit, helped their father to build this pulpit. Deinna is now Mrs. Irwin Murphy, member of Pine Grove Church. Jane, Mrs. Frank Knabe, a member of Genito Church. She with her father and also W. L. Mason have passed to the Life beyond.""

"Mrs. Henry Bultje Dear Mrs. Bultje

While working on my family tree this past winter, I discovered that my Great Grandfather (Hendrikus Koster) had gone to Amelia, Virginia in 1868 with Rev. A. C. Van Raalte and a Mr. Nijkamp and started a colony of Dutch Reformed church people. I later learned that there were 4 other families with this grouip. We are now tring to trace a G. Koster who also settled there about that time. We believe he is a brother of our great grandfather. We knew of his existence but have not been able to trace his descendants in Holland or America

My Great Grandfather left Amelia and was living in Patterson. New Jersey by the fall of 1871. He homsteaded in Sioux Center, Iowa in 1872 and most of his relatives remain in that area. My grandfather Gerrit William Koster homesteaded in New Holland, South Dakota in 1882 and was 8 years old when his family went to Virginia. My Father left Dakota with his wife and children in 1933 and, we have now lived in Washington for many years.

Pastor Russell Davis of Amelia writes that you are a Descendant of the Van de Riets this is interesting as my wife's Uncle Henry Wichers of Oak Harbor Washington is also a descendent of those Van de Riets in Virginia. His family homesteaded in Dispatch Kansas in the 1870's.

Many of the early settlers of Amelia came to South Dakota, Kansas, Nebraska & Iowa after they left Virginia. My mother knew Bultjies in South Dakota when we lived there, and there are some living in Lynden Wash. Possibly these are relatives of yours.

Some of your early day relatives that went to Kansas in the 1870's (meaning the Van de Riets) dried out and went broke in Kansas about 1887 and went north to New Holland, South Dakota where my mother's grandmother and others joined the wagon train and went to Pease, Minnesota where they again started a church. My relatives and your relatives are still living in that area.

The reasons I am writing you are:

1. Any relatives or friends you may have, who might be able to give me information about G. Koster who lived in Amelia.

2. Pastor Russell Davis says you have a relative in Washington State we might contact.

3. Any information about Hendrikus Koster that might be available around Amelia or Mattoax .

If you can give me any information I would appreciate it very much, and if I can give you any information I will gladly do so. I hope to be in Amelia some time late this summer.

WRIGHT FAMILY #125

"HISTORY OF THE WRIGHT FAMILY

Some of the Wrights have been working on the "Wright Famly Tree" for years and have not been able to get beyond our great grandfather.

According to several stories I have been told, my great grandfather, Seymour, and four brothers came to Canada from France. Seymour changed his last name to Wright. From Canada, he moved to Virginia and settled in Buckingham County. Whether there is any truth in these stories, I do not know.

My great grandfather, Seymour A. Wright was born October 19, 1817. His occupation was farming.

Great Grandfather Wright married Annie Catherine Huddleston of Buckingham. Of this marriage, eleven children were born, seven sons and four daughters.

They were Sally Ann Wright who married Berry Huddleston. I do not know the names of their children, if any.

Martha E. Wright was born in 1845. She married Fred Wiggins and had three children: Littleberry, Katherine and Clara Scott.

William Silas Wright was born April 26, 1847. He married Mary Caroline Coleman, daughter of Gulielmus and Caroline Coleman and granddaughter of Thomas Huddleston. They eleven chldren: Allen, Hilride, Mary Shank, Julia Robertson, Lou Howse, Sally Knabe, Kate Miller, Emma West, Willie, Fred and Elmo.

Thomas H. Wright was born in 1849. He married M. H. "Nannie" Heath and had four chldren: George, Harriet, Eula Huddleston and John F.

James A. Wright married Alice B. Childress and had eleven children: Jane Jones, Clara Traylor, Rozelia Snead, Seymour A., Jessie V. Snead, Benjamin Harrison, Ottie Cosby, Ruth Jones, Nannie Hopkins Smith, James V., and Tilman.

John S. Wright married twice. First to Virginia E. Scott and had no children. Second to Alice Virginia Hendrick and had five children: William S., Samuel Claiborne, Clara Shank Bailey, Blanch Bangle and John James.

Edward Federson Wright married twice. First to Annie Wiggins and had seven children: Annie Madison, Ellen Davis, Agnes Barnard, Leona War, Philip, Silas and Isaac. Second time to Gay Clements and had no children.

Nancy J. Wright was born in 1854. Died in 1865.

Philip A. Wright was born in 1859. Never married. Died in 1894. Jefferson D. Wright was born in 1861. Died in 1862. Mary C. Wright was born in 1865. Died in 1866.

For a time, Great Grandfather worked as a miller at Cira in a mill located on the Willis River near the Buckingham County line.

After the Civil War, Great Grandfather and his family moved to Amelia County. He and his sons farmed the Jefferson Place until the boys began to marry and go on their own. This farm is located on Route 609 about three and one half miles north of Amelia Court House.

Great Granfather Wright died March 28, 1898. He and Great Grandmother are buried in the Grub Hill Episcopal Church Cemetery. A large field stone marks Great Grandmother's grave.

My grandfather, William S. Wright, son of Seymour and Annie Catherine was born February 26, 1847 in Buckingham County. His occupation was farming.

In the year 1873, Grandfather married Mary Caroline "Molly" Coleman of Buckingham. He was twenty six and she was twenty two. Of this marriage eleven children were born, five sons and six daughters. They were Allen (died in infancy), Hilride, Mary, Julia, Lou, Sallie, Kate, Emma, Willie, Fred and Elmo.

After leaving the Jefferson Place, Grandfather and his familiy rented several farms before buying one of their own. Tobacco was their chief money crop.

The Williamson Farm located a few miles from Mattoax was the first place they lived. Second, they moved to the Saunders Farm, nearby. They were made a much better deal on this farm. Both farms are now a part of the Amelia Wildlife Reserve. Third time, to the Glenmore Farm, near Chula. Mother often told of their long, cold walks to school in the wintertime. The school was in the vicinity of Winterham. From the Glenmore Farm, they bought a farm near Genito, bordering on the Appomattox River. This farm was called "Locust Hill". The original house burned in 1907.

Grandmother Wright, I have been told, was a great seamstress and all her daughters carried on this fine tradition and they passed it on to their daughters.

An amusing anecdote my mother used to tell is how her younger brothers refused to do any work without her helping them. She had to help on Sundays even if she had a date. This evidently passed on to the next generation, too.

Grandfather and his son, Hilride, were often seen at the flour mill in a green wagon with a fish painted on it. I wondered why the fish but found out the wagon was made by Fish Brothers. I always heard what grand cooks Grandmother and her daughters were. Just imagine all that good homemade bread, cakes and pies.

Grandfather and Grandmother lived on Locust Hill until their deaths. Grandfather died October 9, 1913 at the age of sixty six. Grandmother died January 23, 1918 at the age of sixty eight. Both are buried in the Genito Presbyterian Church Cemetery.

Some of the Wright family lived on the farm until it was sold in 1969. The farm is now a subdivision known as "Genito Mill Estates", consisting mostly of trailers and a few houses dotted about.

Children of William S. and Molly C. Wright, who they married and the names of their children:

Allen Smith Wright was born February 14, 1874. Died in infancy.

Hilride Marion Wright was born October 7,1875. He never married. He died August 11, 1933

Mary Catherine Wright was born August 22, 1877. She married John Shank. They had six children: George, Mabel Tyler, Dillion, Sadie Suddith, Elizabeth Suddith and Linwood Shank. Mary died May 19, 1932.

Julia Caroline Wright was born November 20, 1880. She married Lewis Robertson. They had four children: George, Lillian Clements, Louise Throckmorton and Lewis "Buster" Robertson. Julia died in 1957.

Lou Ann Wright was born December 28, 1882. She married Jacob Howse. They had two children: William and Christeen Huddleston. Lou died February 28, 1961.

Sallie Amelia Wright was born January 28, 1885. She married Philip Knabe. They had five children: Harr, Herman, Catherine Hatch, William and Elsie Ackerman Rowbotham. Sallie died March 23, 1964.

Kate Elizabeth Wright was born March 24, 1887. She married T.P. "Thea" Miller. They had two children: "Mollie" Locknanae and Mildred Harris. Kate died March 1, 1970.

Emma Harrison Wright was born September 19,1888. She married Arthur West. They had eleven children: Frank, Mattie Jones, Lloyd, Leemon, Earnest, Emma Mae Palmore, Eva, Bertha, Sturman, Lawrence, Ruby Sturman and John West. Emma died December 6, 1958

William Dunn "Willie" Wright was born May 11, 1890. He married Marie Clements. They had three children: William, Ella Daughery and Marion Fuller. Willie died February 25, 1974.

EXTRACT OF BIRTH RECORD OF HENRY HISSRICH (translated from German)

"Extract out of the Register of Births of the evangelical pastorage Homberg on the Ohm (Upper Hessia Germany.) In the year of Christ eighteen hundred and thirty five on the 27th of November, in the morning at two o'clock was born, according to creditable reports made, to Lorenz Hisserich, a citizen and butcher here, by his wife Susanna, born Thomas, the third child, a son, the second son and on the 13th of December he was batpized and received the name Heinrich ("Henry.")

Sponsors were Heinrich Menhardt, citizen and a Baker here, who with the father of the child signed the present record in my presence as pastor who performed the baptism. To Wit. Lorenz Hisserich 2d Heinrich Menhardt, George Koch Pastor.

For the correctness of this extract

The Evangelical Pastorage Homberg August Praetorias Pastor

Homber on 2d of November 1906 (Seal of Evangelical Pastorage Homberg a. d. Ohm Grand Duchy Hessen)"

Henry Hissrich was in the Union Army in the War of Secession. Henry was about 5 feet 5 inches tall and weighed about 151 when he was 55 years of age. In the service he was a lieutenant and in the regimental quartermaster, while in the 74th Pennsylvania Volunteer Infantry. He enlisted in the army on April 16, 1861 and was discharged on October 15, 1864 in Grafton, West Virginia. He died December 27, 1908.

"THE DEATH ROLL

Henry R. Hissrich

Henry R. Hissrich, one of the oldest residents on the North Side, died yesterday at his home, 1414 Poplar street, after an illness of three weeks. Congestion of the brain was the cause of his death. Mr. Hissrich was born November 27, 1835, in Homber-on-der-Ohm. Hesse Darmstadt, Germany, and came to this counry with his parents in 1846. The family came direct to Pittsburgh and practically ever since, Mr. Hissrich had lived on the North Side. He served through the civil war with the Seventy-fourth regiment, Pennsylvania volunteers, as quartermaster sergeant and quartermaster. He was a member of Lieut. James M. Lysle Post 128, G. A. R. and of Allegheny section, Independent Mutual Aid Association of Pennsylvania. He was also a charter member of International Typographical Union No. 7. Mr. Hissrich was survived by his widow, four sons, Harry R., Jr., Lawrence P., R. W. and C. E., and three daughters, Mrs. Lisette Hunter and the Misses Susan C. and Mary. He also leaves six grand children and two sisters, Mrs. Aloh Mochiston and Miss Julia. The funeral will be held at 2 p. m. tomorrow from the home." Pittsburgh newspaper.

The following letter was sent to Frank Knabe and family:

"#227 Fisk Ave., Avalon, PA., May 25, 1933

Dear Cousin Frank & Family;

It was with deep sadness that we received your message informing us that Jane had gone home and her suffering was over. We had received a card from Sallie in the morning stating that her condition was worse and when we saw the messenger we thought of you and yours.

I am at a loss for words at this time but assure you that you have the deepest sympathy of Dean, Betty, Reinhard and I and all of our family and all relatives up here in the North. We phoned them of your loss and Jane's gain for Jesus loved her more than we and Betty said it is awful sad; all will miss her, but try to realize how she suffered and now is at rest. We all feel bad and our hearts go ouit to Gertrude and Louise for they will feel it more.

Frank, comfort ye one another for Jane ran a good race; fought a good fight'; and there is laid up a crown for her; and the rest through faith must carry on for she gave to the world and the world and community is and will be better for lives such as she lived.

You all tried to lessen her burden and suffering and give her joy and happiness and I know it is going to be hard and commend all to Him who careth for all. Trust only in Him and He will give sufficient grace for all your needs. Sorry some of us cannot be with you in person but will be in spirit and our prayers go out to all.

The following letter was written to Gertrude Virginia Knabe:

#227 Fisk Ave., Avalon, Pa., Mar. 23rd, 1937

My dear Gertrude Virginia,

We were very sorry to learn of your illness also for Louise and hope both are gaining strength and are well again. We know just how you felt and trust you will not have any more spells this winter. Betty was also laid up about two weeks, but she is better again. Beinhard still has a cold and is taking Cod Liver pills. He needs a good rest, but they are still working over on the South Side, but don't know how long it will last. Lucian is working hard, and instead of working them nights now they have changed so some work the regular hours and others start at 4:30 P. M. and work until midnight. The girls are feeling pretty good again. Howard Hunter had a spell at Annapolis and was operated on for appendicitis and was over it about two weeks when they went down last Saturday a week. He told them he had a cold and probably it was best for Zet would have done a lot of worrying. He is getting along O. K.

Betty and Lucian are going to moved down on our Street; four doors below us. Their rent was increased again and also had to pay the water rent if they continued there, but they have got this other place and although they will have to get a range and refrigerator they will save and have those articles for themselves, and be nearer us. Virginia is also going to move.

The Fred Trusts are taking their upstairs and renting the first floor to a young couple. Fred has had considerable trouble with his limbs, but is improving. Mary and Gertrude are all right. Dean and I were invited guests at a gathering they had of their U. P. group last Saturday a week. They go around at each others homes when any of them have a birthday and all the eats are prepared and taken and they sure have a good time. While the most of them played cards I; all alone; played with five women at your game of Monopoly and did I get skinned; lost everything although I was the Banker; such arguments; but I am still alive.

Sorry you lost some time at work but trust they certainly did not dock you owing to sickness. You know I only wanted to pay for postage and as far as the nice things we did for you; don't ever forget what you all did for me and you know you love to do all you can for those whom you think a great deal of and love dearly. What a speech, but no bolonia; all true. You'll say cheese it, but I covered the postage and a glass of your favorite Cheese. Ha' Ha' thats one on you. I can imagine you letting that glass down as if it were a hot potato. Sorry I have been unable to find the films as yet.

We would like nothing better than to motor or get down to your home someway this summer, but the house will have to be painted this year and some carpentering work done before the painting, but lets hope for I sure would like to get down again. I believe I will get my light suit that I have been wearing this fall and winter cleaned and then I'll look dudeish this spring as I meander down the boulevard. Hope the business improves for we are getting three new trucks and purchased the strip of ground from the Garage out to the Bridge that goes over Lowries Run that you went over to reach the Boulevard. The two houses on our street Herron Ave. that the flood wrecked area about torn down now and they are tearing down the old barn at the end of our property, and it sure makes a big difference with that open space. At the dam they have nine big piers up where the gates will be and I'll try someday to get a good picture of it for you.

We hope you will look fine in your Easter outfit and wish it was a brand new outfit from the top of your head to the soles of your shoes, for I know of no young lady that deserves it more than our Gertrude. It is as you suggest a little bit inconvenient at times to be without that which some term filthy lucre, but don't worry I look just as handsome in my old suit; providing it is cleaned and pressed; with a nice clean shave and smile; and I know you will look very pretty and if you get the organdde; we want a picture of you wearing the same, for you know the other picture rests on the living room mantel.

We are glad your Daddy is feeling better and hope he will continue to grow stronger and hope he could come up to see us. Glad Albert is well and that the booklet was received O. K. How is Mason? Don't he write any at all. He might drop a little note sometime when you write. Hope he is well and stronger.

We have had some real pretty weather and then some bad snow storms. Last week about 4½ inches of snow and the water started up a little, but the rain held off and so far it has not reached flood stage. I enclose a few cutting of last years flood and a record of the floods we have had here. We don't want to see anymore.

Last night Reinhard and I started to clean wall paper and he did the ceilings of the Living and Dining Rooms and part of the walls while I did the lower parts of the walls. If I was your height or if you had been here you might have given me a boost and then I could have reached away up to the ceiling. We use the Cleveland Wall Cleanser and it is fine; it comes in small cans and is a pretty pink color but when you get through with it it is a dirty black.

Will be sending you some seed soon.

Give our best wishes and love to all and remember us to all, and hope all are well and will have a delightful Easter time.

Pick out a goodly portion for yourself.

Dean has had a little cold in her chest but is feeling better now; but will have to hold her down on this house cleaning.

Are having our annual canvas and dedication services Sabbath."

A second letter to Gertrude:

"#227 Fisk Avenue, Avalon, Pa., May 27th, 1937.

My dear Gertrude Virginia:-

Now don't be surprised that 1 write you so soon and before answering Louise's letter, but tell her I love her still and will write soon. I wanted to let you know that I had mailed to you some seed and hope you will be able to get time to plant same and that you will have success and get some pretty flowers. The Canna seed will take time and then you will have to lift the bulb after the frost and then put them in again each year. Did I not send you some canna bulbs with the folks when they were up?

I have been very busy; as usual; but Wm. G. Morrison; the one that drove the Southern Beauty to the Depot; took a trip to California and was gone from Apr. 4th until the 30th and while he was away we had the Flood again. That makes three in about a year and believe you me they hurt and test the nerves too much for comfort. About 20" to 24" more and it would have been up to the Warehouse & Office floors. Had 40" in the Yard and almost two feet on the street in front; came in our Truck. Those nine big pier gates that they put in at the Dam are not completed as yet and they help to give us more trouble owing to the new increased seven foot water stage, but when they are finished probably we will have some relief. Sorry you had the Flood also and when we heard about it at Richmond our prayers went out for you and your charge with the Buss and wish you could get some position that you did not have to work so long and hard and more compensation.

We are all pretty well and Reinhard is feeling better since he has been to the Doctor twice. That work with irregular hours and different eating poisoned him, but he looked better when home Sabbath. He is down at Youngstown, Ohio, again this week and will probably finish again this week. Wish he could get a steady position.

Betty and Lucian have moved and are gradually getting things fixed up. Kate Thomas helped her some with the cleaning and they are held up for their Range. You know the Range and Refrigerator belonged to the apartment and they had to get new ones for themselves. They got a beautiful Norge and the Range will be a Norge type also.

I hope you'll never forget to write for you know your Northern Pappy misses you a lot and would like to do more for you and I believe you have felt and realize that you have a big place in our hearts. You know these five or six years have been hard ones and much repair work had to be done on the home and so we finally had to take care of it and the carpenters, plumber, tinner and electrician have about finished and the painters will soon come. Dean has had her hands full, but she likes what had been done; kitchen sink raised and Tylax put on the wall around same; white with black markings in about four inch squares. New lights in kitchen, living room downstairs and in the three rooms and hall upstairs. New door in hall upstairs going to sky parlor; which I forgot to take you up to see. You'll like it I know and it will make things easier for Dean. When the painters finish I'll get a picture for you.

Yes, I worked in the garden a good deal and hope to have many pretty flowers. Sent Hazel a bunch of Lillies of the Valley as she don't have any flowers. The hot weather made them all come at once. Do you have any of the plants?

Sorry Albert is lonesome and homesick and will try to write him soon. You know we all liked you in the Organdie and anyone with good taste for daintiness and beauty could not help think it was pretty, but with the girl OH' my heart. Glad you had a good time and hope you have many of them. I have a clipping of Bill Green's that I expected to send to you.

Sorry you are still having trouble with your eyes. Be careful and don't work too hard and read late. Don't get discouraged for look what I was up against and have worn them for 44 years and was not as strong as you. Trust and do your best and everything will be O. K. Wish ${f I}$ could come down this summer, but the way things are going; labor trouble and increased prices are hurting things.

Mary Trust will graduate next month as will also Margaret and Harold Fisher, Hazel's two older children and Billy Hissrich, brother Lawrence's boy.

Zet's folks are expecting to drive down to see Howard before he goes on his Cruise and they talked about driving down South so you may see them this sumer. Wish Betty and Lucian would get a vacation and could put Dean & I in along.

Hope Uncle John is improving and that Bernice and the Boy and growing stronger. Give our love and best wished to all.

You bet if I get anytime and can manage I try to see you and all the folks if possible.

Yes we had a real nice Mother's Day. Program enclosed. Dean got goods for some summer dresses and a little money for something she desired. Fred Trust's Uncle Fred died Saturday in his 86th year."

James Clarke was a soldier of the American Revolution, as stated in Order Book 12, page 315 of York County, Virginia, 16 June 1834, as follows:

"On the motion of Ann Thomas ordered that it be Certified that it appears to the Court from satisfactory evidence adduced, that James Clarke who is reputed to have been in the war of the Revolution died intestate in the County of York leaving as his only heirs at Law Ann Clarke and Philmer Clarke. That Ann Clarke has since the death of the said James Clarke intermarried with a man by the name of Thomas Tommas. That Philmer Clarke is dead leaving as his Heirs John Clarke, Thomas Clarke and Clarentine Clarke who has since intermarried with Edward Hogg and Robert Clarke an infant: and that the said Philmer has also left a widow Lavinia who is now living."

Unfortunately, the name of the wife of James Clarke is unknown.

PHILMER CLARKE

Philmer (Filmer) Clarke was born c1785, probably in Warwick (now York) County. Philmer's first wife was Nancy _____, born about 1785. As the second male child was often named after the paternal grandfather, there is a very strong possibility that Nancy was the daughter of Thomas Townsend, who was a shoe and boot maker. Thomas Townsend Clarke was also a shoe and boot maker, and probably learned the trade from Thomas Townsend. Great great granddaughter Hazel May Guss Bradley still has some of the shoemaker's tools owned by Thomas Townsend Clarke.

His second marriage was to Lavinia Lee, the daughter of John Lee, to whom he was married 13 July 1824 in Yorkhampton Parish of York County. In York County Court, 18 March 1834, the following information was given: " On the motion of Walker Hubbard the court doth certify from satisfactory evidence adduced, that John Lee, who is reputed to have been an officer in the war of the Revolution, died intestate in the County of York, on ____ day in February, 1821, and left issue, Aphsa who has intermarried with William Scott, Elizabeth who has intermarried with Charles Hansford, Sarah who has intermarried with Walker Hubbard, Martha who has intermarried with Robert P. Shelburn, and Lavenia who intermarried with Philmer Clarke and who are the only heirs of the said John Lee. The said Philmer Clarke is now dead and his wife survives."

Philmer and Nancy Clarke were the parents of the following known children:

- 1. John Clarke born c1810
- 2. Thomas Townsend Clarke born c1813
- Clarentine Clarke born cl815 married 2 May 1832 York County Edward Hogg
- 4. Robert Clarke born June 1822

THOMAS TOWNSEND CLARKE

Thomas Townsend Clarke, of York County, married first Georgianna Wills, daughter of George Wills (who died cl837) & Elizabeth ______ (born cl800), on 23 December 1837, and married as his second wife, Parkey Jane Walthall on 18 September 1844. Thomas Clarke was a shoemaker by trade. His son James Philmer Clarke also became a shoemaker, but probably because he could make a better living he left the shoemaking profession and became a master carpenter. Georgianna died cl843 in York County and Thomas died in 1863 in Williamsburg, Virginia.

JOHN WESLEY CLARKE

John Wesley Clarke was born in 1840 or 1841 in Williamsburg, Virginia, the oldest child of Thomas T. Clarke, and Georgianna Wills. By trade he was a house carpenter. On 13 February 1862 he married Susan Elizabeth Ball, the daughter of George F. and Maria Ball (born cl807 in Princess Anne County, Virginia), in Williamsburg, Virginia, a marriage that ended with the early death of his wife.

John Wesley Clarke was a private in Company C of the 32nd Virginia Infantry in the Civil War. He enlisted on 26 April 1861 in Williamsburg, Virginia. He was wounded in action at Brook Chrurch on 12 May 1864 with a gunshot wound in his hip and thigh. He returned to duty 30 August 1864. He was present at all roll calls except being absent for sickness from 31 August 1861 until 1 March 1863. He was on furlough beginning 31 September 1863. He was AWOL in February 1862 (the month in which he was married) and also beginning 31 September 1863.

The following deed enabled Susan E. Clarke to own land in Williamsburg:

"This Deed made this 5th day of July 1869 between Ro. A. Leively and Florence E. his wife, of the first part, and J. Filmore Clark who has been chosen Trustee of the second part. Witnesseth: That for and in consideration of the sum of Seventy dollars (\$70.00) which is hereby

acknowledged to have been received of Susan E. Clark wife of John W. Clark. The said parties of the first part have sold and conveyed and do by their presents sell grant and convey to the said party of the second part all of their rights, title, interest and estate in and to an certain lot of land situate lying and being in the City of Williamsburg opposite Archer Brooks residence and bounded as follows: On the North and East by Mo. A. Leivelys lots- On the West by an out side lane running by the College gate, and on the South by the Street running in front of the front gate of the Eastern Lunatic Asylum. The Eastern line of said lot commencing Sixty four (64) feet front and rear, from the Western line of the lot owned by Mrs. Fannie Dosier. The lot is supposed to be about Fifty four (54) feet wide more or less on the front and the same on the rear the length is supposed to be one hundred and twenty eight (128) feet or running back to the rear, on a line with Mrs. Fannie Doziers lot said lot being a portion of the lot conveyed to Ro. A. Leively by deed executed on the 17th day of June 1869 by Edward Boyle Special Commissioner of Wm Durfeys estate appointed by the Circuit Court of the City of Williamsburg and the County of James City. And the said Robert A. Leively and Florence E. his wife warrant generally the property conveyed but in Trust for the sole seperate and exclusive use and benefits of the said Susan E. Clark wife of John W. Clark and to be forever free from all debts liabilities and incumbrances of John W. Clark her said husband.

When Susan E. Clarke died, intestate, the property was sold by the court, as recorded in the following:

"Whereas at a special term of the Circuit Court for the County of James City and City of Williamsburg, begun an held on the 14th day of August 1876. A Decree was obtained in the Chy Suit of John W. Clarke vs J. P. Clarke Trustee & Atty for the Sale of Certain real Estate located in Williamsburg & belonging to the infant heirs of Susan E. Clarke decd. & whereas John W. Clarke was appointed by the Judge of said Court a special Commissioner to effect the sale of said real Estate. This Deed made the 23rd day of September 1876 between the said Jno W. Clarke of the City of Richmond Special Commissioner as aforesaid of the first part and Fannie Dozier of the City of Williamsburg of the second part, Witnesseth That for and in consideration of the sum of Three hundred Dollars paid or secured to be paid to the said Jno W. Clarke Special Commissioner as aforesaid, before the Sealing and delivery of these presents, by the Said Fannie Dozier, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, the said Jno W. Clarke Spl Comms aforesaid hath granted, bargained and sold & doth by these presents grant, bargain and sell to the Said Fannie Dozier with General Warranty the real estate mentioned in the decree above referred to, it being the same property bought of Ro. A. Leively and for which a Deed bearing date of the 5th day of July 1869. Was made by the Said Ro. A. Leively and Florence E., his wife to J. P. Clarke Trustee for Susan E. Clarke, and duly recorded in the Clerks Office of the City of Williamsburg said property is situated in the City of Williamsburg, and is bounded as follows-North by lot Moses Weaver (Col) South by Street running Eastward to the College landing road-East by lot of Jas A. Graham and West by Street running Northwardly to the Main Street of the City of Williamsburg & is supposed to contain ½ acres more or less.

On 27 March 1875 he married as his second wife Mary Adelaide Pettis in Richmond Virginia, where he had moved after the death of Susan.

John Wesley Clarke died on 15 October 1893 in a tragic boat accident on the James River, which was recorded in the Richmond Times:

"Mr. John W. Clarke Drowned

A Very sad accident ocurred Sunday morning between 11 and 12 o'clock, when Mr. John W. Clarke, of 1506 Beverly Street, was drowned in the James River. Last Thursday morning, Mr. Clarke went to the river on a fishing trip near Williams Island about 5 miles above the City, and left his boat. Early Sunday morning he returned accompanied by his son Thomas and Mr. Frank Wasmer, to remove the boat which was in danger of being carried down the stream by the high water into the canal. He did not have any oars, but getting into the boat, attempted to pull it around into the canal by catching hold of the branches of the bushes along the river bank. His companions offered their assistance but Mr. Clarke said he thought he could manage the boat alone. He had not gone far, however, when the willow branch he had hold of broke, and the boat drifted out into the current, which is especially swift at that place. He was unable to control the boat without oars, and the craft rapidly went down the stream, and dashed the occupant over the falls. The unfortunate man was seen standing in the boat, some distance below the falls, the boat being nearly full of water. He sunk, and the boat floated ashore near the old pumphouse. Searching parties dragged the river, and made every effort to recover the body, but up to a late hour yesterday afternoon failed, as the water in the river was quite high.

Mr. Clarke was about fifty three years of age and a carpenter. He was a son-in-law of Deputy Collector of Customs Robert E. Pettis, and was twice married. He leaves a widow and nine children, five sons and four daughters.

Mr. P. L. Clarke, a son of the deceased, who resides in Charleston, S. C. has been telegraphed for, and was expected to reach the city yesterday evening. The bereaved family have the sympathy of a wide circle of acquaintances and friends." THE TIMES-RICHMOND, VIRGINIA Tuesday October 17, 1893

"His Body Not Recovered

All efforts to recover the body of Mr. John W. Clarke, on account of whose death by drowning was published in the yesterday's Times, have proved futile. Up to a late hour yesterday the body had not been located."

The body of John W. Clarke who drowned on Sunday last, was found yesterday at 2 o'clock by John J. ______ opposite Six Gates, near Richmond ______. The body had drifted owing to the current a distance of nearly four miles ______ and when found was in a very bruised condition. It was taken to Laube's ______ First and Broad, to be prepared ______ for burial.

The funeral services will be held at 11 O'clock tomorrow at Lakeview Cemetery"

OCTAVIUS LEE "DAVE" CLARKE

Octavius Lee "Dave" Clarke was born in Williamsburg, Virginia on 27 March 1868. When he was 7 years of age his mother died, and the small family moved to Richmond, Virginia. After he was married to Annie Jackson Wilkinson, on their elopement to North Carolina, they moved to the Ridge area of Henrico County.

He was a stone mason by trade, and like so many others in that trade, he became sick from stonecutter's disease. As the disease progressed, his thoughts were of his family, and their future. He moved to Amelia County, where he thought that his family would be able to make a living on a farm, and that he could get his children out of the "city" life where they would have a more wholesome environment.

He died, a young man, on 21 February 1918 in Amelia County, Virginia. After his death, his widow, Annie, would shortly marry Egbert Dodson. He was buried in Riverview Cemetery, 24 February 1918.

JOHN WESLEY CLARKE #1221

Mary Adelaide Pettis, the wife of John Wesley Clarke, had a younger brother and the following account was written by James Kilpatrick, published in the Richmond News Leader 17 September 1948:

> "A PROFILE 'Cap'n Jack' Pettis Retires After 58 Years of Service As State Capitol Policeman

Veteran Officer, 84, Served Under 15 Governors; Welcomed Many Visitors and Served as Guide

By JACK KILPATRICK

Capitol Hill's "Captain Jack" has retired.

After 58 years and five months on the State Capitol's police force, J. P. Pettis has put aside his blue uniform and gone to hs home, on Pine Street.

The veteran police officer, 84 years old on July 29, was offered a position at his regular pay as operator of the State Capitol's elevator, the State Budget Office said. He at first accepted, and then declined. His retirement was made effective September 15.

Captain Jack came with the State April 5, 1890, when the Capitol Square included only the executive mansion, Capitol building and the Bell Tower. He served under 15 Governors and loved to tell stories on most of them.

HAD TO CHASE ONE

For many years he supervised the crew of convicts assigned to tending the Capitol Hill lawn. He is fond of recalling that none of them escaped while he was in charge, although once in Governor Montague's day he had to climb a fence behind the Finance Building and chase a fugitve on Main Street to keep his record up.

Among his favorite recollections is the time in Governor O'Farrall's administration that a jockey, returning from the Fair Grounds to a stable on Franklin Street, let his horse get out of control. The steed

crashed head on into a gate near the Bell Tower. It killed the horse and hurt the rider.

"Governor O'Ferrall comes down the hill and says, 'Boys, I want all the gates around the square taken down.' That was the end of the gates."

In recent years, Captain Jack has spent much of his time at the Capitol's west door, where his bay window and white mustache were as familiar as the boxwoods to Capitol regulars. There he welcomed 90 per cent of the capitol's visitors, directed tourists, answered questions, and saw that automobiles kept out of reserved spaces. He is known to virtually every politician and officeholder in the State.

As an authority on the Capitol's grounds, he ranked with the besttrained Capitol guides. He once observed that "Constitution oaks" won't grow on the hill-at least, 100 of them, planted in 1902, failed to survive. He has his doubts on magnolias, too; only two magnolias remain of 50 he saw planted in Governor Trinkle's time.

In World War I, so the story goes, Captain Jack was charged with putting chains on the Capitol's doors to keep out German spies. In World War II, he had a somewhat pleasanter time as a one-man welcoming committee for thousands of visiting servicemen.

Last December Captain Jack suffered leg injuries when he was struck by a slowly-backing car. He returned to his work in January, walking with a cane and resumed his post at the west door.

He confided several weeks ago, however, that a shift in police assignments might mean night work for hiim, and he didn't want to attempt it. The alternate job of Capitol elevator operator five days a week with holidays off, at first appeared to be the solution. Then the Budget Office said he decided simply to retire.

"It's like cutting down one of the trees," a Capitol worker said. "The place won't look the same."

FRANK ROLLINS CLARKE #12242

Frank Rollins Clarke was born in Williamsburg on 10 November 1875 and lived in the same house until his death on 23 September 1951. When his father died in 1923 he bought out the interests of his brothers and sisters. He learned the trade of a shoemaker, but soon found it more lucrative to go into carpentry. After his apprenticeship in carpentry, in time he became a building contractor and built a number of houses in the Williamsburg area. On one occasion, he built a house several miles from his home, and it was necessary to walk to work and home again after working all day!

When he was offered the job of superintendent of building construction and maintenance at Eastern State Hospital, he accepted the position which he held until his retirement. He was responsible for the construction of all new buildings, as well as maintenance.

Frank also loved to hunt and trap wild game, some of which he sold, with the rest helping out with the family food supply. For other extra income he had a job of firing the furnace for for some ladies who lived across the street from his house. His wife, Irene, also did clothing alterations for ladies of Williamsburg, and continued until the time of her death at the age of 83. This income was very important to her after the death of of her husband.

JAMES WILLIAM CLARK #122424

James William Clark was born in the Clark family home on 20 April 1920. School was a place he went, but admittedly, he confessed that his favorite subjects were shop and gym. After being drafted into the military service, during World War II, and completing his tour of duty, he had the opportunity of going to college under the GI bill. He was accepted into the College of William and Mary, after passing an entrance examination, and became the first of his family to get a degree from a university. In 1955 he moved to Richmond, where he was employed in the accounting department of a paper manufacturing company. In 1958 he met his future wife, Janet Sutton Jolly, at a basketball game between William and Mary College and University of Richmond. They were married six months later at the Methodist church in her home town of South Hill, Virginia. He was raised as a Baptist and is active in River Road Baptist Church, in Richmond, Virginia

CLARENTINE CLARKE #123

Upon the death of her father, Thomas Townsend Clarke, Clarentine, being a minor, chose her guardian, as follows:

"21 May 1832 Clarentine Clarke Infant Orphan of Philmer Clarke deceased with the consent and approbation of the Court chose Edward Hogg for her guardian. Whereupon the said Edward Hogg together with Lewis Hogg for his security entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of five hundred dollars for securing the said Orphan's estate of indemnifying the Courtt."

ORDER BOOK 12, page 81 York Co., VA.

A granddaughter "related some of the Civil War experiences of her grandmother, Clarentine Clark Hogg and her family. At the outbreak of the war, her oldest son, Enos was at the College of William and Mary as an adult student (being 25 years old) or engaged in some other educational pursuit. He and the second son, George, who was scarcely 18 years of age, soon joined the army of the Southern Confederacy. Jackson Tolliver, one of the slaves belonging to the family, went with them. He cooked and washed for the soldiers, and there was such a bond of affection between master and slave, that as long as both lived George Hogg would have divided his scant holdings with Jackson if he had need.

The oldest daughter died, and the mother, with her three young children, Tommy, Mary Lizzie and Amanda went back to Williamsburg to her parents home. During the Peninsula Campaign of the Civil War, this Hogg plantation was overrun, by the Northern soldiers. The home was ransacked, and pillaged, the house burned, the fences destroyed, all livestock was taken and the once prosperous farm was reduced to ruin. Before the mother left for Williamsburg she buried the family silver in a corner of the garden for safe-keeping from the enemy. After the war, it was never found. Whether the Yankees found it, or the freed slaves dug it up, no one ever knew. After the war, the land was divided into six shares, for the five children and the widow, and in time it was sold in small homesites to the freed negroes."

NICHOLAS WILKINSON

Nicholas Wilkinson was born in the early years of 1700. It is questionable where he was born, with speculation that it might have been in Charles City County, Surry County, or Henrico County.

The first documented information about Nicholas was in 1735 in Goochland County, Virginia, when he was listed on the tithe lists along with his brother, William. Nicholas was living in Southam Parish, Cumberland County on Mahook Creek. In 1777, this portion of Cumberland County became part of the new County of Powhatan. Today the property is located south of the James River and west of State Route 522, on the North side of county highway #617. Before 1728 the property was part of Henrico County.

While several tracts of land were purchased by the Wilkinson family, some were probably purchased before 1727, while the land was still in Henrico County. All court records of Henrico County for this period have been destroyed, so no deeds are known to exist. It is interesting to note that while there is no record of Nicholas buying any land, he transferred to son James 200 acres of land on 3 March 1776, recorded in deed book 5, page 410 of Cumberland County. When James Wilkinson and wife, Jane, sold the land to Charles Woodson on 18 May 1780, the property was described in the deed as being the old home place, located on Mahook Creek. Later on 10 April 1790 he transferred 25 acres of land to son-in-law, Joel Owen. In his will be gave son Thomas 100 acres of land, and also 100 acres of land to daughter Mary Owen. While his brother William (only purchase of land still on record) bought 350 acres of land in 1732 from Agnes Noland, he gave nephew Thomas Wilkinson 100 acres of land and nephew John Wilkinson 300 acres of land. James Wilkinson, a son of Nicholas, only had 200 acres of land, transferred a total of 374 acres of land before his death. From the large acreage owned by the families, it is evident that they were a family of means; and family tradition attests to the fact that the Wilkinson's were people "with money".

Much tobacco was grown in Powhatan County, and this was probably the main crop of Nicholas. While he may have sold some of the tobacco at other warehouses, he is known to have sold tobacco to the Rocky Ridge Warehouse, located in present southside Richmond, Virginia. Unfortunately, the record shows that part of his tobacco, valued at 10 pounds 17 shillings and 20 pence, was either lost or stolen from the warehouse.

While he probably had more brothers, and possibly sisters, the only one recorded was William. The only record of William, in Cumberland County, concerns the transfer of land to Thomas Wilkinson, the son of Nicholas Wilkinson, his brother. Another Wilkinson, Peter, is listed in early records, but it is unknown, whether he was a brother, or son of one of the listed Wilkinsons.

During the Revolutionary War, a Nicholas took an oath of allegiance to those seeking independence from England. It is not certain if this was Nicholas, the father, or Nicholas, the son, but also John, Peter and James Wilkinson also signed the oath of allegiance in Powhatan County.

While his wife (or wive's?) is not known, Nicholas was the father of the following known children:

- 1 Joseph Wilkinson was born 12 May 1729 married (1) Mary _____ (2) Penelope Parsons and (3) 26 December 1808 Rhoda Lockett. He later moved to Bedford County, Virginia
- 2 William Wilkinson was born about 1735 married (1) Lurana Perkins, and (2) 11 July 1761 Sarah Franklin as his second wife. They moved to Mecklenburg in 1770
- 3 Thomas Wilkinson was born about 1740, and died in 1819. His first wife was Mollie _____. He lived and died in Powhatan County.
- 4 Nicholas Wilkinson, Jr. was a private in Capt. John Mosby's Company stationed in Cumberland Old Courthouse
- 5 John Wilkinson was born about 1745 and died 16 July 1795 in Powhatan County, he married Janey ____.
- 6 Mary Wilkinson was born about 1745. She married on August 29, 1765 Joel Owen. It is believed they later moved to Bedford County, Virginia
- 7 Agnes Wilkinson was born about 1746. She married on October 28, 1766 William Owen. They later are believed to have moved to Bedford County, Virginia.
- 8 James Wilkinson was born about 1735

On May 12, 1786, the will of Nicholas Wilkinson was written, and was recorded April 16, 1795. The will follows:

"In the name of God, Amen. I Nicholas Wilkinson of the County of Powhatan be of a sound mind and perfect in my sense and reason considering the frailty and shortness of this transitory life and that it is appointed for all men once to die and being of an advanced Age have thought proper at this time to make and ordain this my last Will and Testament disannulling and utterly revoking all former wills by me made.

In the first place, I commit my body to the earth from which it came to be buried in a decent and Christian like manner at the discretion of my executors hereafter mentioned and my spirit to its Almighty God who gave it and after my just debts and funeral charges are paid I dispose of my estate in form and manner following:

Item: I give and bequeath unto my son Thomas Wilkinson one hundred acres of land whereon he now lives lying on both sides the creek being the land and plantation which I formerly lent him provided my son Thomas shall pay unto my son Joseph Wilkinson ten pounds and unto my son John Wilkinson five pounds and unto my daughter Agnes Owen, wife of William Owen ten pounds current money and shall my said son Thomas not incline to accept of the said land and pay the said mentioned sums of money then my Will is that the said one hundred acres of land be sold to the best advantage and the money procured by the sale thereof to be equally divided among my sons John Wilkinson, Joseph Wilkinson, Thomas Wilkinson and my daughter Agnes Owen to them and their heirs forever, but should my son Thomas Wilkinson choose to keep the said land and pay the said several sums of money, then I give him my said son Thomas the said one hundred acres of land already described to him and to his heirs forever.

Item: I lend unto my daughter Mary Owen the land and plantation whereon I now live being one hundred acres during her natural life and at her decease I give and bequeath the said land and plantation to my grandson Elisha Owen, son of my said daughter Mary Owen to him and his heirs forever.

Item: I give and bequeath unto my son William Wilkinson five shillings current money or the value thereof to be paid to him by my executors hereafter mentioned to him and to his heirs forever.

Item: Will is that the residue of my estate shall be equally divided among my three sons, to wit; John Wilkinson, Joseph Wilkinson, Thomas Wilkinson and my two daughters Agnes Owen and Mary Owen to them and to their heirs forever.

Item: As I have formerly given to my son James Wilkinson equally to any of the rest of my children, I do not now devise anything more to him.

And lastly I constitute and appoint my son John Wilkinson, my sonin-law Joel Owen and William Clarke to be the executors of this my Last Will and Testament in witness whereof I have unto set my hand this twelfth day of May Ammo Domini One thousand seven hundred and eighty six.

The will was recorded the 16th day of April 1795 in in Powhatan Court, on the oath of Gallio Wilkinson and Susannah Owen.

THOMAS WILKINSON

Thomas Wilkinson was born about 1740. His wife was listed as Mollie, probably a nickname, without the last name, marriage place, or place of birth known. He received 140 acres of land from his uncle, William Wilkinson, as recorded in Cumberland County records, on November 5, 1776. The property was located next to property of Paul Michaux, William Fleming and William Wilkinson, located in present day Powhatan County. From his father's will he received 100 acres of land, upon which his father lived at the time of his death. In 1805, a neighbor, Joseph Mayo sought permission to build a water grist mill on Mahook Creek. As the pond created, would flood some of Thomas Wilkinson's land, the matter came up in the January Circuit Court of Powhatan County, and is recorded as follows:

"January Court 1806

An Inquest taken by virtue of a writ of ad quod dannunm obtained by Joseph Mayo uon his application for erecting a water Grist Mill on Mahook Creek in this County, was this day returned , read, and ordered to be recorded, and is as follows. "Inquisition taken by virtue of a writ of ad quod dannunm from the court of Powhatan County, dated December 21st, 1805, directed to the Sheriff of the said county, whereupon, I James Clarke, sheriff of Powhatan, in Company with twelve fit persons, towit, William Clarke, John Toney, Edmond Toney, Bartlett Sizer, Lipscomb Wash, Samuel Drake, Bennett Goode jn., Edward F. Baugh, William Scott, James Bagbey, Bennett Goode sen. and Alban Gilpin, (all of whom being freeholders), did go upon the grounds where Joseph Mayo, in the said writ named, proposes to erect a water Grist Mill, and after due examination (being first charged upon oath) do say, that to the best of their skill and judgment, the said Joseph Mayo should erect a dam, six feet two inches high at the place proposed, measuring the same from the Bed of the Creek, it will overflow, two and an half acres of land belonging to Thomas Wilkerson, the damages of which we assess at twenty eight dollars ye acre, and that neither the mansion house, Offices, centiledge Garden, or orchard of any person will be overflowed, that neither Fish of passage or ordinary navigation will be obstructed nor will the health of the neighbors be annoyed by the stagnation of waters. Given under our hands and seals this 11th day of January 1806.

Whereupon it is ordered that Thomas Wilkinson the proprietor of the land which will be overflowed by the said Pond, be summoned to appear at the next Court, to shew cause, if any, he hath or may say why leave should not be granted he said Mayo to erect the said Mill, upon his paying the damages by the aforesaid Jury assessed." Powhatan County order book 8, page 395

Shortly, thereafter in 1806, Thomas Wilkinson made application for erecting a water grist mill on Mahook Creek, and permission was granted to erect a dam three feet six inches tall, and to construct the mill. In 1810, he again applied to enlarge the pond, by building the dam three feet six inches taller. Permission was granted.

Thomas Wilkinson and Jacob Michaux then entered into an agreement about joint ownership of the grist mill, located on Mahook Creek, which was recorded in Powhatan Deed Book 4 pages 139-140, as follows:

"This indenture made the 24th day of March in the year of Eighteen hundred and ten, Between Thomas Wilkinson and Polly Wilkinson his wife of the one part, and Jacob Michaux of the other part, all of Powhatan County. Witnesseth, that the said Thos Wilkinson and Polly his wife in consideration of the said Jacob Michaux's undertaking and obligation on his part to furnish a good pair of Cologn Mill stones and to be a one half of every other expences with the said Thomas Wilkinson in building a watergrist mill on the lands of the said Thomas Wilkinson & Polly his wife, on Mayhock or Mayhoock creek, which shall accrue after the date (timber excepted) and one dollar of Lawful money of the Commonwealth of Virginia, to them the said Thomas Wilkinson & Polly his wife in hand paid by the said Jacob Michaux, at and before sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged. Have granted, bargained, and sold, and by these presents do, and each of them doth grant, bargain, and sold unto the said Jacob Michaux his heirs and assigns, one half acre seat for a water Grist Mill on the creek aforesaid, (and on which mill seat leave has been granted to the said Thomas Wilkinson by the county Court of Powhatan to erect or build a water grist mill) together with a full, complete and undisturbed right and privilege in and to Thirty yards of ground all around the dam as waste, also Twenty feet of ground on each side of the canal, which may be opened leading from the dam to the mill, one acre including the mill house and Twenty feet on each side of the Race for any use or purpose beneficial to the said mill, with the right of raising the same free from damage to the said Jacob Michaux, or his heirs, should it become necessary or advantageous at any time to raise the same higher; Together with all the privileges emoluments, rents, issues, and profits, and every part and parcel thereof, for each and every year: To have and to hold one moiety of the said Mill seat and Mill with all the rights and privileges herein before mentioned or intended by these presents to be conveyed by the said Thomas Wilkinson and Polly his wife unto the said Jacob Michaux his heirs and assigns forever: And the said Thomas Wilkinson and Polly his wife, for themselves and their heirs, the said Mill seat with all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said Jacob Michaux his heirs and assigns, free from the claim or claims of them the said Thomas & Polly his wife, or either of them or either their heirs. And of all and every person and persons whatsoever, shall will and do warrant and defend, forever by these presents. In Witness whereof the parties to these presents have hereunto set their hands and seals the day and year first above written.

Thomas Wilkinson wrote his will, which was dated 15 February 1819, and follows:

"In the name of God, Amen. I Thomas Wilkinson, of the county of Powhatan, and State of Virginia being in my right and proper mind, senses, and memory, do make and ordain this my last will and testament, utterly revoking all former wills made and ordained by me.

In the first place I commend my soul to God, who gave it, and my body to the earth from whence it came, to be buried in a Christian like manner at the discretion of my Executors herein after named; and after my just debts and funeral charges are paid I dispose of my estate in the following manner, Viz:

I lend unto my beloved wife Molley Wilkinson, during her natural life, my tract of land and plantation, whereon I now live; also all my Slaves, stock of every description, household and kitchen furniture, and plantation utensils; also my half the water grist mill and its appurtenances, built in co-partnership between myself and Jacob Michaux.

Item. I give and bequeathe to my son Gallio Wilkinson, at the decease of my said wife, one half of the tract of land whereon I now live, including the house in which he now lives, being the lower half, adjoining William Walthall together with one half of moiety of the

aforesaid water grist mill and it's appendages and appurtenances, to him his heirs & assigns forever.

Item. It is my will that in consequence of my having given to my said son Gallio Wilkinson one half of my tract of land and mill aforesaid that he pay to my son Thomas W. Wilkinson the sum of One thousand dollars to him and his heirs and assigns forever.

Item It is my will that I give and bequeath to my son Nicholas Wilkinson the other half of my said tract of land, being the uppermost half lying bordering on the main River road, to him and his heirs and assigns forever.

Item. It is my will that in consequence of my giving one half of my tract of land to my said son Nicholas Wilkinson that he pay to my estate the sum of Six hundred Dollars.

Item. It is my will that my son Gallio Wilkinson on account of my having given him a greater proportion of my estate in land etc than my other children that he pay to my estate the sum of Two hundred Dollars.

Item. I give and bequeath to my daughter Polley Wilkinson at the decease of my wife my negro woman named Clarissa, to her and her heirs and assigns forever.

Item. I also give to my said daughter Polley Wilkinson now one feather bed and furniture, to her and her heirs and assigns forever.

Item. I give and bequeathe to my son Jesse Wilkinson at my wife's decease my two following named Slaves, Joe and Judith, to him my said son Jesse Wilkinson, and his heirs and assigns forever.

Item. I give and bequeath to my two grand children sons and heirs of my son George Wilkinson, by name Caleon Wilkinson and Preston Wilkinson, my Negro man Charles, to them my said two grand sons, to them and their heirs and assigns forever, in equal distribution.

Item. It is my will that at the decease of my said wife the residue of my personal estate not herein finally disposed of should be sold to th best advantage, and the proceeds thereof to be equally divided among my six following daughters Viz. Fanny Watson, Tabitha Evans, Comfort Watson, Jane Corker, Judith Cosby, and Polley Wilkinson, and my son John Wilkinson deceased, to them and their heirs and assigns forever.

And lastley, I constitute and appoint my son Gallio Wilkinson to execute and fulfill this my last will and testament: In witness whereof I have hereto set my hand and seal this Sixteenth day of February Eighteen hundred and nineteen.

The will was presented in Powhatan Court 15 July 1819 and ordered to be recorded.

As executor of the will of his father Thomas Wilkinson, Gallio had problems as a suit against him on 13 April 1832, which follows, will testify:

"To the Honorable Creed Taylor, Judge of superior court of Chancery--Richmond district. Your complainants William Watson and Fanny his wife, George Watson and Comfort his wife which said Fanny Watson and Comfort Watson are daughters of Thomas Wilkinson-late of Powhatan County and devisees named in the last will and testament of the said Thomas Wilkinson deceased. And also Jenny Corker widow of Robert Corker who is likewise a daughter of said Thomas Wilkinson and also a devisee, named in his will, Tabitha Evans, wife of Thomas Evans and Judy Cosby widow of William Cosby and Polly Wilkinson. All of whom (to wit the female plaintiffs) and daughters of the said Thomas Wilkinson and Named in his last will and testament which said Thomas Wilkinson decd shortly after making the said will. And it appears from the copy the record thereof from the clerk of the county court of Powhatan that the said will was duly proved and ordered to be recorded by the court of the aforesaid County on the 15th day of July 1819 and that Gallio Wilkinson who was appointed executor of the said last will and testament by the testator was granted a certificate for the obtaining probate of the same on the 18th day of November 1819 and he gave security as required by the court of the county aforesaid. And your complainants further state that in the sd last will and testament of Thomas Wilkinson the testator, he gave a great portion of the property of which he died possessed to his wife Molly Wilkinson for her natural life and after her decease to satisfy specific legatees as named in the said will. And they further state that the said Molly Wilkinson is since dead and they have applied to the said executor for the portion, or portions which to your complainants justly belongs to the said Thomas Wilkinson by his last will and testament (and which your complainants prays may be made a part of this bill a copy whereof is filed herewith) after several specific devises gave to your complainants Fanny Watson, Tabitha Evans, Comfort Watson, Jane Corker, Judith Cosby, and Polly Wilkinson and to John Wilkinson (a son of the testator) the proceeds of the sale of the personal estate after the death of Molly Wilkinson. And they further state that the said Molly Wilkinson is since dead the precise time of her death not now known to your complainants and that the said Gallio Wilkinson has disposed of the personal property as directed in the bill by the testator. But the amount of the sales are unknown to your complainants and the executor Gallio Wilkinson has refused to give your complainants any account either of the amount of sales by him made under the direction of the will or any account of the amount of property remaining at the death of said Molly Wilkinson and has even refused to pay any of the money received to your complainants while your complainants have reason to believe that the said Gallio Wilkinson executor has received upwards of eight hundred dollars and they further believe that he has kept the whole amount in his own hand, and applied the same to his own immediate use in direct opposition to the wish of the testator to just claims of your complainants and defiance of all right and justice. Your complainants therefore pray the interposition of the court of chancery to compell the said executor to make a dividend of the said proceeds of

the estate their divisee in the clause of will referred to. And that the said executor answer and say upon oath what the amount of property was sold and whether or not the same has he absorbed in the payment of the debts of the estate and what sum remains. And that he be compelled full and fair answer to make and to state the amount of the appraisement of the property left by the testator at his death. As well as the Amount of the sales made by him under the aforesaid clause of the will. And your complainants further states that the aforesaid named person who are your complainants (to wit) Fanny Watson, Tabitha, Comfort Watson, Jane Corker, Judith Cosby, Polly Wilkinson & John Wilkinson (which said John Wilkinson son of the testator and brother to the female plaintiffs in this bill died sometime previous to the making of the will were left residuary legatees and joint devisees in the said clause of the will and testament aforesaid of all the proceeds or money arising from the sales of the personal estate after the death of Molly Wilkinson widow of the testator. And your complainants knowing that the said John Wilkinson died sometime previous to making the said will. As appears from the will itself and your complainants therefore believe in equity and justice and of right that they ought to have equal portions of the proceeds of the personal estate which was thus omitted to be specifically devised by the previous death of the testators son John Wilkinson to the making of the said will. They therefore pray the court to compell the said executor to account with your complainants as to that portion of the said amount of money which arose from the sale of the property disposed of by the s'd executor and unaccounted for by him. And that he be compelled to account for the several portions due your complainants of the personal estate which was devised to John Wilkinson deceased if it be the opinion of the court that they are entitle to the same. And that the said executor be compelled also to answer upon oath to all the allegations of the bill and to give such a response to the same as in the opinion of the court will disclose all the facts relative to the several allegations of this bill whether specially named or not., so as to enable the court to decree as may be thought just and equitable your complainants will ever pray.

In reply Galleo Wilkinson replied to the court:

"To the Hon. Jno. B. Clopton Judge of the Circuit Superior Court of Law and Chancery for Powhatan County;

Humbly complaining sheweth unto your Honor your Orator Galleo Wilkinson in his own right and as Executor of Thomas Wilkinson decd., that early in the year 1819 his testator Thomas Wilkinson made his last will and testament and shortly afterwards died; that the will was proven, and admitted to Record by the county court of Powhatan on the 15th day of July 1819, that in said Will the testator makes many devises and bequests, and among them the following "Item. It is my will, that I give and bequeath to my son Nicholas Wilkinson the other half of my said

Tract of land, being the uppermost half lying bordering on the main River Road, to him and his heirs and assigns forever. Item. It is my will that in conveyence of my one half of my tract of land to my said son Nicholas Wilkinson that he pay to my Estate the sum of six hundred dollars." For greater certainty however your orator herewith files a copy of the said will and prays that the same may be taken as a part of this Bill- it is marked A. Your Orator avers that notwithstanding his diligent efforts to induce the said Nicholas Wilkinson to pay the said sum of six hundred dollars he never did pay any part thereof during his life, having died some 12 or 18 months since, and his children refuse to pay the same still, that he was very poor for many years and died insolvent, wherefore your Orator is advised that the said land belongs to the Estate of his testator, and aught to be divided, or sold and the proceeds divided, among the heirs of Thomas Wilkinson dec, that they are so numerous however, that a division of _____ cannot be made without _____ interest of all and each of them; that entire dest_ Thomas W. Wilkinson died without issue in the life time of the testator, and his (the testator) widow. Molley Wilkinson, has since departed this life; that the following children survived him namely: your 1. Orator, 2. Polly Wilkinson, 3. Jessee Wilkinson, 4. George Wilkinson, 5. Fanny, wife of William Watson, 6. Tabitha, wife of Thomas Evans, 7. Comfort, wife of George Watson, 8. Jane, wife of Robert Corker, 9. Judith, wife of William Causby, and 10. John Wilkinson, and 11. Nicholas Wilkinson; that Wm. Watson and Fanny his wife are still living; that Polly has since intermarried with George Harding and they are living; that Thomas Evans and Tabitha his wife, George Watson and Comfort his wife, Jessee Wilkinson, and John Wilkinson have all departed this life and their heirs respectively are wholly unknown to your Orator personally, nor does he know where they reside; that William Causby has departed this life leaving Judith Causby his widow, now living; that Robert Corker has also departed this life leaving Jane his widow who is yet living; and that Nicholas Wilkinson has also departed this life leaving a widow Polly Wilkinson and the following children now living, namely; Lisbon Wilkinson, David M. Wilkinson, Polly, now the wife of Chastain Corker, Betsey wife of Robert C. Godsey, Roverty, wife of Dinwiddie Reams, Catharine wife of Smith Thorpe, Lavinia wife of James H. Godsey, Judith Ann wife of Alfred Causby, Thomas Wilkinson, Norborne Wilkinson, George Wilkinson, and Frances Wilkinson, the last four of whom are infants; and that George Wilkinson has also departed this life leaving the following chldren now living, Deucalion Wilkinson and Preston Wilkinson.

In tender consideration of the premises, and for as much as relief can only be obtained in a court of Equity where matters of this sort are properly cognizable your Orator prays _____ William Watson and Fanny his wife formerly Fanny Wilkinson, Judith Cosby widow of William Causby, former Judith Wilkinson Jenny Corker widow of Robert Corker, decd, formerly Jinny or Jane Wilkinson, George Harding and Polly his wife formerly Polly Wilkinson, Deucalion Wilkinson and Preston Wilkinson only children of George Wilkinson decd, Lilborn Wilkinson, David M.

Wilkinson, Chastain Corker, and Polly his wife, Robert C. Godsey and Betsey his wife, Dinwiddie Reams and Roverty his wife, Smith Thorpe and Catharine his wife, James H. Godsey and Lavinia his wife, Alfred Causby and Judith Ann his wife, Thomas Wilkinson, Norborne Wilkinson, George Wilkinson, and Frances Wilkinson, which said Lisbon, David M. Polly, Betsey, Roverty, Catharine, Lavinia, Judith Ann, Thomas Norborn, George and Francis are children of Nicholas Wilkinson decd., the heirs of Thomas Evans and Tabitha his wife (formerly Tabitha Wilkinson) both decd.-unknown to your Orator, the heirs of George Watson and Comfort his wife (formerly Comfort Wilkinson) both decd- unknown to your Orator; and the heirs of Jessee Wilkinson and of John Wilkinson both decd., also unknown to your Orator and Polly Wilkinson, widow of Nicholas Wilkinson decd., be made defendants hereto, and compelled to answer the several allegations of this Bill on oath-the adults in proper person and the infants by Guardians, ad litem specially appointed to defend them in this suit; that your Honor will allow your Orator all necessary and proper processes for conducting this his suit; and finally that your Honor will direct a Sale of the land herein mentioned, or make such other decress as Justice and rights of the parties may require, and as in duty bound he will ever pray &.

H. S. Hopkins for Complainant"

The suit lasted for a long time, some of which was due to the fact that the whereabouts of some of the parties to the suit had moved to other parts of Virginia and into Kentucky. The following advertisement was printed in the March 23rd, 1840 issue of the Richmond Enquirer:

"In Chancery-Virginia-In Powhatan Circuit Court, November the 3th, 1839:

Wilkinson, Chastain Corker and Polly his wife, Rob. C. Godsey and Betsey his wife, Dinwiddie Reams and Roverty his wife, Smith Thorp and Catharine his wife, James H. Godsey and Lavinia his wife, Alfred Causly and Judith Ann his wife, Thomas wilkinson, Norborne Wilkinson, Geo. Wilkinson and Francis Wilkinson, the heirs and distributees of Geo. Watson and Comfort his wife, the heirs and distributees of Jesse Wilkinson, and the heirs and distributees of John Wilkinson.

The defendants, Lisbon Wilkinson, the heirs of Tho. Evans and wife, the heirs of Geo. Watson, and wife, the heirs of Jesse Wilkinson, and the heirs of John Wilkinson, not having entered their appearance and given security according to the Act of Assembly and the rules of this court, and it appearing to the satisfaction of the court that they are not inhabitants of this commonwealth, on the motion of the plaintiff by his attorney, it is ordered, that the said defendants do appear here on the first day of the next term, and answer the bill of the plaintiff, and give security for performing such decree as the court may make herein; and that a copy of this order be forthwith inserted in some newspaper published in the city of Richmond for two months successively, and that another copy be posted at the front door of the Courthouse of the county.

In August 1860 the following advertisement was placed in the RICHMOND WHIG:

"TO THE HEIRS OF THOMAS EVANS AND WIFE, of JESSIE WILKINSON and of JOHN WILKINSON who were Legatees of Thomas Wilkinson, dec'd, formerly of Powhatan county, Va--You are hereby notified that there is a sum of money in my hands to which you are entitled arising from the sale of a tract of land in Powhatan County, formerly owned by Thomas Wilkinson, deceased, and unless you make yourselves known to the Circuit Court of said county at the next term thereof, which commences on the 27th day of Oct next, the Court will decree the same to the other parties who are known to have an Interest in said sale.

Contact was made with the heirs of Comfort Wilkinson Watson and her husband George Watson. The following letter was submitted to the court in May 1868:

"This day Benja Watson made oath before the undersigned police Judge of Paducah and one of the Justices of the peace in _____ McCracken County Ky that he is one of the children & heirs at law of George Watson & Comfort Watson decd and that they had fourteen children. Alscev & Malvina two of the children died before either his Father or Mother each intestate & without children. Jane who married Jno G. Godsey died before either his Father or Mother but left one child named Rossalle who is living & is now the wife of Christian Surk. Agnes Watson another one fo the children died before either his Father or Mother & she left an only child named Eveline Watson still living in this County- Polley another one of the affiants sisters, died intestate and childless after the death of her Father & Mother and Joicey another sister died intestate & childless, also since their death. Anne another of affiants sisters died after the death of her Father & Mother but made a will which he supposes gives to Eveline Watson the said Annes interest in her Father & Mothers estate. Sally is another of affiants sisters the wife Samuel Watson is another. C. Josiah Watson is of Lewis Francis. Enoch Watson was another and he believes is dead but left another. Keziah was another sister is dead but left children. children. Elizabeth Watson still living in Virginia and your affiant is the other

making the 14 children. Given under my hand this 17th day of January 1844.

GALLEO WILKINSON

Galleo Wilkinson was born c1766 and died c1857 in Powhatan County, Virginia. He received, from his father's will, half of his land, which amounted to 124½ acres. He was a slaveholder as of 1797 and in the period of 1826-29 he owned 5 slaves. On 18 December 1788 he married Sarah "Sally" "Sallie" Wilkinson, his cousin, the daughter of James Wilkinson (brother of Galleo's father).

His will, which follows, was written on the 9th day of October 1844 and recorded in Powhatan Will Book 15 page 97:

"In the Name of God, Amen! I Gallio Wilkinson of the County of Powhatan, State of Virginia being sick and weak in body but of sound mind and disposing memory (for which I thank God) and calling to mind the uncertainty of human life and being desirous to dispose of all such Worldly estate as it has pleased God to bless me with, I give and bequeath the same in manner & form following that is to viz,

I desire that all the perishable part of my estate or as much as may be necessary be sold after my decease to pay my just debts and funeral expenses: Should the perishable part of my estate prove insufficient, then I desire my executor hereafter mentioned to sell so much of my personal estate as may be necessary to pay and satisfy such of my just debts as may remain unpaid out of the perishable part of my estate.

After the payment of my just debts & funeral expenses I give to my wife Sally all of my estate both real and personal for and during her natural life and after her decease I desire that the whole of my estate both real and personal shall be sold and the monies arising therefrom to be equally divided among my children in the following manner.

I give to each of my children Daniel Wilkinson, Fleming Wilkinson, Royall Wilkinson, James P. Wilkinson, William H. Wilkinson & Richard Wilkinson, and Permelia Wilkinson one minth part of the monies arising from the sale of the whole of my estate both real and personal

To secure one Ninth part of the Moneys arising from the sale of my estate both real & personal to Rebecca Wilkinson wife of David M. Wilkinson & her children I give the same in To wit to my son Daniel Wilkinson for the use & enjoyment of them my daughter Rebecca and children and after the deceases of my daughter Rebecca Wilkinson wife of David M. Wilkinson I give the same to her children and their heirs forever.

To secure one Ninth part of the Monies arising from the sale of the whole of my estate real and personal to my daughter Sally S. Wilkinson wife of Preston Wilkinson & her children I give the same to my son Daniel Wilkinson in Trust for their use and benefit and after the decease of my daughter Sally S. Wilkinson (wife of Preston Wilkinson I give the same to her children and their heirs forever.

And lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my son Daniel Wilkinson Executor of this my last Will & Testament hereby revoking all other or former Wills or Testaments by me heretofore made. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 9th day of October 1844.

Signed Sealed Published and declared Gallio Wilkinson (seal) as and for the last Will & Testament of the above named Gallio Wilkinson in the presence of us Jacob Michaux Sen Tachaner Michaux (Seals) Alexander Swann"

The will was presented to Powhatan Court 2nd day of March 1857 and recorded. After Daniel Wilkinson declined to be the administrator of the estate Tachaner Michaux was appointed administrator.

WILLIAM H. WILKINSON

William H. Wilkinson was born in Powhatan County, Virginia. He died 5 July, 1873 in the same County. He secured a marriage license, on January 14, 1839 in Powhatan County, and married Mary Elizabeth Cosby. He was a farmer all of his life. After the death of his father, he purchased several tracts of land before buying the plantation of 200 acres, where he lived until the time of his death. While not recorded on Powhatan County records, his great granddaughter, Geneva Clarke Guss, remembered the name, fondly, of the plantation, as being the "Milky Way Plantation". In the post Civil War era, times were hard for William just as they were for most in the South. He took advantage of Virginia law by declaring his property a homestead, which is recorded in Powhatan County court, which follows:

"Know all men by these presents- That I, William H. Wilkinson of the County of Powhatan, State of Virginia, do hereby declare my intention to claim as a homestead pursuant to the provisions of the Act of Assembly of Virginia approved the 27th day of June 1870, and in pursuance of the XI Article of the Constitution of the State of Virginia; the property real & personal hereinafter mentioned and described Viz.

A certain tract of land in Powhatan County, on which I now reside, containing 200 acres, adjoining the lands of Matilda Forsee, Rob Adkins, and others- Valued at \$6 per acre- \$1200.

Two Mules Valued at \$75. each	150.
Two Cows & 1 heifer Do	50.
One Wagon	10.
3 Plows	06.
l Bureau	10.
3/4 of Crop of Tobacco	200.
Total	1626.

All of which property real and personal, I hereby declare my intention to hold as a homestead subject to all the provisions, of the Constitution and laws of Virginia.

In Witness whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 23rd day of February 1871.

Wm. H. Wilkinson (seal)"

By the time of his death land was almost without value, and there was nothing left for his heirs, except the dower for the widow. He died without leaving a will and the property was sold by commissioners appointed by the County as follows:

"In obedience to an order made in this cause at the Sept Term 1877 we proceeded to advertise the land therein directed to be sold at Powhatan Court House at Public Auction as directed by the decree. At the first and second offering we were unable to make a sale. At the last offering on the 1st April 1878, it was knocked out to Wm. S. Archer at the price of \$290. There are 170 acres of land the reversion in 30 acres the Widow's Dower. The land is assessed at \$5.00 per acre. The Notices were duly posted and the sale well attended.

We required \$70 Cash which was paid and for the balance bonds taken at 1, 2, & 3 years with Interest from date. We respectfully recommend that the sale be Confirmed.

Mary Elizabeth Cosby Wilkinson moved to Richmond where she lived at 319 S. Cherry Street and 809 China Street (both on Oregon Hill) before dying July 7, 1893 in Richmond, Virginia. She is buried in nearby Hollywood Cemetery in Richmond. Sons Andrew Jackson, Beverly Randolph, and Charles Wilkinson all served with the Confederate army in the War of Secession.

William H. Wilkinson and Mary Elizabeth Cosby Wilkinson were the parents of the following children:

He married, on 16 July 1863 in Chesterfield County, Mary Sue Jones, the daughter of William Jones and Mary Susan _____, who was born on 19 September 1852 and died 21 March 1914 in Richmond, Virginia. Both are buried in Riverview Cemetery, Richmond, Virginia. Andrew was 1st Sgt. in Company G of the 59th Virginia Regiment in the War of Secession. After the War he moved to Richmond, where he worked as a carpenter, and night watchman.

BEVERLY RANDOLPH WILKINSON #13183

Beverly's grandchildren remember him as a real gentleman, and the man they called "Pappy". He liked to be well dressed, especially in his Confederate uniform. He was well liked and respected and thought of as a real gentleman. In his last years, he slept on a bread box, on the sidewalk near his store.

Beverly R. Wilkinson was an infantry private in the War of Secession (the Civil War) in Company K, 59 Virginia Regt., of the Confederate States of America. He enlisted on 20 May 1862 and was mustered out of service in January and February of 1865. Family information states that he left service at Appomattox C. H. in 1865. While in service, he suffered some flesh wounds. Later in life he had a great deal of suffering due to a double hernia.

"Callie", when a young child of 12, fell out of a cherry tree and broke her leg, which was later amputated. Afterwards, she used a crutch to assist herself in getting around, and was little incapacitated by her disability.

L. W. REAMS #13356

Lilburn Washington Reams, in April 1864, borrowed a gun and joined the Confederate Army to guard the railroad bridge across the Appomattox River near his home, to prevent its destruction by the Federals. He entered the regular forces as soon as he reached the age of eighteen. He was on the James River below Richmond when General Lee began evacuation of the city. He was a corporal in Captain Tabb's Co., Co. I, First Regt., Farinholt's Virginia Reserves. He owned a large farm in Powhatan Co., Virginia. He was postmaster at Lilburn Post Office, VA. He was a deacon in Red Lane Baptist Church.

Made out this 7th day March 1937. Lilburn Reams born in Powhatan Co. Va July 13, 1846. L. W. Reams' father Dinwiddie Reams was born in Chesterfield Co. Va. Dinwiddie's father was born in Chesterfield Co. Va. His name was Erasmus Reams. L. W. Reams' mother was Roberta Wilkinson. Her father was Nicholas Wilkinson of Powhatan Co. Her mother was a Miss Stoaks.

I do not remember the name of my great grandfather, but he lived near Michaux Ferry in Fowhatan on the James River and I think he was Somewhat wealthy. Judge Dabny told me that he in Searching the records of Powhatan County found that a Wilkinson, one of my ancestors from England took up or had granted to him all lands from above Michaux Ferry in Powhatan to Dreweys Bluff below Manchester. I suppose that the whole line of Wilkinson of our Wilkinson Kin could be traced in the records of Powhatan Co.

You may be able to guess at what you can not read of this but when I feel better I can give you one better written and more complete if you wish.

My mother inherited some property from her Grandfather Wilkinson, and some

from her Uncle Samuel Stoaks. I supposed that my Grand Mother Wilkinson's family were fine people, so far as I have learned. I suppose that two Reamses (I suppose they were brothers) came from England and one settled in Dinwiddie Co., VA and one in Chesterfield, VA. There are more Reamses in Dinwiddie than any other place. I do not know from which County we sprang from. My grandfather Reams had two Bro. Bartlet and John. John was a Baptist Preacher and went to Kentucky and moved from there to Chicago. I know of no Reams that gained any great prominence, nor of any that were charged with crime. Some of my Grandfather Reams offspring have been highly educated and some now hold somewhat high offices in Va. I have heard of one Reams at least that was quite wealthy. I can give many names of people living and that I have known that I would not be ashamed of. But it does not matter so much as to our ______ as to what we are. I realize that a poore statement I might do better but I am not feeling altogether well.

VIOLA ROSABELLE REAMS 133565

Dr. Richard Henry Eanes was baptized at St. Johns Church by Rev. William Burton. He was a graduate of the Medical College of Virginia, Richmond, Virginia on 30 May 1911. He entered the Medical Corps of the U. s. Army in 1917 and served in Illinois, Colorado, Georgia, Massachusetts, Maryland, Texas, D. C., also France, Germany, Philippine Islands and China. He was promoted Captain 17 August 1917, Major 31 May 1929, Lieutenant Colonel 31 May 1937 and Colonel on 11 July 1946. He was raised to Master Mason at Strange Creek Lodge 130, Strange Creek, West Virginia 7 February 1914. He had an extensive cattle farm in Loudoun Co., Virignia. He received Hon. LLD at the Medical College of Virginia 2 June 1953.

Viola Rosabelle Reams Eanes attended Boston University. She studied music at Valparaiso University, Indiana, and Fine Arts at Corcoran School of Art, Washington, D. C. She spent a number of years compiling material for Reams and Wilkinson genealogies.

WILLIE D. WILKINSON 133B112

"The first Wilkinson in Cumberland County was Deucalion Wilkinson who, in 1855, left the coal mining business in Midlothian and purchased Trenton Mills. At Trenton the Wilkinsons operated the mill, a store, post office and later a school.

Deucalion and his wife, Jane Hunter Bass, had four children. Two were daughters, Rosa who married Ellis Putney and Mary who married Clifford Bondurant. The two sons were Richard and George Thomas.

Richard, the older, was in partnership with his father. He never married and died within a few weeks of his father in 1860.

George T. married Sarah and operated Trenton Mills, serving as postmaster for many years. George had two sons. Son Hunter ran the mill and later sold the mill

property.

Son Willie Deucalion received a degree in Law from the University of Richmond but opted to return to Trenton instead of practicing law. Willie married Mary Hanes, daughter of Judge J. Garland Hanes of Buckingham. She was educated at the State Normal School (later Longwood College). Willie and Mary together opearted a school which Mary continued after Willie's early death in 1891. Willie and Mary had four children, a daughter and three sons. The daughter, Mary Frances, married J. Y. Clark and they moved to Missouri. The sons were George G. who married Maude Stuart, Hunter B. who married Mae Edens, and Willie D. who married Annie Carter Adams. George moved to Cumberland Court House and became a partner in Flippen's Store. Hunter farmed at Trenton, then worked for the Postal Service in West Point. Willie, who was born after his father's death, farmed at Trenton, then later at Sommerset, his wife's home. Willie and Annie had two children. Their daughter, Mary Hanes (Kitty) married Russell Garnett and had one son, William Russell, who married Mary Ann Thompson. Their son, Harry Blackwell (H. B.). married Ruby Blanton and had one daughter, Sarah Adams, who married Arthur Powers. by Sarah W. Powers", A HISTORY OF CUMBERLAND COUNTY.

WILLIAM DUCALION WILKINSON #13B22

"Would two young women who met as students at the Farmville Female Institute in the nineteenth century have an inkling that years later their paths would cross again and that the daughter of one would marry the son of the other? Yet, it happened!

Amy Elizabeth Barber married David Stuart in 1887. On a farm in upper Cumberland County they reared a family, one of whom was Maude Blamires Stuart, born December 2, 1894

Mary Hanes married William Ducalion Wilkinson in 1882. They made their home at "Trenton" in lower Cumberland County. Of that union, George Garland Wilkinson was born on November 17, 1886.

On October 7, 1913, Maude Stuart and George Wilkinson were married in Center Presbyterian Church in Cumberland Courthouse. They settled into village life and reared a family of three daughters: Mary Stuart, Elizabeth Hanes and Nellie Garland.

My father's life centered around three things: his family, Payne Memorial Methodist Church and his partnership in O. G. Flippen and Co. - one of the village general stores. My mother spent her unending energies rearing us to love life and live it fully with respect for true values. She enjoyed her home and made it a secure and comfortable place for her family. She was active in church life and taught the nursery and beginners' class at Payne Memorial for 25 years.

Our home was a warm, happy place where discipline was not spared when necessary. Visitors frequented our table where political, religious or local matters were discussed. These discussions often extended into the living room before an open fire or onto the porch in warm weather. It was a stimulating environment and one that prepared us to make decisions as we left the security of that home. Mary Stuart left home to attend Blackstone College and then to work in Washington, D. C., for the federal government where she met and married Ernest Edward Clulow. They had two children: Cornelia Jean and George Edward. She is now living in Texas with her husband Henry Stallings.

After attending Longwood College, Nellie Garland moved to Massachusetts to learn the clothes-buying trade. Her health made it necessary to return to Cumberland where she died in 1946.

Elizabeth Hanes, "Bitsy", attended Duke University to become the nurse she had dreamed about for years. At Duke she met Everett Tompkins. They married and after six years in Massachusetts came back to Virginia to live in Chesterfield County where they have been for 35 years. Barry & Everett, Jr., are their two sons.

In 1966, George Garland Wilkinson died after a life dedicated to interest and concern for Cumberland and its people.

Maude Stuart Wilkinson remained in Cumberland for a few years and then sold the home she had lived in for most of her life since she was eleven years old and moved to Richmond. After eight years of apartment living, she now lives in a private home with a family who encourages her reminiscing about her long and usefullife in Cumberland.

WILLIAM WILKINSON #2

While William Wilkinson may not have been the first of the Wilkinson family to purchase land in the Goochland-Powhatan area, the following is the earliest deed of record recorded, and was in the area where some of the Wilkinson family lived for the next 150 years:

"This Indenture made this sixteenth day of May in the Fifth year of the reign of our Lord George the Second by The Grace of God of Great Brittain, France and Ireland King Defender of the faith. Between Agnes Noland of the County of Goochland of the one part and William Wilkisson of the County of Goochland, Carpenter of the other part witnesseth that the said Agnes Noland for and in consideration of the sum of twenty five pounds Sterling money to her by the said William Wilkisson at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents in hand paid the receipt thereof the said Agnes Noland doth hereby acknowledge and the said William Wilkisson his heirs Exs. and Adms. & every one of them of and from the said sum and every part and parcel thereof doth exonerate and by these presents for ever discharge Hath given granted bargained sold confirmed and released by these presents doth give grant bargain sell confirm and release to the said William Wilkisson his heirs and assigns for ever all that Messuage and divided tract or parcell of land containing three hundred and fifty Acres be the same more or less lying and being in the County of Goochland on the Southside of James River on Mahook Creek Bounded as followeth to wit Beginning at a Corner White Oak being Bolling Corner thence on his line South West one hundred and forty chains to a White Oak Corner standing in a Branch of Mahook Creek thence leaving Bolling line South eight degrees East sixty Chains to a corner Black Oak thence

South East eighty chains to a corner White Oak thence North Eighty degrees West sixty chains to a corner pine thence North East One hundred and forty chains to a Corner Gum in Michaux _____ his line thence on his line North West eighty Chains to the place began at it being a tract Granted by his Majesty to the said Agnes Noland by Letters Pattents bearing date at Williamsburg the sixth day of May one thousand seven hundred and thirty two in the fifth year of his Reighn which said messuage and divided tract or parcel of land is now in the possession of the said William Wilkisson together with their and every of their appurtainances and every part and parcel thereof and his reversion and reversions remainder and remainders rent issues, profits thereof and every part and parcel thereof To have and to hold the premises aforesaid with the appurtainances to the said William Wilkisson his heirs and assigns for ever to His only proper use and behoof of him the said William Wilkisson his heirs and assigns for ever and for no other intent or use of purpose whatsoever and the said Agnes Noland for her self her heirs Executors and Adms. doth covenant promise and grant to and with the said William Vilkisson his heirs and assigns in manner following that the said Agnes Noland and her heirs the premises aforesaid with the appurtainancs to the said William Wilkisson his heirs and assigns against the said Agnes Noland her heirs Executors administrators and assigns and every of them and all other persons lawfully claiming from by or under her them or any of them will warrant and by these presents for every defend In Witness whereof the parties to these presents have hereby interchangeably have sett their hands and seals this day and year above written.

Know ye that I the said William Wilkison for Divers good Causes and Valuable Consideration me hereunto moving have given and granted and by these presents do give grant and confirm unto my Kinsman John Wilkison of the County and Province aforesaid, one certain Tract or Parcel of Land containing two hundred acres lying in the County aforesaid and bounded thus be it more or less Vizt. to be Laid off on the South side of Mehook Creek and on the Lower part joyning to Jacob Michaux Line and Cornering on Francis James's line at a Pine and Runing a Straight Line to William Wilkisons Line on Mehook to a corner Tree already marked by Nicholas Wilkison and his Son John Wilkison by agreement. To have and to hold the said Tract of Land as I the sd William Wilkison have given granted & confirmed to my Kinsman John Wilkison his Heirs Executors Adminrs. or assigns from hence-

forth at his and their Wills and Pleasures as of their own Proper Land truly Peaceable and quietly without any manner of Lett Trouble or Denial of me the said William Wilkison or any other Person or Persons whatsoever of all which Premises I the sd Willm Wilkison have put the said John Wilkison in Peaceable Possession by Virtue hereof. In Witness whereof I the sd Willm Wilkison have hereunto set my hand and Seal this twenty second day of May Anno Dom: One thousand seven hundred and fifty nine. Sealed Deliver'd in the Presence of. his Francis Macerorn Vm. A Wilkerson John +++ Johnson mark

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THE COSBY FAMILY

He married Isabel, daughter and heiress of Ralph Pare, Esq., of Great Leake, Nottinghamshire, (by Isabel, his wife, daughter and heiress of John Blake of Hermaston) and a son and heir, John Cosbie.

JOHN COSBIE

John Cosbie married Mable, daughter of Agard of Foston, in Nottinghamshire, and had two sons, Namely:

 Richard Cosbie of Great Leake, whose only daughter and heiress, Bridget Cosby, became the wife of William Towers, gentleman of Tunnecke)
 Francis Cosbie.

FRANCIS COSBIE

Francis Cosbie was born in 1510 and died in 1580, the patriarch of the family in Ireland, a man famed for personal courage as well as for civil and military talents. When young, he served in the wars of King Henry VIII in England.

His abandonment of his native soil arose from the downfall of the Frotector Somerset whose daughter, Mary, widow of Sir Henry Peyton, Knt., he married. After the disgrace and death of that nobleman, his immediate connections were excluded from and deprived of all hope or preferment. He went to the low country. Here, in the land of his adoption, he soon found the opportunity of establishing a reputation which he had despaired of effecting in the land of his birth.

He, General Cosbie, became an active defender of the Pale against the inroads of the Irish; his vigilance, zeal, and success attracting the attention of the government, he was appointed by Queen Mary, under her Majesty's sign manual, dated February 14, 1558, General of the Kern, a position of great trust and importance in those times. In 1559 he represented the borough of Thomaston in Parliament, when he was constituted by Elizabeth, sheriff of the County of Kildare, being dominated in his patent, dated 24th of January in the first year of her Majesty's reign "of Evan," now "Munster Evan," which place he held under an old grant from the crown and was invested at the same time with the extraordinary and unenviable privilege of exercising martial law under his own authority solely, and of dealing out such punishments, even the most penal, as he should deem meet.

Francis Cosbie and Mary Seymour, daughter of Edward Seymour, Duke of Somerset, and Sir Henry Peyton's widow, had three sons, viz:

- 1. Henry, who died in England.
- 2. Alexander, inheritor of the estates.

3. Arnold, who served under Robert Dudley, Earl of Leicester with great reputation, in low countries, and in 1586, with celebrated Sir Philip Sidney was at the battle of Zutpgen, (1586) where Sir Philip received his mortal wounds. Capt. Arnold Cosbie remained after the Earl of Leicester's return to England and obtained from Queen Elizabeth, in consideration of his good services, a pension of three shillings per day on the Irish Establishment until he should be otherwise provided fr in the Army of that Kingdom. Notwithstanding this apparent protection of the court, he suffered in two years after, the utmost penalty of the law, for killing the Lord Bourke, of Castle Connell, in a duel on Finchley Common, the Queen preemptorily refusing to extend to him her royal mercy.

After the death of Mary 18 January 1570 he married Elizabeth Palmer in 1575. Their only child was:

4. Catherine, or Tose, married to Archibald More, Esq., but died childless.

The following account of Francis Cosbie is taken from the English Dictionary of National Biography. It will be observed that in this article no mention is made of his having any other wife than Elizabeth Palmer, who is given as the mother of all his children.

"Cosby, Francis, (born 1510, died 1580) Irish General settled in Ireland in Henry VIII's reign in 1548. Bellingham, the lord deputy, acknowledged the resource and courage displayed by Cosby in attacking the marauders who infested the boundaries of the English Pale, and ten years later, Sussex was an enthusiastic in his commendation. In 1558 Cosby was appointed General of the Kern and in 1562 was granted the suppressed Abbey of Stradbally in Queen's County. In 1565 he became Governor of Maryborough and Seneschal of Queen's County. He helped to massacre, although the amount of his responsibility being placed upon him is doubtful, Rory of the O'Moores, at Mullah, near Atby, in 1567, who had been summoned to the fortress on avowedly peaceful business. Cosby was not successful in suppressing disorder in Queen's County. Rory Oge O'Moore was continually threatening him and took his eldest son prisoner in 1566. The murder of Rory in the following year relieved Cosby of his chief difficulty, but the outbreak of the Desmond Rebellion in 1580 caused him new anxiety and he was killed by the rebels at the battle of

Glenmalure, the 25th of August 1580. He married Elizabeth Palmer by whom he had three sons: Alexander, Henry, and Arnold, and one daughter. Alexander succeeded to the estates, received additional grants in Queen's County, and was with his son, Francis, killed at the battle of Stradbally Bridge. The estates subsequently passed to Richard, another son of Alexander, whose descendants still possess them. Arnold, Francis Cosby's second son, served under the Earl of Leicester in the Low Countries."

O'Hare in his lrish Pedigrees, states: "After Leix had been formed into a country, the following seven families were the chief English settlers during the reign of Queen Mary and Queen Elizabeth, and were called the seven tribes; namely, Cosby, Barrington, Bowen, Rush, Harpole, Hetherington, and Hovendon."

Francis Cosby, (Cosby Ancestory) as stated above eventually fell at the Battle of Glenmalure at the head of the Kern which he valiantly led to the charge, although then seventy years of age.

ALEXANDER COSBY

Francis was succeeded by his second son, Alexander Cosby, Esq., of Stradbally Abbey, who seems to have been engaged during the whole of his life time in warfare with the O'Moores. Camden, in his life of Elizabeth, recounts his being once taken by treachery, during a conference with Rory Oge, near Leighlin, and that he was rescued when bound to a tree by Harpole, but not before he had received a wound from a knife inflicted by Rory. He married Dorcas, daughter of William Sidney, Esq., of Oxford in Kent (grandnephew of William Sidney, Lord of Cranleigh) by whom he had fifteen children. This lady, who had been one of the maids of honor to Queen Elizabeth and who was second cousin to Sir H. Sidney, Lord Lieutenant of Ireland, obtained through her influential connections at court, grants in (Leix) so extensive that at that period, the family were the territorial Lords of more than a moiety of Queen's County. The feud with the O'Moores enduring, however, in all its lawless violence, came at length to issue in 1596, and proved fatal to Cosby and his eldest son, Francis. In that year Anthony O'Moore, the chief of the insurgent clans bearing his name, sent to demand a passage over Stradbally Bridge, but the requisition being deemed by Cosby as a challenge, was promptly and peremptorily denied and preparations were commenced, without loss of time, to defend the pass should the enemy attempt to force it. The attempt being made by O'Moore on the 19th day of May, the Lord of Stradbally, Alexander, at the head of his Kern accompanied by his son and heir, Francis, who had married about a year previously (Ellen), daughter of Thomas Harpole, Esq., of Thrule and had borne him a son, William, but nine weeks before, met his foe in deadly combat on the bridge while the conflict was witnessed from a window in the Abbey by Dorcas Sidney Cosby, and her daughter-in-law, Ellen Harpole

Cosby. For some time the valor of the Cosbys was irresistable and the fortune of the day appeared to be theirs. Alexander, however, pursuing his advantage with extraordinary impetuosity received a wound which proved at once mortal and instantly turned the tide of the battle. The kern with melancholy howling for the fate of their leader began to give away, when Francis Cosby fearing that he should be entirely abandoned leaped over the bridge in the hope of making good his retreat to the Abbey, but the instant that he cleared the battlements he was mortally wounded and fell dead into the river. Those scenes, one would suppose, would have appalled the new widowed ladies who witnessed them, yet it is recorded that Ellen Harpole Cosby with coolest presence of mind cautioned her mother-iin-law to retain her recollection of how the elder Cosby fell before his son, Francis, her husband, who had by thus inheriting the estates, even for a few minutes, entitles her to her thirds or dowry. It is not known how the ladies eventually escaped, but the infant, William Cosby, was carried off and preserved by his nurse. O'Moore pursuing his victory took possession of the Abbey, and after sacking committed it to flames, when many of the patents and other valuable documents of the family were destroyed in the conflagration.

Alexander Cosby and Dorcas Sidney Cosby had the following children:

1. Francis born January 1, 1571, was baptised with much ceremony in St. Patricks Church, Dublin, the Lord Deputy standing God-Father. He was a Captain of the Kern and fell, as already stated, immediately after his father at the Battle of Stradbally Bridge, May 19, 1596, leaving his wife (Ellen Harpole, who wedded, second time, Sir Thomas Loftus of Killian in King's County), an infant child, William, born 1596, who succeeded him.

2. Richard, successor to his nephew.

3. Charles, born September 12, 1585, married 1623 Mary Loftus, sister of the above Sir Thomas Loftus, children of Sir Adam, D. D.

4. Arnold, born 1591, settled in Caven County and planted a branch of the family there.

5. Mabel, born August 12, 1593, married George Harpole, Esq., of Thrule, (Brother of Ellen Cosby), in Queen's County and died in 1632 leaving issue.

6. Rose, born in the Queen's House at Oxford in Kent, November 1582, married Richard, Lord Howth.

The melancholy catastrophe of Alexander Cosby and son appears to have created a strong public opinion at the time and the Queen, taking the state of the family into her gracious consideration, was pleased to grant by letter-patent, in which the circumstances of the Battle of the Bridge are recited, to Dorcas Sidney and Ellen Harpole, the wardship of the infant, William, besides conferring upon them pension in consideration of the many essential services rendered by their husbands to the Crown. Alexander Cosby was succeeded, although for only a few minutes, by his eldest son, Francis Cosby, Esq., of Stradbally Abbey, who died young when the estates reverted to his uncle Richard Cosby, Exq., who thus became of "Stradbally Abbey," and in order to repair the

losses occasioned by the loss of the family records, at the time of the burning of the Abbey obtained under commission of King James I, for the remedy of defective titles, a new title of the same import of the old one, which is still extant. This Richard, who was Captain of the Kern and esteemed of great martial courage and ability, eagerly solicitous, on becoming chief of his line to avenge the death of his father and brother, dared the O'Moores to a pitched battle and the challenge being accepted, the contending clans met once more (A. D. 1606) in Glyn of Aggnabily under the Rock of Duannamace, when a most bloody conflict ensued terminating in the triumph of Cosby, and the total defeat of his foes, who were never afterwards able to make head against him. Captain Cosby himself displayed great personal boldness and received so many dangerous wounds in the action that he could not be moved from the field to Stradbally but was carried to Dysert House, then the seat of Sir Robert Pigot, where he remained a considerable time before he was so far recovered to be enabled to return home. During his confinement, Elizabeth, one of the daughters of his hospitable host attended him with so much kindness and care that he subsequently solicited her hand and she became his wife soon after his reestablishment at Stradbally. This union, although in every respect unexceptional, proved to be in a high degree prejudicial to the fortunes of the family, for his mother, Lady Dorcas Sidney, who entertained a deep rooted antipathy to the Pigots, taking offense at the alliance immediately went over to England, where she married a second husband, Sir Thomas Zouche and left all her estates in Ireland, excepting Fimahee to the Zouches, while she leased that for a long time to Sir Thomas Loftus, who became in 1615 the second husband of her daughter-in-law, Ellen (widow of Francis Cosby).

Dorcas Cosby evidently had a very high opinion of her own family, as in all grants of land made by her, as well as in her private writings she used the name of Sidney instead of Cosby. Among the Sidney family papers is a letter from the Earl of Pembroke (Dudley 3rd) to his uncle Robert, Earl of Leicester, promising to support Dorcas in her differences with Sir Edward Zouche, her husband's son and heir, and assuring her that Sir Edward would not wrong her. Sir Thomas Zouche died in 1625, and was survived by his wife. Among the fifteen children of Dorcas Sidney by her first husband, Alexander Cosby, were two sons named John, one born in 1574 and one born in 1589. Both died young. John Cosby, the son of Charles, the emigrant was probably named after the two uncles.

CHARLES COSBY

Charles Cosby, the founder of the family in Virginia, was born September 12, 1585 at Stradbally. He married Mary Loftus. Her grandfather, Edward Loftus of Swinehead, County York, England, settled in Ireland in the 16th century and was one of those who obtained from Queen Elizabeth and King James extensive grants of forfeited land. He had two sons, the elder Robert, was the ancestor of the Viscount Loftus of Ely. The second son, Adam (born 1534, died April 5, 1605) was D. D. of Trinity College, Cambridge and Chaplain to Queen Elizabeth. He was made Archbishop of Armagh (Primate of Ireland) in 1651 and Lord Chancellor of Ireland in 1573. He was knighted 1603 and had power to confer Knighthood. He was instrumental in establishing the University of Dublin and was its first Provost. He married Jane Purdom, daughter of Adam Purdom, by whom he had twenty children, and died April 5, 1605. His daughter, Anne Loftus, married Sir Henry Colley, knighted 1576 and was ancestress of the First Duke of Wellington. The male line of this Adam became extinct in 1785 but is represented in the female line by Marquis of Ely, whose fourth son, Sir Thomas Loftus, brother of Mary Loftus Cosby, married Ellen, daughter of Robert Harpole of Thrule, and widow of Francis Cosby II, son of Alexander Cosby I. Charles Cosby's wife was sister of this Sir Thomas and Anne Colley. She died November 23, 1623. Charles Cosby was doubtless induced to settle in Virginia through his connections with the Zouches who had extensive grants of land in that colony. He is said to have settled in York or Warwick in 1628.

JOHN COSBY

John Cosby, son of Charles and Mary Loftus Cosby, was a planter in York County, Virginia. He was born in England 1623 and died in York County in the early part of 1696, age seventy-three years. His will dated September 4, 1695 having been proven in the York County Court on March 24, 1696. He owned extensive tracts of land in York, King & Queen, and New Kent Counties. On November 30, 1657 his young daughter Mary accidentally set fire to her clothes and burned to death. She was probably the daughter of his first wife, as Sarah Cosby, his widow, survived until 1740, which precludes the possibility of her having a child born to her prior to 1657. The records of the court of York County show that on November 12, 1678, John Cosby, John Sanders, and Argall Blackston were appointed Surveyors of Highways for York parish. In records of Land Grants Patents of Virginia (Vol. 4, p. 72) appears an entry of 700 acres of land in New Kent County, Northeast side of Mattaponi River to John Cosby on January 5, 1656 for transportation of sixteen persons; in same volume and page is another entry to John Cosby of 1,000 acres in New Kent County on the south side of York River, for the transportation of twenty people. On the same date, same book, page 73, is an entry to John Cosby of 800 acres in New Kent County, northeast side of Mattaponi River (1200 acres by purchase and 600 acres for transportation of twelve persons). From the fact that John Cosby's widow survived him for a period of nearly 45 years it is supposed that she was not the mother of all of his surviving children, and possibly

not of any of them although in her will she mentions "her sons and granddaughters."

The following are copies of the will of John Cosby I and widow Sarah:

"In the name of God, Amen. I John Cosby of Hampton Parish in York County, being sick and weak in body but of sound and perfect memory, praise be given to God for ye same and knowing the uncertainty of this life on earth, and being desirous to settle things in order, do make this my last will and testament in manner and form following:-Imp'ries, I commend my soul to Almighty God, my Creator, assuredly believing that I shall receive full pardon and remission of all my sins and be saved by the previous death and meritts of my blessed Savior and Redeemer Christ Jesus-and my executors hereafter named:-

"First, I doe give all my negroes my wife's natural life for a maintenance for my beloved wife and two daughters Margarett and Sarah, and after the decease of my beloved wife the said negroes to be equally divided between my three sons, Charles, John and James and my two daughters Margarett and Sarah.

Itm. I doe give to my beloved wife one feather bed and furniture.

Itm. I give my daughter, Margarett, ye feather bed I now lye upon and with all ye furniture thereunto belonging, and my riding horse, and six cows, to make her choice of all ye cows I have, and one iron pott and hookes.

Itm. I give to my daughter Sarah one feather bed and furniture.

Itm. I give to my grandson, Henry Jackson, one cow.

Itm. I give to my daughter Mary Ayles two heifers.

Itm. I give to my son John five head of cattle, all being female.

Itm. I doe give to my son James 5 head of cattle female.

Itm. I doe give to my son John (our John) ye flock bed he now lyes upon with all ye furniture thereunto belonging.

Itm. I doe give to my daughter Elizabeth Wooding, twenty shillings sterling money.

Itm. I doe give all remaining pat. of estate, household stuff to equally be divided between my three sons Charles, John, (our John), and James and two daughters Margarett and Sarah

Note, 1 (Anna Leland West is descended from both Charles and John. John Charles)

Itm. I doe give to my son John one gun and sword.

Itm. I doe give to my son James my saddle, Pistols, and holsters, and sword and one gun.

Itm. I do hereby nominate and appoint my sons John and James Cosby to be my sole executors at this last will and testament. In witness whereof I hereunto sett my hand and seal this 4th day of September 1695.

"Itm. I give and bequeath unto my loving son Charles Cosby, 15 pounds in cash.

Itm. I give to my son James Cosby one shilling sterling and no more.

Itm. I give to my son John Cosby's wife (Martha Garland) a Cherryderry gown and Pettycoat and Calico Gown.

Itm. I leave the remainder of my estate to my granddaughter Sarah Cosby, only my funeral expenses to be paid out of it, and I desire that my son John Cosby take my granddaugher's part into his hands and to pay it to her when she comes to the age of eighteen. Lastly, I do nominate and appoint my son Charles Cosby, Executor of this my last will and Testament."

Sarah Cosby (L. S.) Signed, sealed and delivered in the presence of us: Francis Hewitt John Hewitt Thomas Oliver It was ordered to be recorded July 21, 1740. Teste:-Matt Hubard Cl. Crt. John Cosby had, probably, two wives. They had issue:

- 1. Mary died in infancy, November 30, 1657.
- 2. daughter who married Mr. Jackson
- 3. Mary married to Mr. Ayles
- 4. Elizabeth married Mr. Wooding.
- 5. John married Martha Garland
- 6. Charles married Jane Meriwether
- 7. James
- 8. Margaret
- 9. Sarah

CHARLES COSBY

Charles Cosby was born probably about the year 1670-80. He lived upon lands in King and Queen and New Kent Counties, granted his father by purchase and entry in 1656. He is said to have married Jane, a daughter of David Meriwether, the emigrant. As all the records of New Kent County were destroyed during the Civil War no record of his will is extant. There is a tradition that one Charles Cosby, probably this son lived to vigorous old age and rode to the hounds at ninety years of age. He died probably about 1760-65. He is known to have left two sons:

1. James Cosby was born probably about 1703. He lived in York County and died in 1783. Name of his wife is unknown. He had issue:

a. John Cosby, his wife's name was Judith. He died during or prior to the year 1754 when Charles, John, James, and Mary were recorded as orphans.

- b. William Cosby
- c. Charles Cosby

2. David

DAVID COSBY

David Cosby, son of Charles and Jane Meriwether Cosby, was born in 1703 and died in 1770, removed to Hanover County, which eventually became Louisa County. He was an extensive land holder and planter. His name appears in 1745 as one of the first Board of Vestrymen of the new Parish of Fredericksville, created after the separation of Louisa from In Bishop Meade's History of the Old Churches, Ministers, and Hanover. Families in Virginia (Vol. 2, p. 41-42) his signature appears with those of other vestrymen to the oaths of allegiance and adjuration that they were required to take. He married Mary (Garland) Overton in 1725. She was a daughter of Captain James Overton and Elizabeth Garland, his wife, sister of Mrs. John Cosby (Garland and Overton). Mary was born in 1705. Her grandfather, William Overton I, was born in England December 3, married 1670, Elizabeth Mary Water, a Roman Catholic of 1638, considerable fortune. The father of William Overton, 1st, Major General Robert Overton, was one of the most distinguished officers of the Parliamentary Army under Cromwell. David Cosby died in 1770, his will being proved in Louisa County on September 10 of that year. She died in 1785, her last will being proved on February 14, of that year. The following are copies of their wills, also of their daughter, Jane's.

"In the name of God, Amen. I David Cosby, of the County of Louisa and Parish of Fredericksville being of sound and disposing mind and memory do make my last will and testament in the following manner: Imprimis-I lend to my beloved wife during her widowhood the tract of land whereon I now live, together with all the rest of my estate of every kind. Itm. and bequeath to my two daughters, Barbara and Jane, after the death or marriage of my wife, the following slaves, to wit Hannah, Climen, together with all children they have, except one, which I shall hereafter particularly dispose of to be equally divided between them and heirs forever, but if either of my daughters, Barbara and Jane, should die before they come of age or marry, then my will and desire is the part given her shall be subject to my estate. Itm. I give and

bequeath to my grandson, Richard Tompkins, (line of Anna Leland West) a negro girl, named Daphne, the daughter of Climen, to him and heirs forever. Itm. It is my will and desire that if either of my daughters Barbara and Jane, should marry contrary to my wife's consent, the part herein before bequeathed to her shall return to my estate and be subject to the same disposition with it. Itm. I do hereby order and direct my executor to be named, to sell my estates, both real and personal not before disposed of, as soon as conveniently may be after death or marriage of my wife, and it is my will and desire that the money arising from such sale be equally divided between my sons, Charles, David, Overton, John, and James. Itm. It is my desire that my estate be not appraised. Lastly, I appoint my two sons, Charles and David with Robert Armstead, Executors of this my last will and testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand affixed my seal this 9th day of December 1768.

Sgn. David Cosby (Seal) Signed, sealed and delivered in the presence of us. James Smith James Winston Archibald Harris At a court held for Louisa County Sept. 10, 1770, this will was this

day exhibited into court by Charles Cosby, one of the executors therein named who made oath thereof according to law and proved by the oaths of James Smith and Arthur Harris, two of the witnesses thereunto and by the court ordered recorded.

In the name of God, Amen, I, Mary Cosby, of the County of Louisa being of sound mind and perfect understanding, but of great weakness of body do make and constitute this, my last will and testament in form and manner of allowing, viz:- In the first place I commit my body to earth from which it sprung to be decently buried at the direction of my children present at my death. In the last place, I give and bequeath to my daughter, Jane Cosby, all and every the profits arising from the estate lent me by my beloved husband, David Cosby, since his death together with all my Tea and Coffee, equipage, china dishes, and plates and my Bell Mettled Skillet, the small yet the greatest compensation in my power to make her for being left destitute. This I acknowledge to be my last will and testament hereby revoking every other will by me heretofore made. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this day 8, January anno domini 1785. I appoint my daughter, Jane Cosby, sole executrix.

The children of David Cosby and Mary Overton Cosby were:

1. Charles Cosby was born in that part of Hanover County which eventually became Louisa County about 1726. In his early manhood he was a teacher, subsequently a planter, first in Louisa county, then in Spottsylvania County and finally in Elbert County, Georgia, in which place he died in 1802."

2. David Cosby was born about 1728. He was named as one of the executors of his fathers will made in 1768.

3. Elizabeth (Betty) Cosby was born in 1736. She married in 1755 Major John Minor of "Topping Castle" (destroyed by fire in 1895) who was born November 13, 1735, and died March 31, 1800. They had issue.

4. Overton Cosby was born in Hanover County 1739-40. He removed to Middlesex County prior to 1765. He married his housekeeper and had no children. He was a very prosperous merchant of Urbanna, apparently with business connections in Charleston, South Carolina. He was a member of the House of Delegates for Middlesex County in 1787 and County Clerk from 1799 until his death which occured at Urbanna on November 23, 1806. He is buried in a private lot in the rear of his old home, an old colonial mansion in Urbanna.

5. John Cosby was born in Hanover County September 19, 1741, died in Frederickstown, Washington County, Kentucky. He is mentioned in his father's will and his aunt's, Jane Cosby, will. A deed for 505 acres of land bought by him September 3, 1795 is on record in the Washington County court on April 23, 1837. He married his cousin Susannah Wingfield. They had issue.

6. James Cosby

7. Mary Cosby was born about 1745-47 married William Callis, of Middlesex County, and had issue. William Overton Callis, mentioned in his uncle's will (Overton Cosby) and his aunt's will (Jane Cosby), was a captain in the Continental Line in the Revolutionary War and received a grant of 400 acres from Virginia for his services as such.

8. Ann (Nancy) Overton Cosby, born about 1745-8, married William Tompkins & (1736-1772) who was the fourth son of Christopher Tompkins 1705-1779 and his wife, Joyce Reade, 1706-1771, granddaughter of Col. George Reade and his wife Elizabeth Martiau, daughter of Capt. Nicholas Martiau, the Burgess, 1621, of Yorktown. General George Washington and General Thomas Nelson were both descended from this Capt. Martiau. Catherine R. Tompkins was daughter of Capt. Robert Reade Tompkins, 1730-1795, (eldest son of Christopher and Joyce) and his wife Ann Dickerson 1735-1819, daughter of Griffith 1705-1777 and Ann Cosby Dickerson. Ann (Nancy) Overton Cosby and her husband William Tompkins had issue.

9. Barbara Cosby, born about 1752 mentioned in her father's will as under age and unmarried in 1768. She married Capt. Vivian Minor, brother of Major John and was the ninth child of John Minor and Sarah Carr. They had issue.

10. William Cosby, mentioned on authority of Mrs. Sarah Lewes, a granddaughter of John Cosby. Probably the William Cosby who died in Williamson County, Tennessee, 1846.

DAVID COSBY

David Cosby was born in Louisa County about 1728. He was one of the administrators of his father's will. He moved to Goochland County, probably before 1755, where he spent the rest of his life.

In the 21st of November 1755 issue of the Virginia Gazette, he placed an advertisement, stating that he lived near Sherwood Harris on Tuckahoe Creek in Goochland County, and that a mare had taken up by him. He was hoping that the owner would claim the mare!

His first 2 children were probably born in Louisa county, and probably the rest were born in Goochland County. During the life of David Cosby, we find a variation in the spelling of the name. In the marriage record of Nancy Cosby, David's granddaughter by son Charles, Charles name is written as Causby, while Nancy lists her name as Cosby. In the period of 1775 to 1850, the names are written both ways. In his will which follows, son James' last name is spelled is both ways, while David and son James is spelled Causby. Some of the grandsons of Charles thought that their forbears made an agreement regarding the spelling of the name. Possibly the fact that David could not write his name, might have caused who wrote his name to spell it as it sounded. Without dictionaries many words were spelled phonetically.

The name of David's first wife has not been found and she was the mother of his first two children. His second wife was Mary Johnson, the daughter of Charles Johnson and his wife Elizabeth, on 26 January 1757, in Louisa County. Charles Johnson purchased 150 acres of land on the north side of James River, in Goochland County on 7 August 1728. On 28 September 1732 he patented 400 acres of land on the branches of Tuckahoe Creek. Over the years he bought several smaller tracts, all in the same vicinity, and was a substantial owner of land. On 16 November 1754 he made the following deed: "for natural love and affection to my son-inlaw David Cosby 100 acres of land which is part of tract whereon said Charles Johnson now lives." The reason is unknown, but within a year he deeded the property back to Charles Johnson. In addition to Mary, Charles and Elizabeth Johnson had the following children: James Johnson and William Johnson. While David was not a wealthy man, in the 1782 personal property taxes, he was levied for slaves Phil, Robin, Jack and 14 cattle.

David Cosby married, as his third wife, Susanna Whitte on 24 September 1791 in Goochland County. They had no issue.

His will is recorded in deed book 19, part 1, page 80 as follows:

"In the name of God Amen. I David Causby of the County of Goochland being in a low state of health but in sound mind and memory do constitute and make this to be my last will and Testament in Manner and form following Viz.

Item 1st. My will and desire is that all my just Debts of Whatever nature be first paid.

Item I give and bequeathe unto my beloved wife Susanna Causby. All the Virginia Cloth, consisting of Sheets, counterpins, wearing apparel of Every kind made up or not all the Cotton in the house or may be made this Year to her and her heirs forever.

Item I also lend to my Wife One feather Bed & furniture during her natural life & at her decease the said Eed and furniture to go to my son James Causby and his heirs forever, wch. Bed is commonly called my bed.

Item Also lend to my wife Two iron potts one pr. Poll hook's One red chest, and 2 of the best Chairs. One dish four plates, One Bason as she may choose them, during her natural life and at her death to be sold, and the money arising divided among all of my children.

Item I give to my Wife all the provisions of every kind all the earthen ware, One frying pan, Knives and forks, Spining wheel and cards One cedar water pail, to her and her heirs forever.

Item I give to my Wife five pounds to be raised out of my estate to her and her heirs forever.

Item I give & bequeathe to my son James Cosby, one bow to him & his heirs forever.

Item I give & bequeathe to my son Pleasant Causby one feather bed and furniture to him and his heirs forever,

Item After the legacies heretofore given away, and my Just debts be paid, all the balance of my estate whatever it be, to be sold and equally Divided, among my children.

Item Lastly I constitute and appoint my Friends Philip Woodson and Archd. Pleasants executors of this my last will and testament hereby revoking all former wills by me made in Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 20th day of July Eighteen hundred and three.

Signed Seald & in Presence of Josiah Woodson Will Farrar William Page

At a Court of monthly session held for Goochland County at the Courthouse on monday the 17th of September 1804. This last will and testament of David Causby deceased was moved by the oath of William Page a witness thereto, and ordered to be recorded. Teste

JEREMIAH DAVID COSBY

Jeremiah David Cosby was born 11 October 1761, probably in Louisa County, Virginia, the fourth child of David Cosby and Mary Johnson. As we know from oral history, Jermiah, known as Jeremiah and also as David. was also known as "blind David". He was quite a fiddle player, and in one of the times he was playing for a dance, tragically he was blinded which led to his nickname, and also resulted in his inability to make a living for his family. He was shot by a Mr. Gilliam, by accident. His name was listed in "Virginia Soldiers of 1776". He died in Powhatan County prior to 13 Feb. 1813. Through 1817 the property was taxed as being a tract of 40 acres or less, joining the properties of John Goode, Bennett Goode, and the estate of Wm. S. Forsee on Fine Creek. However, there was a new survey made, apparently, which changed the amount of land to 55 acres. When the land was first purchased the deed called for 25 acres of land, purchased by David Causby. Some records showed his name David Causby, and others referred to him as Jeremiah Causby, but none exist showing him as Jeremiah David Causby (Cosby).

He was intestate when he died and the matter was brought before the Circuit Court of Powhatan in the Nov/Dec 1832 term by his son Bolling Causby. The following petition was presented to the court:

"To the worshipful Justices of the County Court of Powhatan, in chancery setting:

Humbly complaining then unto your worships, your orator Bowling Causby, in his own right, and as guardian ad litem- specially appointed by the court to take care of them in this suit- of Agatha Ann, Alfred, John Calvert and Elizabeth Causby, infant children of William Causby dec'd, and of William, Edwin, and Mary Causby, infant children of Jeremiah Causby dec'd, your orator William H. Harrison, and Deborah, his wife, your orator Nicholas Wilkinson, who intermarried with one of the daughters of Jeremiah Causby, the father of Bowling and Jeremiah Causby just named, and others, your orator Judith, widow of William Causby dec'd and your orator Ludwell W., Jefferson, and Mahala, all children of William Causby dec'd and now of legal age, and your oratrix Eliza, widow of Jeremiah Causby, junr. dec'd- that some time in the year Jeremiah Causby, father of your orator Bowling Causby and others above-named, died intestate, leaving several children, all of whom together with their descendants-with the exception of two, viz; David & Lilburn Wilkinson who are sons of Nicholas Wilkinson, of legal age, and are now beyond the limits of the state named above, and possessed of a small tract of land in this county, containing between fifty and sixty acres. --That this land has continued ever since the death of the said intestate Causby, and now is, wholly unproductive, and that the individual share of each one entitled thereto falls much under the value of \$300--and that all the parties interested would, no doubt, be benefited by the sale, and the distribution of the proceeds thereof: To the end therefore, that the two sons of Nicholas Wilkinson, now of legal age, to wit: David & Lilburn may be made parties unto, that the land may

be sold, and the proceeds of such sale be divided amongst them properly entitled hereto, may it please your worships to grant any process, and make any order, that may be necessary and proper to the _____. (signed) Porter"

He married Mary, last name unknown, and she died in Powhatan County c1818. He and Mary were the parents of:

GARLAND COSBY #111122415212

Garland Cosby, the son of Charles Cosby, was born in Hanover County, Virginia about 1759. In March 1776, being then 17 years old, he enlisted for 12 months in a minute regiment commanded by Col. Samuel Meredith, in the company commanded by Captain James Dabney and was discharged December 25, 1776. In 1777 he enlisted in Captain David Anderson's Company and was made orderly sergeant. He marched with the company to Williamsburg and joined Col. Grayson's regiment and soon after became Regimental quartermaster. In 1781 he again enlisted as a volunteer in a company commanded by Capt. Hughes of Louisa County and was made Lieutenant and marched in command of his company to Gloucester County, Virginia to join Col Campbell's command and was promoted to Captain. His last service was in a regiment commanded by Col. Innis. After the war he removed to Fayette County, Kentucky, where he lived for 6 years. Thence he moved to Henderson County, Kentucky, where he died prior to 1842. He was married about 1784 to Miss Lucy Poindexter, a native of Virginia. She was a sister of George Poindexter who served on General Jackson's staff in the War of 1812.

FORTUNATUS COSBY #111122415216

Fortunatus Cosby, the son of Charles Cosby and Elizabeth Wingfield, was born in Louisa County, Virginia on December 30, 1765. He died October 10, 1846. He graduated from William and Mary College at the age of 19. On May 19, 1795, he married Mary Ann Fontaine, who was born on October 14, 1778. After Kentucky became a state of the Union, there was a great amount of litigation arising out of conflicting grants of land. Fortunatus saw this as a great opportunity for him, as a lawyer. He accompanied his father-in-law to Kentucky, about 1796 settling on Harrods Creek, a few miles from Louisville. He moved to Louisville in 1802.

FORTUNATUS COSBY #1111224152162

Fortunatus Cosby was born on May 2, 1801 at the home of his grandfather, Captain Aaron Fontaine of Harrod's Creek, nine miles east of Louisville, Kentucky. He entered Yale College with the class that graduated in1826, but left at the beginning of his senior year having been called home on account of illness. He did not return to Yale but took his degree at Transylvania University, Lexington, Kentucky. About 1823, with his cousin Dabney Carr Terrell, a great nephew of ex President Thomas Jefferson, he visited that gentleman at Monticello. In 1850 he went to Washington under an appointment in the U.S. Treasury Department where he remained until 1861, when he was appointed by President Lincoln as U. S. Consul at Geneva, Switzerland. He sailed for his post in September 1861. When his nomination was submitted to the senate for confirmation, some doubt was expressed as to his loyalty, as he was from a southern state and had a son and a son-in-law in the Confederate army. The senate having adjourned without acting on his nomination, his appointment lapsed. He was, however, immediately reappointed and confirmed and commissioned on February 18, 1863. He only served until October 10, 1863. He remained abroad until after the Civil War was over.

He was a poet of fine quality. He died in Louisville, Kentucky on June 15, 1871 in the 71st year of his age.

ARTHUR FORTUNATUS COSBY #111122415216253

Arthur Fortunatus Cosby was a trooper in the Spanish American War and was stationed and fought in Cuba. The following article is from "The Splendid Little War", by Frank Freidel.

"One of the wounded men able to make his way back to Siboney was Trooper Arthur Fortunatus Cosby. In a dispatch to Harper's Weekly, John Fox, Jr., referred to him as "that wounded courtier. . who, feverish, trembling, with a scraped temple, a badly wounded hand, and a bullet in his chest, staggered painfully some ten miles, waving off all assistance, and confessing at last, as he sat on the beach, in the broiling sun, waiting to be taken to a hospital-ship, that if it were handy, and could be got without too much trouble, he thought he would like a peach."

To another correspondent, Cosby dictated a letter for his mother: "I have been in another engagement & am slightly wounded-not seriously. I was lying in the grass, storming an intrenched blockhouse near Santiago, when a ball entered my hat, grazed my temple, went through the fleshy part of my hand in 3 places, & lodged in the muscles of the right chest. . I am not suffering at all."

Ten days later, on July 12, Cosby again had his picture taken at the same Tampa studio where he had been photographed on June 6.

Trooper Cosby was indeed relatively lucky. Some of the men with whom he had fought the day before were being buried in the Spanish trenches on San Juan Hill. Along the road stretching back to El Pozo, Caspar Whitney saw many grim sights in the gray dawn of July 2."

CHARLES COSBY #111122415222

Charles Cosby, ths son of David Cosby and Mary Johnson, was born 21 October 1754. He married Mary Minter, the daughter of Anthony Minter. He died in Powhatan County and left the following will: "In the name of God, amen, I, Charles Cosby of the county of Powhatan, being at this time in my right mind & perfect memory do make this my last will and testament utterly revoking all former wills made and ordained by me. In the first place, I recommend my body to the earth from whence it came, to be interred in Christian like decent manner at the discretion of my executor here-in-after mentioned: and my spirit unto almighty God, who gave it hoping through the mercy of his son, Jesus Christ, to be happy in the enjoyment of him forever and after my just debts and funeral charges are paid, I dispose of my estate in the following manner, viz:

Imprimis it is my will and desire that the twenty five acres of land whereon I now live for which I have a deed from Anthony Minter during his natural life, which is recorded in the county court of Powhatan should be rented out annually by my executors herein named to the best advantage during the life of the said Anthony Minter and the money arising therefrom be applied by my said executors to the support and education of my five youngest children, named as follows, to wit, Richard, Archibald, Abner, James and Patsey.

Then I give and bequeath to my daughter, Nancy Minter, the sum of ten dollars current money to be raised from my estate to her and her heirs forever.

Item, I give to my son, Josiah Cosby, the sum of ten dollars current money to be raised from my estate and paid to him by my executors when he arrives to twenty one years of age, to him and his heirs forever.

Item, I bequeath to my daughter, Elizabeth Cosby, a new feather bed, bedstead and furniture, also a side saddle which is now in the house and fifteen geese to her and her heirs forever.

Item, It is my will that my slaves named David, Lewis, Lavy, and Helly should be hired out annually by my executors at their discretion until the youngest of my children, which may then be living, shall attain the age of sixteen years. The money that will arise from the hires of the said slaves shall be equally distributed among my seven following named children: Wm Henry, Polly, Richard, Archibald, abner, James and Patsey for the purpose of their support and education.

Item, I now give to my son Charles the sum of twenty dollars to be raised from my estate to him and his heirs forever.

Item, I give and bequeath to my son Overton the sum of twenty dollars current money when he arrives to eighteen years of age to him and his heirs forever.

Item, My will is that at my decease that my stock of every kind, household and kitchen furniture, plantation, shop tools, etc. should be sold by my executors to the best advantage and the money arising from the sale thereof be applied to the payment of my debts and whatever balance may then remain be applied to the educating and subsistance of my said seven children, namely, Wm. Henry, Polly, Richard, Archibald, Abner, James, and Patsey in an equal distribution.

Item, It is my will, that when my youngest child may then be living shall arrive to sixteen years of age, my slaves, namely, Davis, Lewis & Hetty shall be sold by my executors to the best advantage and the money arising from the same be equally divided among my ten children (following named) viz : Elizabeth, Charles, Overton, Wm. Henry, Polly, Richard, Archibald, Abner, James and Patsey, to them and their heirs forever.

And lastly, I do nominate and appoint my worthy friends, Frederick Woodson, Samuel Woodson, and my brother James Cosby, and my son, Charles J. Cosby, to execute and fullfill this my last will and testament. In witness whereof I have hereto set my hand and seal this third day of November in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and two.

Signed sealed and acknowledged Charles X Cosby (SS) in the presence of Wm. Clark Jesse Butler Peter Pollock

At a court held for Powhatan County the 19th day of January, 1803, this last will and testament of Charles Cosby, deceased, was presented in open court and proved by the oath of William Clarke, Jeses Butler, and Peter Pollock, subscribing witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded.

WILLIAM HENRY COSBY, JR #11112241522244

The following article is from the Kentucky Historical Society Register Volume 57, of January 1959:

"THE ADVENTURES OF "THE RUN-ABOUT-BOY" BY Ross A. Webb

During the 1840's and 1850's the United States experienced an era of expansion and development that produced a nation stretching from Atlantic to Pacific. This magnificent destiny was, in no small way, the product of its adventuresome people who left their native soil for greener pastures because of an innate desire for change and a love of adventure. A veritable flood tide of humanity had begun moving slowly toward the setting sun. It appeared that the whole population of the country was on its way west.

It was during this period that a young Kentuckian, William Henry Cosby, reached maturity. Heeding the call of destiny he "threw over the traces" and determined upon a life of wandering that was to plague him until the end of his days.

In the fall of 1840 young Cosby first set out for the rich expanses of the West. Like so many of his fellow Kentuckians, he had decided upon Missouri as the place to seek his fortune. Leaving his home in Bourbon County, he traveled by land to Louisville and then embarked by boat for Missouri. The journey down the Ohio and up the Mississippi to St. Louis was not an easy one. He was thirteen days reaching his destination. Unfortunately, his boat ran on a pile of rocks just below Louisville, and he was detained here for two and a half days. It was quite an experience for our young adventurer, for he wrote his mother:

When we get of the bot Commenced filing with water very fast from a hole the rocks had snagged in it, , , As we Came down the river Ohio we found 5 boats stuck in one place and one or 2 others Sunk-after getting into the Missippy we Came on with no trouble at all.

Cosby was fortunate enough to have a cousin in St. Louis from whom he was able to secure room and board. "Cousin Ben" charged him only thirteen dollars a month, while the standard charge, according to Cosby, was usually fifteen dollars a month. Possessing this much security, he now familiarized himself with the city. Before long he secured work as a clerk in the store of Thomas S. Warner. Cosby was elated with his newly found work: "Tho' my salary and future prospects are very good-I am getting \$240 per annum...But if I stay after the first 1 or 2 months I am to get 35 or 38\$ per month." Evidently Warner was having difficulty keeping his help!

The young emigrant was enthusiastic over the growth and progress of the city and reported it in glowing terms:

This is one of the most business places Ma in the West, [A] Great deal more business [is] done here than in Louisville Ky: There is supposed to be an thousand Houses building here now altho times are so hard. It is not so large as Louisville but it bids fair to be almost as large again in a few years.

A year's residence in this western city and Cosby had become a man about town. "I have been wondering. . . which would make the Best, or which was the most consumate fop, I or Mr. Moffet-who you know is the most fashionable gentleman in our City." Afraid that his "Very Dear Ma" would not understand such things, he described "one of these gentlemen. for instance," he said, "myself":

A pair of fine Boots with Heels 2 inches high (I begin By describing the most sensible part first (as you have doubley concluded that my heels have as much sense as my head). Toe as sharp as a needle, Black pants and Coat (pants made Gather stile) Sattin (striped) Vest, chekered neck Hdkf, Caster Hat with bell crown, rim circled up at the sides and white Kid Gloves.

What a figure he must have cut!

In keeping with his new style, he began to move in fast company. "Christmas, I spent some 5 or 6 Dollars in riot and Drink. . . fear I had begun to foster a love for it." This provided a sobering experience, for he concluded that he "had better join the Temperance Society and take the pledge. . . of Total Abstinance." As of the end of May he had "very strictly observed" it.

By this time Cosby had tired of St. Louis, and in the spring of 1842 he left the social life of the city for the loneliness of a farm in the northwestern part of the state. Like many a western emigrant he took with him his scrapbook to wile away the hours.

I'm just amusing myself reading in my scrapbook a yanky Courtship which I have not

noticed before for Sometime its quite laughable; -Johnathan, doez you love biled beef & dumplins, -Darned if I dont Seruke; but a hot dumplin ain't nothin' to your sweet, pretty, tarnel nice red lipz Seruke -O, la! go away now, you Johnathan. Nor was he dependent upon others for his literature and poety. Scattered throughout his letters home were snatches of his own poetry:

Tis night, dead night; and weary nature lies So fast as if she never were to rise Lean wolves forget to howl at night's pale moon, No waking dogs bark at the silent moon, Nor bay the ghosts that glide with horror by,

To view the Caverons where their bodies lie.

Cosby had come to "Davis" County expecting to establish himself as a large-scale farmer, but he was soon disillusioned: "As for me . . , being a farmer I cant think of it. You have no idea how difficult & laborious toil a farmer has to undergo in Mo." This decision was doubly voiced in the same letter: "I should never consent, in the world. to commence farming with no other laborer but myself."

Having faced up to this reality. he now sought another trade or profession. After much indecision, he narrowed his interests to law and medicine. Of these two, he decided medicine held the greatest attraction. He believed that, if he studied energetically for twelve months and then apprenticed himself to a practicing physician for six or eight months, he should be able to begin practice at once on his "own hook" and by "constant study of medicine for 4 or 6 yrs. at leisure moments" he expected to do well.

This decision, and the action which was to follow, did not find ready approval from all members of the family. An uncle writing to his mother commented on Cosby's perfidiousness:

I saw one of Wm. Smart letters to Betty [a sister of Cosby] and as he is a hopefull case, I must wish & think that he will make something after a while. If he can guit the use of tobaco, . , If a man cant guit the use of Tobaco I profecy that he will not attain to iminance and if Wm. does not go Into business I fear that you will suffer him to use up some of my funds or yours to prevent you from paying me. . , .For [the] good old Book says that he that will not work neither should he Eat-please try & set him to doing something that will make his health improve & not get weaker by Idliness.

On the other hand the would-be doctor received strong support from "Cousin" Walters L. Watkins: . . . "There are a great many fine openings in Upper Missouri for good physicians. . . and it does seem to me that it is the finest opening for young men of industrious habits now in the United States."

Cosby had by this time removed to New Albany, Indiana, where he had enrolled in the school of medicine of Christian College. Here he was taught the arts of Botanic Medicine. This branch of medicine had swept the country in the 1830's and 1840'. It was originated by Dr. Samuel Thomson, who had come to the conclusion that all disease was the effect of one general cause. All animal bodies were formed of four elements: earth, water, air, and fire (or heat). A healthy body maintained a definite balance between these elements, but any change upset this equilibrium and caused illness. Thomson believed that the lessening of the power of heat by the obstruction of perspiration caused all disease. Therefore to prevent death one must stop the escape of heat. To regain health one must build up heat to its natural extent. To aid in raising heat and to promote perspiration, Thomson found the "Puke Weed" or Lobelia inflata most useful.

In 1822, together with Elias Smith, Thomson published his. . . New Guide to Health or Botanic Family Physician. Its price was twenty dollars, and it became a best seller of the day. Many a family head became a certified Botanic physician, for with his money he secured an engraved diploma conferring on him the right "of preparing and using for himself and famliy, the Medicine and System of Practice secured to Samuel Thomson, by Letters Patent from the President of the United States."

In the 1820's the son of the founder of Botanic Medicine, Charles Thomson, came west where he encouraged the widespread use of the new medicine. Among the western doctors to adopt the Botanic System was Dr. Alvah Curtis. Curtis became a leading light in the new movement. He was instrumental in founding the Independent Thomsonian Botanic Society and establishing an infirmary at Columbus, Ohio, and he penned powerful articles defending the Botanic System in the *Thomsonian Recorder*.

Dissension soon appeared in the ranks of the Botanics when Dr. Wooster Beach of New York organized the "Eclectic" or "Reformed" System of Botanic Medicine. By 1837 a break between Doctors Curtis and Beach was apparent. Curtis expounded a Botanic System which he called "Physiomedicalism" that was little different from the original Thomsonian system. To advance his beliefs, he instructed students in his own house, secured the incorporation of the Literary and Botanical Medical Institute of Ohio (1839), opened a College of Physicians and Surgeons at Columbus (1840), taught at Christian College, and later removed to Cincinnati where he reorganized the Physiopathic College of Ohio.

Beach, on the other hand, had fallen under the influence of Indian doctors, female practitioners, and regular doctors from whom he attempted to combine the best features into a "Reformed" medicine. To promote his ideas he wrote widely and founded the Reformed Medical Academy at New York. His work and ideas were carried to the West when Dr. Thomas Vaughan Morrow founded the Reformed Medical School of Cincinnati in 1840.

The controversy between Curtis and Beach was raging as Cosby began his preparation for medicine. Cousin Walters, who was one of Cosby's chief mentors, wrote him in regard to this:

But this much I know that I am an eye witness to the practice of one who takes Beach for his guide, . . ,I do not pretend to be any part of a doctor but when I see, . . Beach & Curtis successful in arresting the Progress of disease I Bid them god speed and say go it B & C. Beach certainly has as much celebrity at this time as Curtis or any other MD on earth. . .

Despite Cousin Walter's addiction to Beach, he gave the young

novitiate some sound advice: ". . . as I am some older than yourself I will take the liberty of advising you when you have leisure to Read Beach as I think you are somewhat prejudiced against him, I have lately advised a strong beachite to read Curtis & if you will both take my advice you may both be benefited." Then he continued: "I hope you will do well and save many from an untimely end use all your influence for the cause of Reform and Keep as clear of prejudice as you can."

Cosby remained at New Albany until March, 1845. Then without his certificate, and upon the advice of Cousin Walters, he returned to Missouri. His sister Lucy, on a visit to New Albany, wrote home:

The professors of the college were auch pleased with brothers morals and integrity, paid compliments to him, and gave him credit for all the tickets of the institution. [Dr.] Curtis said that brother was well qualified to receive a diploma but the laws of the college were such that he would have to attend a second session. Brother left in fine spirits, except parting with friends.

The trip west was uneventful. The vessel "White Cloud" landed him safely at St. Louis. After visiting his friends and relatives in the city, he embarked for Cousin Walter's in Clay County. "We were," he said, "10 days in getting to Clay at a passage of \$8," and then in a spirit of morbidness, he added, "our Boat, the 'Nodaway' sunk on her downward passage."

In Clay County he "settled in a spell" with Cousin Walters, who after a week provided him with a horse for travel over the countryside to determine where he would locate. To his mother, he wrote:

I traveled up through the Counties of Platte, Buckhannon, and Andrew into Holt. The first 2 reminds me very much of Ky, lands in soil & Timber, being, however, rather too broken or rolling. Platte has fine sugar orchards. Andrew and Holt are fine rich counties, with about half enough timber; the farther you go north in the upper part of the State the more prairie.

While traveling about he inquired about the price of land: "I have found lands no where, worth having for less than \$5 pr. acre and general 7 & 8 to 15\$."

He was disappointed to discover doctors "on every square mile" except in Cousin Walters' neighborhood where a doctor had recently moved away. "This vacuum I have determined on *helping* to occupy not in partnership with Dr. Shoot (the Botanic Dr.) but on my responsibility."

In keeping with this decision he wrote that he was determined to purchase a farm in Clay County: "Mr. John Gill has 45 acres which we have persuaded him to sell us at 5 dollars pr acre." It was predominately timberland, for fifteen acres which had been cleared and "well fenced." It had a "very good hued-log house upon it, worth 40% to build" with a stream and two springs for stock and drinking water. It had taken 4,500 rails to fence the cleared land which had cost "50 cts pr hundred" and "\$1 pr thousand" for putting it up. Breaking the ground had cost "\$2 pr acre". All these improvements to the farm, Cosby reckoned "worth 90\$ or 100\$." Six years previously Gill had paid \$310 for this land but because of debt now was obliged to sell it for \$225. Friends and relatives approved his purchase, and so our young hero was apparently determined to settle down. "I shall board with the gentleman who now occupies the house and land- and will work on it when I get no practice and improve it all I can." As it turned out, Cosby's uncle had bought the farm! Writing to Cosby's mother, his uncle commented: "I bot for you a house that will suit you & Wm. Bothe. It is paid for & was not Costly."

Already Cosby was contemplating marriage, if he could get his "Pocahuntas." He was hoping to find "a charming intelligent, polished lass of the best blood of old Virginia," but as it turned out his "Pocahuntas" was to be a Missouri belle named Eliza F. Porter. On April 12, 1846, these two "loving kittens" were wed. Twelve days later he described the wedding in a letter to his mother:

As Providence would have it it commensed raining some 8 days before the appointed time and continued untill the evening of the llth. The 12 was, however, a beutifull "sun shiney" day but rather coal. Notwithstanding the roads were knee deep with "hoblolly" there were between 7 and 800 persons presint to witness our nuptials. There were just 1 dozen of us to stand up, all dressed very much a like in white and black. In order to get there we covered ourselves perfectly with wrappers, coats and skirts-the whole affair came off very well-no blunders, an excellent ceremony, good prayer, music, and a first rate lecture; delivered to myself and Eliza of 40 minutes length-we stood it all remarkably well, . . .

After the ceremony, the wedding part retired to Cousin Walters' for "an excellent dinner." "The next day Cousin Jane Gill gave us a very good dinner with the same company."

After two weeks of married life, Cosby spoke with assurance: "We have been married now almost 2 weeks-long enough to form some idea of married life. If I was asked how I like it, I should answer very much, very much indeed."

In preparation for this day, he had begun a new house at "Ashnoll," but as yet it was not finished. Looking forward to the day of its completion, he invited his mother to come to Missouri to visit them. Supposedly Eliza shared these sentiments: "She says you must come out to live with us-says she will wait on you like her own mother."

His marriage had distressed his "very excellent and very dear Ma." In fact it had disturbed her "nightly reposes." In an effort to console her, he again urged her to come to Missouri and forwarded her thirty dollars for that purpose. Then he chastened his mother with these words:

But I must tell you several things: 1st That I have the sweetest and best wife in the world; and intelligent, spirited, kind, affectionate and very industrious and manageing wife, one capable of making a husband happy - 2ndly that my house will soon be in very and comfortable order and that we have plenty of substantial food and clothing to wear.

To this he had added a "very good stable" as well as a "meat and chicken house." Already he had two horses, a cow and calf, and two Berkshire pigs. Eliza's stock consisted of "10 or a dozen hens, 20 or 30 chickens, 1 Gosling or Gooseling and 2 cole-black cats." The doctor evidently had done well during the "spell of bad health" that had struck Missouri. His prosperity was short lived, however, for now he complained: "Our country is quite healthy now. Consequently I have but little to do as Physician."

Some time elapsed before Cosby's mother was able to make the trip from Bourbon County, Kentucky, to Clay County, Missouri. Not until 1848 did she sojourn west to visit her children and her other Missouri kin. Her fears were evidently allayed in regard to her son's marriage, for now she spoke with kindness and concern for her daughter-in-law.

But then a deep sorrow befell Cosby. His beloved Eliza died in childbirth in the fall of 1848. A "darling" daughter had been left behind. To piece together the ensuing story of heartbreak which Cosby suffered is difficult, for little in the way of positive record exists. His mother was probably with him at the time, for no lengthy letter to Bourbon County, Kentucky, has been found which tells of his distress.

Naming his infant daughter for his beloved "kitten," he placed her with relatives in Orange Hill, Missouri, sold all his possessions, and returned to Bourbon County. As he mused "at home" in Paris, two choices appeared open to him: Either he must find a new helpmate, or he must reconcile himself to leaving little Eliza with her mother's relatives in Missouri. At first he tried the former course of action. He petitioned a Miss C. F. Porter, who was a cousin of Eliza's, for her daguerrotype. This Miss Porter flatly refused for several reasons:

Ist 'Because' -2nd The Daguerreotypes do not flatter: (had the request been for a miniature, the artist could flatter sufficiently to make it pass inspection & I would have felt more disposed to comply -) 2 There is not an artist in less than 25 miles -4th the possession of such a treasure might, I fear, tempt you to cease to cherish the memory of your last wife, as I know it merits-5th & last, it would savor too much of vanity for me to send my likeness so far & to a Stranger too. - Now I am sure the Dr will excuse me for being obstinate, especially since I have done that which very, very few women can do, give five reasons for refusing, either of which I am sure his own sense of propriety will force him to say would be sufficient ground upon which to base a denial.

The quaintness of a Victorian "No"!

Through his sister Bettie, he approached a Miss Rickards whom he had met while a student at Christian College at New Albany, Indiana. Here again he met with little success: "I delivered your message to Miss Rickards, she says she is not in the habit of corresponding with the Gentelmen. . . Next he turned to a cousin in Cartersville, Virginia, Nannie L. Cosby. He apparently swept her off her feet, for she wrote him immediately inviting him to visit her. "I must express myself pleased to hear you speak so highly of the female sex-and I will also say that I have [a] more exalted opinion of gentlemen who express themselves pleased with the society of ladies- than I have of those who seem never to care for them at all." After expressing sympathy over the loss of his wife, Nannie hoped that he might "be successful in getting as good a companion again as your former one was. I am disposed to think that it is rather an honor (than otherwise) for them to marry soon-and I honor I mean to the female sex, for the gentlemen to show that they like the ladies better, the more intimately they are with them." Nannie coyly wondered why some "fascinating young lady" had not

captivated his heart, but then philosophically concluded: "Maybe you are like some others in the world, you would prefer a true hearted Virginian before any other. . . " Cousin Nannie appeared too anxious and little is heard of her again! Meanwhile he flirted with the one he could not get, Miss C. F. Porter.

Cosby did not remain idle all the while. Along with his courting and practicing his medicine, he found time to invent and patent a "specification of the Bucket churn." How successful he was in selling his invention cannot be determined.

Always concerned about his daughter, he left the period rich in letters telling of Eliza. One such letter noted: "She is the sprightliest and most interesting child living." Another: "Eliza is as fat as a pig and as lively as a cricket." Assured of his daughter's welfare, Cosby again began his roaming. This time he traveled to Virginia and to the nation's capital. The Washington Monument was being built at this time, and he reported its progress in glowing terms. The city of Richmond, Virginia, delighted him: "Richmond is not so even and regular as Lexington or Louisville, but is a very pretty place & one of much wealth."

This brief sojourn did not satisfy his craving for the adventuresome life, and when news reached Kentucky of the discovery of gold in California, it was not surprising that Cosby should be among those who traveled west. Writing his sister Lucy from St. Joseph, Missouri, he said: "I am aware of your opposition & that of my very dear Mother to this course of mine But still I go I think it will be the best thing I can do & if I have luck I shall return in a year or two, if not I may stay longer. I shall try hard for fortune. . . ."

The constant threat of Indians and sickness from cholera and diarrhea made the trip west a difficult one. En route, Cosby wrote home: "All have had Diarrhae 3 of which died from cholera by negligence. So far I have done well & expect to get through alive by being careful with myself & watching my bowels." Sickness became so prevalent that he earned anywhere from five to twenty dollars a day practicing his medicine.

Upon arrival in California, he soon was disillusioned: "Gold may be found in every bucket of dirt anywhere, but the difficulty is in getting enough to justify one for washing." Later he wrote, "This is a good place for a man to make money that will work. But such work Oh my! 'tis too hard." To the future emigrant, he penned this advice:

If they have been poor & accustomed to hard labour at \$10 or 15 dollars pr month can live upon tough Spanish beef-rancid butter & funky, must bread, can lay down upon the earth with blankets for a couch, with fleas & lice innumerable to traverse and suck the blood of their weary limbs, can live in the midst of lawless desparadoes willing and ready at any moment to see injustice, rapine, & murder committed at any time; willing to have his ears greeted hourly with language the grossest & most vulgar. If they can put up with these and many other changes from refined to degraded society, why tell him he can be compensated for it at from \$3 to 48 pr diem, . . .

Much of this discouragement was undoubtedly due to the fact that his own

fortune was not mounting as quickly as he had hoped: "If I get one or two thousand dollars I shall consider myself lucky."

In the midst of disappointment, he became ill. Suffering from a stomach and bowel condition, he wrote: "My bowels hurt me all the time both night and day. . . " This condition continued to plague him and in "quest of health" he went to San Francisco. He regained his health in the "Bay City" and again began roaming. This time the "run-about-boy" traveled to the Sandwich Islands! Cosby was now entirely well. "Busy, & pretty well contented, and of course tolerably happy," he decided to make California his home.

It is on this rather happy note that we take leave of William Henry Cosby. He has since become dust, but his delightful accounts of life, love, and adventure live on. One may shed the occasional tear for him, but more often one smiles at the whimsical philosophy of this adventuresome spirit."

LUDWELL WILLIAMS COSBY #11112241522411

Ludwell W. Cosby, in deeds recorded in Powhatan County, Virginia in deed book 20 page 252, and in deed book 18 page 579, purchased the property known as Woodberry (also spelled Woodbury) Mills. When the property was destroyed by fire 21 September 1948, the following account was written in the Richmond News Leader, concerning this property:

"POWHATAN, Sept. 23- Nothing but a burned-out shell remains today of Woodbury, a mill believed to be more than 150 years old, which was destroyed in a six-hour blaze Tuesday.

Fire wardens said the fire started at 3 P. M., in a pile of trash near the mill wheel. The wardens were unable to get within 100 feet of the blaze for hours, they said, as the flames moved through the building, burning furniture and lumber stored inside and cracking the stone and brick walls.

The fire was extinguished about 9 P. M. Damage was estimated at between \$7,000 and \$10,000.

A landmark for years, the mill measured 42 by 50 feet, with walls two feet thick and a massive foundation of stone. Large beams braced and supported the gears and stones used in grinding wheat and corn. One girder was 18 by 18 inches and 42 feet long.

The first mill on the site, which probably became the stone part of the later structure, was built by John Harris in 1786. In 1801 extensive improvements were made by Thomas Harris, Jr.

Woodberry was sold by the Harris heirs in 1824 and passed through the hands of several families including those of Moseley, Flournoy, Sublett and Cosby. It had been the property of Miss Constance V. Johnson for the past several years."

When Miss Constance W. Johnson bought the property in 1929 she secured an abstract of title which read, "All that certain real estate in Huguenot District, Powhatan County, Virginia, containing 60 acres, more or less, consisting of 19 acres of land whereon is the mill known as Woodberry Mill, and 41 acres of land covered by the waters of the pond known as Woodberry Mill Pond, together with the privileges, appurtenances and riparian rights thereunto belonging, conveyed to Miss Constance W. Johnson by deed from L. W. Cosby and wife, dated April 6, 1929, and recorded in the Clerk's Office of Powhatan County on April 6, 1929."

John Harris petitioned the County Court of Powhatan for leave to build a dam a the February Term 1781, Order Book 1, page 174, and later petitioned for a renewal of an order of November 17, 1785, granting him leave to erect a grist mill on Jones' Creek and condeming an acre of land of Daniel Branch opposite thereto, which leave was renewed by order of Novermber Term 1786, Order Book 3, page 56. The Jno. Harris dam was probably above the site of the present dam. The present dam was erected by Thomas Harris, Jr., about the year 1801, pursuant to orders of the Powhatan Court acting under the authority of the Mill Act passed by the General Assembly of Virginia December 21, 1792. (Sheppard's Statutes Volume I, page 136).

The jury of 12 men investigating the petition of John Harris to build the grist mill, after inspecting the site of the mill reported: "If the said Harris should raise his dam so as to pond sixteen feet of water measuring the same from the bottom of the stream that in our opinion four and one-half acres of land the property of Joseph Salle will be over-flowed by the waters in the said pond which we value at twenty-five pounds, and also one-half (acre) the property of James Martin, for which the said Martin asks no compensation, we are further of the opinion that neither the mansion house of any such proprietor, the offices, curtilege or garden thereto immediately belonging, or orchard will be overflowed, that neither fish of passage, nor ordinary navigation will be obstructed thereby, and that the health of the neighbors will be annoyed by the stagnation of the waters in the said pond." Signed and sealed July 24, 1801.

"On motion of the said Thos. Harris, Jr., it is ordered that Joseph Salle, the proprietor of land subject to be overflowed by the waters in the said pond, be summoned to appear here at next Court to show cause why leave should not be granted unto the said Harris to erect a mill at the place proposed and in manner before prescribed, he having made a tender of the amount of damages assessed by the Jury aforesaid, by placing the same on the Clerk's table in open Court." See County Court Order Book 6, page 510."

Joseph Salle objected to the building of the dam and mill stating that the stagnation of the pond would endanger the health of his family but the Court rejected the argument and gave Harris the right to proceed with the payment of twenty five pounds to Joseph Salle.

NAPOLEON DABNEY COSBY #111122415224111

Napoleon Dabney Cosby applied for and received a license to run an ordinary in Powhatan County on 7 September 1874. On 1 May 1876 he was granted a liquor license stipulating that the liquor was not to be drunk when sold. A further application for his liquor license on 7 May 1877 gave him the right to sell liquor to be drunk when sold at Woodberry Mills.

Professor Frank E. Cosby, artist and musician of this city will give and exhibition of his paintings in the Sunday school auditorium of the Asbury Methodist Church, corner of Chicago Avenue and Petersburg Pike, on October 7, 8, and 9, from 7 to 10 P. M. A short musical program will be given each night by Professor Cosby's students. The public is invited and admission is free. Many Richmonders will remember Professor Cosby as the founder of the Richmond Conservatory of Music in 1901 and will recall the recitals given by his pupils some years ago in the City Auditorium, in one instance 12 pianos being used and in the other, 17 pianos. These recitals were to test the acoustics of the auditorium." RICHMOND NEWS LEADER, October 6, 1942

"Frank E. Cosby Dies at His Home

Frank E. Cosby died Thursday night at his home, Stop 17 Petersburg Turnpike. The remains rest at the Billups Funeral Home and the funeral cortege will leave there at 1:30 P. M. Saturday for Guinea Methodist Church, Caroline County, where services will be held at the grave at 3 P. M.

Mr. Cosby was for many years well known in Richmond as a teacher of the piano and organ and as an artist. He was the founder, in 1901, of the Richmond Conservatory of Music.

Surviving are two brothers, George M. and Paul R. Cosby; and three sisters, Mrs. Emily S. Corr and the Misses Lottie and Hortense Cosby." RICHOND NEWS LEADER, August 29, 1947

The following obituary appeared in the November 25, 1988 issue of the RICHMOND NEWS LEADER:

"FUNERAL SCHEDULED FOR CHORUS FOUNDER

A funeral for J. Harrison "Bill" Harding Sr., 78, former minister of music at three area Presbyterian churches and co-founder and first chairman of the board of the South Richmond-Chesterfield Branch of the YMCA, will be held tomorrow at 11 a.m. at Forest Hill Presbyterian Church, 4401 Forest Hill Ave. Burial will follow in Maury Cemetery.

Mr. Harding, a professional singer who also was founder of the Du Pont Male Chorus, later the Richmond Male Chorus, died Wednesday in a local hospital.

He was a Richmond resident.

Mr. Harding, a Baltimore native, moved to Richmond with his family when he was 2 years old. After he graduated from John Marshall High School, he attended the University of Richmond for two years, until his father died in 1931. He played varsity football at UR.

Mr. Harding then worked for E. I. du Pont de Nemours & Co. for 29 years, until his retirement.

He sang with the Richmond Opera Group in the 1920s and 1930s and was minister of music at Forest Hill, Bainbridge and Mount Vernon Presbyterian churches.

During the 1950s, he founded and served as first director of the Du Pont Male Chorus.

He helped found and served as first board chairman YMCA branch from 1960 until 1961.

Mr. Harding played tennis for the Westover Hills-Jahnke Road tennis team in a local suburban league until he was 70.

He was a member of the Manchester Gang, a group of men who formerly lived in the Manchester area of South Richmond.

Survivors include his wife, Mrs. Louise L. Harding; two sons, James H. Harding Jr. of New Kent County and Thomas A. Harding of Richmond; four grandchildren and one great grandchild."

Bill Harding became very interested in his family history, and the last several years of his life, he diligently researched his Harding and Harrison ancestors and relations. The information contained in this book about his family was the result of his effort and pleasure.

ART MUSEUM PLANS SHOWING BY GWATHMEY

Local Artist's Paintings To Be Viewed Oct. 27 Robert Gwathmey, whose name in the art world has almost been a sensation, is scheduled to let his hometown folk see a cross-section of his canvasses at the Virginia Museum of Fine Arts from October 27 through November 13. The exhibition will be previewed next Saturday.

Born in the city on January 24, 1903, the artist, after graduating from John Marshall High School and North Carolina State College, began his art studies at the Maryland Institute of Design, and later was a student at the Pennsylvania Academy of Fine Arts. He was awarded two Cremon Traveling scholarships in 1929 and 1930, which permitted of a supplementary art education in Europe.

Returning to this country, he taught at Beaver College and later at the Carnegie Institute of Technology. Today, although his canvasses are in demand by private collectors, museums and for national exhibitions, the Richmond artist teaches part-time at Coopers Union and at the New School for Social research, in New York.

Wins Many Awards

1939 saw him take his first steps on the prize-winning art road. He won an award in the "18 State Mural Competition." (1939), followed by one in PM's" Artists as Reporter Competition (1940); first prize in San Diego's National Watercolor Exhibition (1941), and in Artists for Victory's "America in the War" (1943); awarded the Rosenwald Fellowship (1944); award from the American Academy of Arts and Letters (1946), and the third prize in the Pepsi-Cola "Paintings of the Year" exhibition, now current in the Metropolitan Museum in New York.

The artist's work is owned by the Boston Museum of Fine Arts, San Diego Museum, the Albright Gallery, the Encyclopaedia Britannica and the United States Department of State and some of the foremost art collectors in the nation, who have loaned his works for the exhibition.

Sociologists are unanimous hailing Gwathmey's portrayal of certain downtrodden segments of the South's population. Commenting vesterday upon the forthcoming exhibition, Thomas C. Colt, Jr., the museum's director, said: "Gwathmey's work is straightforwrd. He speaks of the South and of its poorer people with understanding and with the democratic responsibility of a Jefferson. But his work is greater than mere regionalism and social uplift. His unusual color gains beauty with familiarity, and his forms grow in simple strength. They partake of humanity, and a universal harmony."

Highlighting the exhibition will be a discussion of the social concept of the artist's work by William Shands Meacham, sociologist and chairman of the State Parole Board; Clifford Dowdy, author, and Miss Priscilla Crum, the museum's curator of education. This will be held on Wednesday, November 13.

Gwathmey's canvas, "Family Portrait", now in the permanent collection of the museum, is to be included in the one-man show. RICHMOND TIMES-DISPATCH, SUNDAY, OCTOBER 20, 1946

On 19 May 1830, Jefferson Cosby was granted the license he had previously applied for which is recorded in order book 21, page 242, of Powhatan County:

"On the motion of Jefferson Causby who has obtained or intends to obtain a license for the purpose of selling goods, wares and merchandise of foreign growth and manufacture in this county including Rum, Brandy, Gin, Whiskey and other ardent spirits. It is ordered to be certified that it appears to the satisfaction of the court that the said Jefferson Causby is a man of good character."

The following year on 18 May 1831 the court refused the new application of Jefferson Causby to sell liquor as he is less than one mile from James River, and not in convenient location.

The following court case in Powhatan County gives much information:

"To the Honourable John B. Clopton Judge of the Circuit Superior Court of Law and Chancery for the county of Powhatan.

Humbly complaining shew unto your Honor your orators and oratrices John Wilson, James E. Wilson, Joseph Ballow and Catharine his wife formerly Catharine Wilson, William H. Wilson, Winny Wilson, a person of unsound mind, by her next friend James E. Wilson, Ludwell W. Cosby and Rebecca his wife, formerly Rebecca Wilson, Mary Ann Cosby, Indianna W. Cosby and Martha C. Cosby infant children of Bolling Cosby, and Martha his wife now deceased formerly Martha Wilson, by the said Bolling Cosby their next friend, that the said John, James E., William H., & Winny Wilson, and the said Catharine Ballow, and Rebecca Cosby are children of William Wilson, decd. and that the said Mary Ann, Indianna W. and Martha C. Cosby are the only surviving children of Martha Cosby dec'd who was also a daughter of the said William Wilson dec'd that in the year 1821 a certain William Sizer dec'd purchased five negroes of a certain Henry Turner for the benefit of Mary Wilson now dec'd late the wife of the said William Wilson dec'd and Mother and grandmother of your orators and oratrices except the said Joseph Ballow and Ludwell W. Cosby, and afterwards he purchased another negro man from the said William Wilson dec'd named Lewis for the benefit also of the said Mary Wilson dec'd but the said William Sizer held and claimed title to the said negroes until his death; that by a codicil to the last will and testament of the said Sizer a copy of which marked A is herewith filed and prayed to be taken as a part of this Bill he bequeathed the said negroes and their increase to Francis S. Sampson and Thomas Drake in Trust for the sole interest and benefit of the said Mary Wilson during her life, and at her death to be equally divided between her children; that the said Sampson & Drake are both dead; that on the 12th day of June 1832, the said William Wilson now dec'd without any right or title to any of the said negores, as far as your orators and oratrices are advised or if he had conveyed two of them namely Lewis and Isaac by Deed to a certain Jefferson Cosby, as appears by an office copy marked B. and herewith filed as part of this Bill; that the said Deed, whatever upon its face may appear to the

contrary, was founded not in any legal consideration, and was intended merely as a cover or device to prevent the Creditors of the said William Wilson dec'd from taking and selling the same, and with the private agreement and understanding that the said Jefferson Cosby was to hold the negroes solely for the benefit of the said William Wilson and his family; that the said Jeffeson Cosby knew and frequently afterwards admitted and declared that he had acquired no right in law or equity to the said negroes, but that they were held by him for the benefit of Mr. Wilson and his family only, yet he now refuses either to surrender the said negroes to the children or administrator of the said William Wilson dec'd for distribution or payment of debts, or to account for their hires and profits for many years past.

In tender consideration whereof, and in as much as your orators and oratrices are remediless in the premises save in a Court of Equity where matters of this sort are heard and determined and adequate relief promptly rendered to the helpless and oppressed, they pray that the said Jefferson Cosby and his children, namely William Thomas Cosby, Robert D. Cosby, Branch E. Cosby, Judith Cosby, Polly Cosby, and _____ Cosby, whose name is not known but commonly called Tumby, who are the only children of his wife Nancy Cosby, now dec'd- formerly Nancy Wilson daughter of the said William Wilson dec'd, and James M. Harris Sheriff of Powhatan and as such admr. of Villiam Vilson dec'd be made defendants hereto and compelled to answer the adults in person and the infants (all his children being such) by guardian ad litem, upon oath the several allegations of this Bill fully and directly that the said Jefferson Cosby especially be compelled upon oath to disclose the consideration, purposes and objects of the deed of the 12th June 1832 aforesaid and to surrender the negroes Isaac and Lewis and account for their hires and profits for distribution according to Law among the distributees of the said William Wilson and Mary Wilson both dec'd or to the legal representatives of the said William Wilson dec'd if the court shall so adjudge and until a final decrees can be made herein that the said negroes be ordered to be placed in the hands of some suitable agent or Trustee to abide the decision of the Court; that all necessary process be awarded your orators and oratrices to conduct this their suit, and that finally the said deed of the 12th June 1832 be cancelled, annulled, and voided, or such other decree be rendered as the court may decree and as dury bound they will ever pray & etc.

MINNIE JANE COTTRELL HOOKER #1111224152241276

The following letter was written by Minnie Jane Cottrell Hooker:

"R. C. HOOKER, M. D. 3115 Hull Street Richmond, VA

> Sizertown Powhatan Co. Va. It is now spelled Ceaserton because of the sound. The Sizers were French Huguenots.

> > July 19, 1933

Mrs. Lillian Hubbard Holch, 330 Clinton Ave., Brooklyn, New York.

My dear Mrs. Holch:

I received your letter of June 14, 1933. I have done what I could for you in regard to the Sizer Family.

William Sizer married Mary Cosby, Sister of Bolling Cosby and Deborah Cosby who married William Henry Harrison. They were the children of William Cosby who married Judith Wilkerson, Governor of Goochland Co. Virginia. They are from David Cosby, whose will was made on December 9, 1768. He made a will to the following sons: Charles, David, Overton, John, James; and the following daughters: Barbara and Jane Cosby. He had one Grandson, who was Richard Tomkins. The same Will probated September 10, 1770. Charles and David Cosby his Sons were bonded each the Sum of one thousand pounds in current money as executive of the will in the Reighn of Sovereign, Lord George the third. David Cosby mentioned his wife several times, but never mentioned her name, so in William Sizer married Mary Cosby. I think the daughter of David line: Cosby. Their Son was Nathanial Sizer who married Miss Flourney of Chesterfield County. Father of Beverly Sizer of Old Sizer Tavern. Father of Sarah Sizer who married Gary, Brother of Mary Sizer who married Hale; whose daughter married a Nelson, a very large family of old Manchester.

I visited a Mrs. Caroline Cosby Wilkerson today, who is ninety-five. She said when a young Girl she and some other kin people stopped over night at Old Sizer Tavern, which was built in old Manchester, Virginia, at Eleventh & Hull Streets and not at Fifth & Hull Streets; which is now known as South Richmond, VA. On asking for their bill they were told by Wilkersons that they did not owe any bill as they never charged their kin folks even if they stayed any length of time. They were always welcome. Mrs. C. C. Wilkerson is the daughter of William Ludwell Cosby and my Mother; Rosa Cosby Cottrell, the daughter of Jefferson Cosby, Nephews of Mary Cosby Sizer, wife of William Sizer. Reuben may have been Sarah Sizer Gary's Brother. It was at Eleventh & Hull and not at Fifth & Hull. It was three story high without side steps, and with an Auditorium on top floor, where they gave plays and minstrel Shows. I remember cousin Sarah Sizer Gary and the Old Sizer Tavern very well. From this you can also see the remembrance of Mrs. Wilkerson. It was said after youy once drank of the water of the old well you would always come back because of their hospitality.

I will be glad for you to come to Virginia to visit me. I am not a Sizer for my Mother was Rosa Cosby who married Peter Cottrell. I am Minnie Jane Cottrell Hooker.

MARY M. COSBY & PETER COTTRELL #111122415224127

News of the discovery of gold in California thrilled the nation and Chesterfieldians in 1849 caught the fever badly. The Pacific Mining and Trading Company was organized to go in search of the golden treasure. In the company of 117 adventurers were W. H. Johnson, Jr., William M. duval, Peter Cottrell and J. F. Cottrell, of Chesterfield. The steamer Marrianna was purchased by the company and the party embarked at the Warwick wharf on March 16, 1849, headed for the long journey around the Horn. Before the ship sailed, William Francis Biship, of Bermuda Hundred, booked passage as a passenger, The ship had difficulties in crossing Trent's Bar in the James River, but on March 22 the Marianna steamed out of Norfolk with another Virginia manned ship, the Glenmore, hard on her heels

Fur six months the craft raced on around the cape into the Pacific and to San Francisco where the Marianna docked three days before her rival. There had been many disagreements aboard the Marianna in the six months at sea and the travel-weary travelers were so much at odds that they voted to disband the company, sell their assets and go off on their own to seek the yellow riches of the gold fields. No record of their individual progress has been found, but none of the Chesterfield men came back with a fortune to spend. Biship, on his return, became proprietor of a store at Bermuda Hundred which he was operating up to the end of the Civil War.

DEBORAH COSBY & WILLIAM HENRY HARRISON #1111224152247

William Henry Harrison was among the British soldiers who fought in the Battle of Waterloo, in Belgium, against Napoleon and the French army. After returning to England after the war, he was one of many who were unhappy and dissatisfied with their lot. With unemployment high, the government encouraged emigration, and he came to Virginia.

In 1818 William Henry Harrison arrived in Powhatan County, Virginia. After meeting Deborah Cosby, and after their courtship, they were married on November 21, 1821. About 1827 they built their home, Middlesex, which is still standing. It was named after his home in Middlesex, England.

In 1843 William and Deborah conveyed 1½ acres of land upon which present day St. Luke's Episcopal Church was built. The bricks for the church were made from clay dug from the tract of land upon which the church was built.

WILLIAM FLEMING HARRISON #11112241522472

William Fleming Harrison was born in the family home of Middlesex, in Powhatan County, where he lived until after his marriage to Maria Louise Cosby (his second cousin) on November 26, 1853. After the birth of their first child he moved, and bought property in the Dover Mill District of Goochland County.

As the Civil War grew closer he organized the Goochland Grays on April 10, 1861. On May 20, 1861 the organization was accepted into the Confederate Army as Company F of the 23rd Virginia Infantry. and he was the Captain.

The following is a letter written by William Fleming Harrison while on duty in the Civil War:

"Macdowell Thursday June 13th 1861

Dear Maria

We are marching on to Huttonville rapidly but very much fatigued crossing the mountains you have no conception what we have to undergo though we are getting use to it & our feet are hardening we have no tents & have to camp out in the open air but we are well provided with oilcloths. I laid my arm out on the grass last night in my sleep & when I awoke I had scasly any use of my arm but it getting a little better to night. I am at a Tavern to sleep tonight we will march to Hightown tomorrow night I want you to write to me at Huttonsville which is 80 miles from this place we expect to stay there several days to be surprised then we will go to Beverly & from there to Phillips where will have to burn some gun Powder the boys are all very well. Robert Sanders & Smithers are improving very much. Give my love to Ruth & hug her & kiss her for me. Your Affectionate Hus.

Wm F. Harrison

Direct your letter Capt. W. F. Harrison 23rd Regt Va Vols, Huttonville, Randolph County, VA"

In another letter he wrote:

"Mr. Young

Dear Sir

It is with deep regret that I have to announce to you that on the 23d of March your Brother Henry was taken prisoner Near Winchester. We were engaged with the enemy about three hours when there was a constant shower of minnie balls & the wonder is that our loss was no worse. Henry was taken with two others of my Company Johnson & Boler none of them were wounded & but for their making a mistake wouldn't have been Captured They mistook the Yankee Cavalry for ours & _____ to them I have seen the Northern report of wounded & prisoners & their names were among the Prisoners and were sent to Fort Delaware. This is one comfort for you & your fathers family. Henry is as brave and gallant a man although a youth as god ever made & his Captain is as much or more regretted than any in our Regt he was peacible & ever ready to do a favour for his friends & never have been reported unfit for duty from sickness nor otherwise since he has been in the service I wrote to your Father as soon as I knew he was a prisoner which was about two weeks ago. Let me hear from you.

Yours very Respectfully Wm. F. Harrison"

On July 13, 1861 he was wounded at Laurel Hill. His wound was evidently serious since he was on leave for sometime. He re-enlisted February 28, 1862 while he was still on sick furlough. Probably because of his physical condition, he resigned as Captain on April 21, 1862. On January 22, 1863 he enlisted again in Company B of the 42nd battalion of the Virginia Cavalry, and on July 1, 1864 he was promoted to Captain.

He was captured at Saylor's Creek on April 6, 1865, three days before the surrender at Appomatox Courthouse. He was paroled July 18, 1865 and discharged from the Johnson Island prison in Ohio.

MARGARET E. HARRISON & EDMOND ANDERSON HOOKER #11112241522473

Edmond Anderson Hooker was a man of many talents. He was a scribe. He wrote for many people who never knew how to write. He was a school teacher. He served as an election clerk for the county. He was an engineer on the boats on the Lynchburg to Richmond Canal. He served in the Powhatan Troop, Co. E, 4th Regiment of Virginia Cavalry. Soon after he he and Margaret Elizabeth Harrison were married, he built and operated a store very close to her family home, Middlesex. There his children were born. There he lived until the moved to Manchester.

He sold his store and it became known as Henley's Store. Eventially it was destroyed by fire. All that remains today are the front steps.

POCAHONTAS HOOKER & GEORGE BROOKS ELY #111122415224734

Pocahontas Hooker married George Brooks Ely on December 23, 1880, in St. Luke's Episcopal Church in Powhatan County. George Brooks Ely's father was a manufacturer or maker of bricks and engaged in constuction. He was born in Pennsylvania and married Eliza Elizabeth Brooks who was born in Massachusetts. On their honeymoon they came to Richmond, Virginia and fell in love with it. They went back home and decided to come down to Richmond to make it their home. This occurred just before the War Between the States. George Quincy Ely fought on the side of the South during the war and he had two brothers from Massachusetts who were killed and buried at Gettysburg. They were fighting on the Northern side. This division of opinions caused the Ely family to be badly severed. George Quincy Ely's father completely disowned him.

Margaret E. Hooker's family were all brick masons.

JAMES COSBY #111122415225

James Cosby, the son of David Cosby and Mary Johnson, was born 23 March 1765, probably in Goochland County, Virginia. On 26 February 1799 he and Theoditia "Docia" Smith, the daughter of Jobn Smith, secured a marriage license from Powhatan County to get married.

The will of James Cosby (Causby) follows:

"I, James Causby, of the County of Powhatan, believing myself ill, knowing the uncertainty of life, and being of sound mind, do make and publish this my last Will and Testament:-

First, I desire that all my just debts should be paid by my executors, hereafter to be named, as soon as they can possibly effect it:-

2ndly I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Docia Causby, during her widowhood, the use of the land I have bargained with Jordan Harris for, containing twenty five acres, adjoining the lands of Samuel Pleasants, and lying on the north side of the main Road leading to Fine Creek Mill, and is detached from his other lands by the aforesaid Road; for which I engaged to pay him the sum of ninety five pounds, part of the purchase money has been paid to him, whiich will appear from my account book; the balance of the debt due to him for the land aforesaid, I wish my Executors to discharge as soon as possible, from the debts due to me, and from the sale of my shop tools and stock of timber in it; when I entertain no doubt but Jordan Harris will execute such a title as my executors may think sufficient:-

3rd I also give unto my beloved wife the use of my negro girl named Nancy, with all the personal estate I die possessed of, so long as she remains a widow; In case of her again marrying, I desire that the whole of my estate of every description should be sold and the money arising therefrom be equally divided between my daughter Pinetta Causby, my son James Causby, and my daughter Rebecca Causby:-

4. After the payment of my debts, whatever balance there may be in the hands of my executors, arising from the sale of my tools etc before mentioned, and outstanding debts due to me, I desire they may apply it for the benefit of my wife and Children as they may think best:-

5: I appoint my friends John Goode Senr., Samuel Pleasants, and John Thos. Pleasants executors of this my last Will:-

In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the twenty sixth day of April in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred and six. Signed, sealed, and his

acknowledged to be James x Causby (seal) the last Will and mark Testament in presence of, his Joseph Dyer, Elijah Smith, Ben: X Bennet

mark

At a Court held for Powhatan county the 21st day of May 1806 This last will and Testament of James Causby deceased was presented in Court and proved by the oath of Elijah Smith and Benjamin Bennett, two subscribing witnesses thereto, and ordered to be recorded."

James' widow married David Cox, who removed to the Western Country (Kentucky)

"WILLIAM OVERTON CALLIS OF LOUISA COUNTY" #111122415272 "by Kenneth McCoy Lancaster Louisa, Virginia

The life of William Overton Callis is like that of a many faceted prism. He was a dedicated patriot and military officer during the great American Revolution, a practical and sensible politician, a devoted family man, a frugal business man, and a plantation owner and operator.

William O. Callis was born near Urbanna, Virginia, 23 March 1757, son of William and Mary Cosby Callis. Little is known about Callis' father, but his mother was Mary Cosby, daughter of David Cosby of Louisa County. His maternal grandmother was Nancy Overton of Louisa and Hanover County Overton families.

According to information in family papers, Callis was very young when his father died. Mary Cosby brought Callis and his elder brother to Louisa County to the home of his grandfather, David Cosby, at "Plain Dealing." The "Plain Dealing" plantation lay on the Overton Fork of Elk Creek in the eastern portion of Louisa.

It is believed that W. O. Callis spent most of his youth here at the Cosby home and received his basic schooling in Louisa County. The Reverend John Todd, just out of the college of Princeton, conducted a classical school at his home near the village of Orchid. Callis attended this school before entering the college of William & Mary at Williamsburg, Virginia.

W. O. Callis was only nineteen when the American Revolution began in earnest and at an early date in the war, probably the latter part of 1776, he entered the regular army. Prior to this, Callis had served as Quartermaster Sergeant of the Louisa Militia in the early part of 1776, but upon joining the regular army, served as Lieutenant.

The early part of the war, fought principally in the north, found Callis making the trek northward and taking part in the Battle of Brooklyn Heights. Callis was also in Washington's main army as they made the retreat from New York across New Jersey.

In January, 1777, W. O. Callis was promoted to Second Lieutenant. Shortly therafter he was promoted to Captain of the 4th Virginia Regiment, Virginia Line, Continental Army, under the command of Colonel Charles Dabney.

In 1778, Captain Callis was severely wounded at the battle of Monmouth, New Jersey. The injury, received as the result of cannon fire, damaged his lungs and thus forced him to take leave for recovery. To help regain his health, "He went to the West Indies in early 1779 where he remained through June of 1780."

Although unable to serve at full capacity, Captain Callis was retained to serve as aide-de-camp to General Nelson in the early part of 1781. While serving under General Nelson in southeast Virginia, he was promoted to Major.

One of Major Callis' primary jobs was to obtain information of enemy movements around Hampton Roads, Virginia. On the first day of April, 1780, he wrote General G. Weedon, Commander of the Continental Army stationed at Williamsburg, reporting the extent of such enemy movement around the Hampton area. Continuing his service under General Nelson, he took part in the siege of Yorktown in October of 1781.

In the remaining months of the war, Major Callis was relatively inactive, but he did not resign from his position. At some point during this time, he returned to Louisa County wher he received his commission as Colonel of Militia.

For services rendered to his country during the Revolutionary War, Colonel Callis and/or his heirs were issued the following land warrants or certificates of payment:

(1) Virginia Auditor reports a certificate for 113.8.0 was issued on 21 November 1783 to Villiam O. Callis of Louisa County for pay as lieutenant of infantry from 12 January 1777 to 27 September 1778.

(2) Warrant #6659 for 4000 ares was issued by the Virginia Land Office to the heirs of William O. Callis on 3 December 1824 for his service as captain for the war in the Virginia Continental Line.

(3) ...land warrant #1613 for 200 acres was issued on 10 November 1819.

Returning to Louisa County, after his military career, Colonel Callis bought several plantation tracts. The land best known and associated with him is that of "Cuckooville," or as it is known today, "Cuckoo Place," or just plain Cuckoo."

Colonel Callis purchased the Cuckoo land in 1788 from Robert and Barbara Barret. This 340 acre tract was described as being situated on the head branches of Little River in the County of Louisa and lying on both sides of the main road. The main road spoken of in this description was the road from Louisa Court House to Richmond. Callis lived on the western portion of the property which is known today as the "Whitehall" tract. The larger portion of the plantation lay on the east side of the road where the large, brick, two story dwelling of "Cuckoo Place" stands today. This dwelling was built by the Pendleton family who later acquired this portion of land from the heirs of W. O. Callis.

On or very near the side of the present day "Cuckoo house," V. O. An insurance policy dated 28 October 1802 Callis kept an ordinary. reveals that Callis took out fire insurance on "five buildings on my plantation called Cuckooville." It is quite evident that the ordinary stood near the present house site at Cuckoo because of two supporting facts-(1) the D. Yancey map of 1804 shows the tavern on the northeast side of the main road, and (2) W. O. Callis purchased from Anthony Winston a 32 acre tract in September of 1800 and this parcel of land, which was contiguous to the Callis tract, is described as "beginning at a large chestnut oak on the road leading from Louisa Court House to This 32 acre Winston tract lay just Richmond near Callis' Tavern. southeast of the present day house and would have encompassed a large portion of the field which is there today. This tract would have joined the main road near the present intersection of Routes 33 and 522.

On 23 October 1782, W. O. Callis married Martha Winston. Martha Winston was the sister of Robert Barret's wife, Barbara. Martha died the same year that W. O. Callis purchased "Cuckooville" from the Barrets, leaving her husband with three children-

(1) Eleanor Addison Callis, born 24 July 1784

(2) Cleon M. Callis born 14 January 1786

(3) Martha Winston Callis, born 20 April 1788

On May 4, 1790 Colonel Callis married his second wife, Anne Price of Hanover County.

The children of this marriage were as follows:

- (1) Lavinia Callis, born 11 February 1791
- (2) Otho W. Callis, born 13 October 1792

(3) Jane Cosby Callis, born 25 February 1795

(4) Arthur Callis, born 23 December 1796

(5) Tobias Shandy Callis, born 17 December 1799

(6) Caius Marcellus Callis, born 26 May 1804

(7) Mary Elizabeth Callis, born 23 September 1806

(8) Barbara Ann Callis, born 25 February 1814

In Addition to the Cuckoo tract, Colonel Callis owned two other plantations in Louisa County. One, a 660 acre tract named "Cool Springs" lying on the waters of Elk Creek, was acquired from Thomas Poindexter on 13 March 1786. The other tract also on the waters of Elk Creek was that of "Plain Dealing," which was a portion of the David Cosby land. In 1790, the estate of Cosby was sold by his unmarried daughter. W. O. Callis, Cosby's grandson, purchased the house tract of 330 acres.

W. O. Callis found land acquisition and plantation operation to be a lucrative business. In 1788, he was the fiftieth largest and fiftyseventh wealthiest landowner in the county, which put him in the top ten percent on both counts.

Colonel Callis also found time to work politics into his busy schedule. In 1788, he was elected delegate to the Virginia Convention, which ratified the Federal Constitution. He voted for its adoption on June 25, 1788.

Callis was very active in state politics until 1800. He was a member of the state legislature in 1798 and voted for the famous Virginia Resolutions. After his retirement from state politics, Callis served as Louisa County Sheriff from 1805-1806, as well as serving on many commissions.

Colonel William Overton Callis died on 30 March 1814 at his home at Cuckoo after a colorful and adventure-filled life. His will is recorded in the Clerk's Office of Louisa County in Will Book 5, page 489-490, and Will Book 9, page 453.

The personality of this colonial gentlemen is probably best described in an excerpt from family papers which gives a general sketch of the Colonel as it states, "He possessed personal beauty and a charm of manner, which with his high character and intellectual gifts made him beloved not only in his own family but also by a number of friends. He was strict in all things regarding the proper bearing of a gentleman." LOUISA COUNTY HISTORICAL MAGAZINE

AZGAD NAPOLEON BONAPARTE COSBY

Azgad Napoleon Bonaparte Cosby was the son of Anne Booker Cosby. Anne Booker Cosby lived in the Louisa-Goochland County area of Virginia, where all the Cosbys living in the area were related. By the process of elimination, it seems possible that the husband of Anne and the father of Azgad was Preston Cosby (#111122416353). In 1829, evidently Anne was a widow, as she transferred by deed property to her son Azgad. The deed was witnessed by Robert S. Cosby and William Walton, probably related as brother or father of Azgad's wives, who were Walton sisters. The brother of Robert S. Cosby, Charles Rufus Cosby, married a Miss Walton. The land conveyed by Anne Cosby to Azgad in 1829, had previously been conveyed to Anne Booker Cosby and her sister Elizabeth Jackson Cosby, in 1810, by their stepmother, a widow Jackson who had married Zacheus Cosby.

When Azgad married the second time to Nancy S. Walton, the witness and security were William J. Walton and Charles Johnston. David Cosby's first wife's name was Mary Johnson (Johnston), the daughter of Charles Johnson (Johnston), possibly the grandfather of this Charles Johnston. The line of Anne Booker Cosby is listed on the following page.

He married Elizabeth Woodhouse, the daughter of Captain Henry Woodhouse. The following newspaper article reveals some information:

"Charleston News", Sept. 22, 1907-Va. Carolina, Page 112:

Captain Henry Woodhouse, governor of Bermuda, was son of sir Henry Woodhouse of Waxham, England, and his wife Ann, (daughter of Sir Nicholas Bacon), who was son of John Woodhouse and his wife, Alice Croft.

Captain Henry Woodhouse was in the Expedition of Isle of Re and Rochelle; he was recommended to be Captain of Pilbury Fort and he was of the Muster of Suffolk County, England. From 1623 to 1626 he was Governor of Bermuda and was present at a council table there March 1, 1626. A few years later he petitioned King Charles to give him the Governorship of Virginia, a position which the King had promised but did not give to him.

His son, Henry II, was born in Bermuda, emigrated to Lower Norfolk. Virginia, when 30 years old and was Member of House of Burgesses from Norfolk in 1647-1652, and Commissioner of that county. He was member of the vestry of the old church at Lynnhaven. He died in 1655 leaving a wife, Mary or Judith, four sons, and several daughters-their names are:

Henry, Horatio, John, William.

Elizabeth Woodhouse, married Nicholas Meriwether

Sarah, Mary and Rachel.

One authority says the father of Sir Henry Woodhouse was Sir Wm. Woodhouse of Waxham and not John Woodhouse"

LEWISES, MERIWETHERS AND THEIR KIN, by Sarah Travers Lewis (Scott) Anderson.

Records of Surry County, Virginia show that he was the Clerk of Surry County on April 22, 1655. He was also the clerk of the Virginia Council. He owned large tracts of land in the colony. He died December 15, 1678 and on March 4, 1678-9 his widow, Mrs. Elizabeth Meriwether appeared as his administratrix.

NICHOLAS MERIWETHER (II)

Nicholas Meriwether was born October 20, 1667 in James City County, Virginia. He was a Burgess for New Kent County of October 1710, November 1711, January 1712, October 1712, November 1713, November 1714, August 1715, April 1718, November 1720 and May 1722. He married Elizabeth Crawford, the daughter of David Crawford, of New Kent County.

"These Crawfords are said to be descended from Sir Roland Crawford, the grandfather of Sir William Wallace.

John Crawford, born 1600, came from Scotland to Virginia and died December 1689.

David, his only son, born 1625, died 1704, came to Virginia with his father between 1643 and 1667, lived in St. Peter's, afterwards St. Paul's Parish in New Kent, now Hanover County. He was vestryman of St. Peter's 1685 to 1698. He died 1704. He came to America between 1643 and 1667, this last being date of grant of land from Sir Wm. Berkeley of 86 acres. Locating also 1,000 acres and two grants, 1672, of 1,000 acres on head-right. Other grants in St. Peter's, New Kent County, 1,350 acres, 375 acres. In 1676, 1,300; 277; 196 acres, all in New Kent County. All deeded to Captain David Crawford who may have been his son. Issue:

- 2. Jane Crawford married Robert Lewis and went South

LEVISES, MERIWETHERS AND THEIR KIN, by Sarah Tavers Lewis (Scott) Anderson

Nicholas later moved to Goochland County. Like his father, Nicholas acquired much land. On 26 June 1727 he obtained a grant of 13,762 acres of land from King George II. The conditions were that he was to pay 21 pounds sterling yearly at the feast of St. Michael, the archangel. 1 shilling for every 50 acres of land of which at least 3 acres must be cultivated. In 1730 a second grant of 4,090 acres of land was the area to contain the following plantation homes: "Castle Hill", "Peacholorum", "Turkey Hill", "Kinloch", "Belvoir", "Music Hall", "Cloverfields", and "Cismont". A further land grant of 1,020 acres of land was granted to him in 1735, on which his home, "Plantation", was built. He died in December 1744, in Goochland, present day Albemarle County.

His will has survived and is recorded in Goochland County and reads as follows:

"In the name of God amen. I Nicholas Meriwether of Hanover County in the Colony of Virginia. Knowing the uncertainty of this life do make and ordain this to be my last Will and Testament in Manner and Form following.

Imprimis. I do give my Soul to Almighty God who gave it to me.

Hopeing through the Merit of my Blessed Savious Jesus Christ to obtain pardon and remission for all my sins, and my Body to be decently Intered at the direction of my executors hereafter named, but not with any Pomp or shoe, and as for my Worldly Estate which it hath pleased Almighty God to bless me with, I give it as followeth, after all my Just Debts be paid.

Item. I do give and bequeath unto my Grand Daughter Judith Littlepage Four Hundred and fifty nine acres of land in King William County over against my son William Meriwethers plantation together with the Houses and Orchards as also eleven Negro Slaves (viz) Fil, Toby, Jamy, Jenny, Bety, Will, Aggy, Vilet, Abby, John, Sarah, with their further increase that are now on the said land to her and the Heirs of Her Body Lawfully begotten and if it should please God that she should die without Heirs of their Body should fail, then I do give and bequeath unto my son William Meriwether the aforesaid Four Hundred and fifty nine acres of Land together with the Plantation to Him and his Heirs forever. Also I do give unto my two sons William Meriwether and David Meriwether the above said Negro Slaves together with their futer Incres to be equally divided between them and their Heirs forever.

Item. I do give and bequeath unto my grand Daughter Judeth Littlepage two malatto Boys by name Charles and Jamy to be delivered Her at Her marriage or when she shall come to the age of Twenty one years and to the Heirs of Her Body Lawfully Begotten and in case my said Grand Daughter should die without having such Heirs, then 1 do give the above said two Malatto Boys Charles and Jamy to my Grandson John Meriwether and to his Heirs forever.

Item. I do give and bequeath unto my Daughter Ann Johnson the land and plantation where she formerly lived on the East side of the branch that parts it and the land I bought of Edward Nix being about six hundred and thirty acres, during her natural life and after her Decease I do give and bequeath the said land to my Grandson William Johnson son to my above said Daughter Ann, and to the Heirs of his Body Lawfully begotten, and in case he fails of such Heirs, then I do give and bequeath the said Land to my son William Meriwether and his Heirs forever.

Item. I do give and bequeath to my Daughter Ann Johnson my Plantation commonly called and known by the name of Roundabout together with Thurteen hundred acres of land to Her and Her Heirs forever.

Item. 1 give and bequeath to my Grandson Nicholas Lewis the son of Mr. Robert Lewis my Plantation and land whereon I now live Containing by Patent One thousand and twenty acres together with One hundred and nineteen acres part of a greater Tract bought of Thomas Graves, to be laid offf in the most convenient manner, adjoining to Thousand and Twenty acres before mentioned to him the said Nicholas and his Heirs forever.

Item. I give and bequeath to my above said Grandson Nicholas Lewis one Negro Boy of about six years of age to be delivered at the Division of my slaves hereafter mentioned to him and his Heirs forever, likewise I give unto my said Grandson Nicholas Lewis twenty head of meat cattle and twenty head of Hoggs to be delivered him after my wifes [wife's] death that is to say. Ten head of cattle and Ten head of Hoggs to be Delivered from the Plantation where I now live and Ten head of cattle and Ten head of Hoggs from off the Plantation whereon Robert Dalton formerly lived to him and his Heirs forever.

Item. I give and bequeath unto my Grandson Richard Meriwether son of my son William Meriwether Seven hundred acres of Land in the County of Goochland it being part of eight hundred and nineteen acres bought of Thomas Graves to him and his Heirs forever.

Item. I give and bequeath unto my son David Meriwether my Fork Plantation he now lives together with four hundred acres of Land to him and his Heirs forever.

Item. I give and bequeath unto Mildred Meriwether Daughter of Nicholas Meriwether deceased one Negor Girl of about her own age to be Delivered at the Division of my slaves hereinafter mentioned to her and her Heirs forever.

Item. I do give and bequeath unto my Loving Wife Elizabeth Meriwether One Hundred pounds sterling money of Great Britain, together with what new goods and plate I shall have in my house at my Death to her and her Heirs forever.

I do give and bequeath unto my Son in Law Mr. Robert Lewis Item. fifteen Hundred acres of Land where he now lives according to several courses as it is laid off to him, as it will appear by deed Recorded in Hanover Court to him and his Heirs forever. I do lend unto my Loving wife Elizabeth Meriwether Twelve working negroes and two Negor Girles she having her choyce as also all my household goods and Ninty head of neat Cattle and Ninty head of Hoggs young and old and all my working horses with four choice breeding mares during her natural life, and after her Deth, I do give and bequeath the above said mentioned fourteen Negros and their increas to be equally divided between my Seven Grandsons and three granddaughters (viz) John Meriwether, Thomas Meriwether, Richard Meriwether, Jane Meriwether, Sarah Meriwether, and Mary Meriwether Sons and Daughters of William Meriwether, and to Nicholas Meriwther, Francis Meriwether, James Meriwether, and William Meriwether Sons of David Meriwether and to the Heirs of their Bodys for Ever, and in case fore they should come to Lawfull age or have Issue of their body either of the said Grandchildren above mentioned should die be lawfully begotten then their part of the said fourteen slaves with their increas to go to the survivors of them as also I do give and bequeath unto my said seven Grandsons and three Granddaughters after the Death of my said Wife what of the stock of Hoggs, Cattle, Horses and Mares and what shall be left of my Household goods to be equally divided between them and their Heirs for Ever, and in case either of them should die before they attain to Lawfull age or married then their intended part to go to the Survivors of them and their Heirs forever.

Item. I give and bequeath unto Mary Lewis Daughter of Mr. Robert Lewis one Negro girl of near her own age, to her and her Heirs forever. Item. I do give and bequeath unto Mildred Lewis Daughter of Mr. Robert Lewis one Negor girl of near her own age to her and her Heirs forever.

Item. I do give and bequeath unto Robert Lewis Son of Mr. Robert Lewis a Negro boy of near his own age to him and his Heirs forever.

Item. I do give and bequeath unto Isabella Lewis Daughter of Mr. Robert Lewis one Negro girl of near her own age to her and her Heirs forever.

Item. I do give and bequeath unto Nicholas Meriwether son of my Grandson Thomas Meriwether a Negro boy about his own age to him and his Heirs forever.

Item. I do give and bequeath unto my Grand Daughter Elizabeth Bray two Negro boys by name Tom son to old Tom that I bought of James Blackwell and Tom son to Tom and Doll his wife to be delivered her at her marriage or when she shall come to full age, and if she should die before marriage, or before she shall come to twenty one years of age, then I do give the above said two Negro Boys to my Grand son Nicholas Lewis and to his Heirs forever. October 1743 I have delivered those two to Mr. Philip Johnson her husband.

Item. I give and bequeath unto John Meriwether son to my son William Meriwether Two Thousand acres of Land that is laid off next his Brother Nicholas Meriwether deceas'd Including where his Quarter is built to him and his Heirs forever.

Item. I do give and bequeath unto my Grand son Nicholas Meriwether son to my son David Meriwether Two Thousand acres of Land Joyning to John Meriwethers line and to include the Plantation whereon he now lives to him and his Heirs forever.

Item. I do give and bequeath unto my Grand son Francis Meriwether son to my son David Meriwether all the Land that lies between Mr. Robert Lewis's line and Nicholas Meriwether's deceas'd line being about Sixteen hundred acres be the same more or less, to him and his Heirs for Ever.

Item. I do give and bequeath unto my Grand son James Meriwether son to my son David Meriwether Eleven hundred and fifty acres of Land that lies on the Beaver Dams where old Toby lives to him and his Heirs forever.

Item. I do give and bequeath unto my Grand son William Meriwether son to my son David Meriwether Twelve hundred and Seventy acres of Land that lies between Mr. Robert Lewis's line and Capt. Thomas Meriwethers line being the place where old Jack lived, to him and his Heirs forever.

Item. I do give and bequeath unto my Grand son Thomas Meriwether sone to my son William Meriwether after my wife's Death all the Land that I have below Nicholas Meriwethers line of my first Mountain Survey to Mr. Robert Lewis's line that he bought of Capt. Christopher Clark, to him and his Heirs forever.

Item. I do give and bequeath unto my Grand son William Meriwether son to my son David Meriwether Four Hundred and Fifty acres of Land, that his father had a Quarter on to him and his Heirs for Ever.

Item. I do give and bequeath unto my Grand son Richard Meriwether

son to my son William Meriwether my Quarter and Land where Negro Jamy lives that I bought of Edward Nix, with some more land added to it in all about Three hundred acres to him and his Heirs for Ever.

Item. I do give and bequeath unto Catherine Holladay Daughter of Capt. William Holladay who now lives with Mrs. Bickley of King William County, Twenty Six shillings Currant money to be paid her when at age or married.

Item. I do give and bequeath unto Jane Lewis Daughter of Mr. Robert Lewis Twenty five pounds sterling money of Great Britain.

I do give and bequeath unto my Seven Grand sons and Three Item. Grand daughters (viz) John Meriwether, Thomas Meriwether, Richard Meriwether, Jane Meriwether, Sarah Meriwether, and Mary Meriwether sons and Daughters of my son William Meriwether and Nicholas Meriwether, Francis Meriwether, James Meriwether and William Meriwether sons of my son David Meriwether all my negor slaves that I have not yet disposed of to be equally divided between them and their Heirs for Ever, and I also do give and bequeath unto my ten Grand children (viz) John Meriwether, Thomas Meriwether, Richard Meriwether, Francis Meriwether, James Meriwether and William Meriwether, sons and Daughters of William Meriwether and Nicholas Meriwether, Frances Meriwether, James Meriwether and William Meriwether sons of David Meriwether all my stocks and Hoggs and Cattle Horse and Maers that I have not yet disposed of to be equally divided between my Ten Grand children above mentioned, and if any of my said Grand children should die before they come to Lawful age or marriage Then their intended part to go to the survivors and their Heirs That is I mean the Negros and their increase above mentioned forever. to go to the survivors as well as the stock.

Item. My will and desire is that the negro slaves and stocks be at the loss of my Ten Grand children before mentioned they having the Profits. As also my will and desire is that when the first of my Ten Grand children come to Lawful age that then the above mentioned slaves and stocks to be laid off in Ten Equal lots, provided all my said Ten Grand children shall be alive, (if not) The lots to be of each childs part so living and that my sons William Meriwether, David Meriwether and Mr. Robert Lewis do lay off the same lots and each child to draw according to the direction of my said Three sons as also at the Death of my above said wife that my aforesaid two sons and my Son in Law Mr. Robert Lewis may divide what negros stock of household goods shall be left at Her Death and also for my before mentioned Ten Grand children to draw Equal lots for the same as before mentioned.

Item. It is my will and meaning is, that the Four Negro slaves viz, Pharoh, Sipio, Sue and Lucy which I have already delivered to my Grand son Nicholas Meriwether son of David Meriwether be reckoned and accounted part of the above said Dividant which is to be hereafter made amongst my Ten Grand children But if either of his negro women (viz) Sue or Lucy would have any children between my delivering them to my said grand son and the Division hereafter to be made by my sons as aforesaid amongst my said Ten Grand children that then it is my desire the above said Nicholas Meriwether should not be accountable for them children to the above Estate, but Injoy them as his own proper estate. It is likewise my desire that the two Negro slaves delivered my Grand son John Meriwether son of William Meriwether (viz) Dick a Negro man and Lucy a Negro woman be reckoned and accounted in part of the above said Devidant which is to be hereafter made amongst my Ten grand children, but if his Negro woman Lucy has or should have any children between my delivering them to my said grand son and the division hereafter to be made by my sons as aforesaid among my said grand children that then it is my desire that the above said John Meriwether should not be accountable for those children to the above Estate but Injoy them as his own proper Estate.

Item. I also do give and bequeath unto my said Grand son John Meriwether son of my son William Meriwether two Negros (viz) Robin a negro man and Judeth a negor woman which he has now in his possession, to him and his Heirs forever.

Item. It is likewise my desire that the above two negros (viz) Robin and Judeth Be reckoned and accounted in part of the above said dividant which is to be hereafter made amongst my Ten Grand children, but is this Negro woman Judeth should have any children between my delivering Her to my said Grand son and the division hereafter to be made by my son as aforesaid amongst my said Ten Grand children. That then it is my desire that the above said John Meriwether should not be accountable for those children to the above Estate, but Injoy them as his own proper Estate.

Item. I do give and bequeath unto my Son in Law Mr. Robert Lewis Fifty pounds Stearling money of Great Britain.

Item. My will and desire is that my Estate be not brought to an appraisement. Lastly I do constitute appoint and ordain my loving wife Elizabeth Meriwether and my Son in Law Mr. Robert Lewis Executrix and Executor of this my last will and testament revoking all other wills by me made before this day as witness my hand and seal this 12th day of December 1743.

Signed sealed and delivered in the presents of Pet. Jefferson, Samuel Dalton, George Taylor, Chas. Lynch.

At a Court held for Goochland county Novemb. 20, 1744 Peter Jefferson, Chas. Lynch, and Samuel Dalton proved this writing to be the last will and testament of Nicholas Meriwether, gent., deceased wch was ordered to be recorded.

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OVERTON FAMILY

The records of the Overton family exist as far back as the thirteenth century with Adam de Overton, of Oxford County, appearing in 1273 on the HUNDRED ROLLS. However, it is not until the Overton family records beginning with John Overton, of Easington, England that the Overton family can be traced until the present time.

JOHN OVERTON

John Overton was born in Easington Parish, Yorkshire, England. His son, Robert, installed a monument in the south-east corner of Easington Church in honor of John Overton and his mother, Joan. The Overton ancestral home, Overton Hall, was destroyed in 1887. He was a Justice of the Peace, a position of distinction. While he was an old man when the Civil War broke out in England, it was known that he was a strong supporter of King Charles' cause.

The will of John Overton was signed July 20, 1648, along with a codicil signed on September 20, 1650. He named the children of his son Colonel Robert Overton, and his brother William.

Tradition holds that he was of the same family as the famous Bishop William Overton of Coventry and Litchfield, England.

ROBERT OVERTON

Robert Overton was born in Easington Parish, Yorkshire, England in 1609. In 1632 he married Ann Gardiner, the daughter of Jeremy Gardiner of Stratford Bow, Middlesex, England. Unlike his father, he left the church in 1650, and he and his wife joined a body of Independents who formed a protestant church. Their names were recorded in the church book which is now in the possession of the Presbyterian Church, Spring Bank, Hull.

Robert Overton and Ann Gardiner were the parents of John Overton and William Overton.

Robert was a real patriot, and in the "Thurloe Papers" (which contain much of his correspondence), he wrote, "If I be called to seal the cause of God and my country with my blood, by suffering death, or by bearing any testimony to the interests of my nation and the despised truths of these times, he is able to support and save me, as the sun to shine upon me--If I can but keep faith and a good conscience, I shall assuredly finish my course with joy."

"He was admitted to practice law at Gray's Inn on November 1, 1631. He was appointed deputy to Sir Thomas Fairfax, Governor of Pontrefact in 1645. In 1647 he was placed in command of a Regiment of Foot Soldiers and shortly thereafter appointed Governor of Hull. In the second Civil War, Overton's Regiment fought under Cromwell in Wales. In 1650, he accompanied Cromwell to Scotland and commanded a brigade of foot soldiers at the Battle of Dunbar and was designated Governor of Edinburgh by Cromwell. He commanded the reserve forces at Inverkeithing with Monck in Scotland and assisted in the subjugation of Scotland and the garrisoning of the Orkneys. At this time, Cromwell accompanied King Charles I back into England.

Parliament paid him 400 pounds a year as a reward for his services and General Deane designated Overton to command all the English forces in Western Scotland. He was designated Governor of Aberdeen at that In 1653, he succeeded to the family estate at Easington, returned time. to England and became Governor of Hull. At that time he hailed with enthusiasm Cromwell's forcible dissolution of Parliament as he was dissatisfied with the slow process of reformation under that body. But shortly afterwards when Cromwell assumed the post of "protector" and dissolved the "Little Parliament", he became suspicious and told Cromwell that "if he saw he did design to set up himself and not the good of the nation, he would not set one foot before another to serve him", and retained his commission on the promise to surrender it if he could not conscientiously serve Cromwell.

In December of 1654 he was arrested and sent prisoner to England on the charge of intending to head a military insurrection against the government, and placed in the Tower of London, where King Charles II wrote him promising forgiveness for past disloyalty and reward for service in effecting a restoration.

After two years in the Tower, he was sent to Jersey and confined in Elizabeth's Castle until March 1658. His sister petitioned Richard Cromwell's parliament on February 3, 1659, to release her brother, and on March 16, after hearing Overton at his trial in London, Parliament voted his immediate release and pronounced his imprisonment at Jersey illegal. On October 12, 1659, he was one of the seven Commissioners appointed by Parliament to administer the armed Forces of England. He frustrated Moncks, who planned to bring him back to King Charles, and was again arrested and sent to the Tower in 1660. Soon liberated, he was almost immediately arrested as "refusing to take the oaths or give security". In January 1664, the government again sent him to Jersey, and he was still imprisoned there in February of 1668, after which all trace of him in England was lost.

His military career furnished Scott material for his "Woodstock" and "Old Morality" and Milton celebrated his exploits in "Defensio Secunda".

The custom of the times was to send political prisoners to the Barbadoes or to Virginia, and it is believed he was transported to the Barbadoes, for Hatton's Christ Church, Barbadoes, 22 December 1679, includes one Robert Overton, living there alone, without family and without servants, possessing but five acres of land." HISTORICAL SOUTHERN FAMILIES, VOLUME V, by John Bennett Boddie.

WILLIAM OVERTON

William Overton was born December 3, 1638 in Easington, England. family tradition holds that William Overton came to Virginia in 1669 in search of his father, and failing to locate him, remained in New Kent County, Virginia.

The following year, 1670, Elizabeth Waters, the daughter of Samuel and Ann Waters of St. Sepulchre Parish, London, England, came to Virginia and she and William were married on board the ship November 24, 1670, anchored at Yorktown, Virginia. The cost of her coming to America, which he paid, was fifty pounds of tobacco. "At the 1907 Jamestown Exposition, there was a picture showing the bride being met by William dressed in the garb of a Covenanter, showing that the tradition was that he had taken his father's position in religion." (MY SOUTHERN FAMILIES, by Hiram Kennedy Douglass) Their love story is said to be the basis of the famous novel, "To Have and To Hold". Before their marriage, William's father, Robert, was in prison and "all of his name were under ban. As the faithful nurse of Mary Elizabeth Waters brought word of the approach of the soldiers of King Charles searching for William, Mary Waters hid him in one of the secret chambers of her house, then at midnight wrapped in her red cloak and guided by the faithful nurse, she conducted her lover to a vessel bound for the new world, aided by the nurse's son, the Captain of the ship. Mary knew her Catholic parents would never consent to her marrying a "round head," so later, disguised as a gypsy maiden she entered a ship bound for Virginia, and, as the novelists sometimes have it, Love, Life, and Happiness. Young Overton exiled from all that was dear to him was one of the first to board the vessel when it touched at Yorktown to try to find some word of Mary Waters. The captain revealed her presence there and brought them together in marriage." RECORDS OF LEWIS, MERIVETHER, AND KINDRED FAMILIES, by Lottie Wright Davis. It is always nice to have two accounts of a wedding!

On April 23, 1681 William Overton was deeded 4600 acres of land on the south side of the Pamunky River on Falling Creek for transporting 92 people to the colony. In 1690 another deed, for 1690 acres of land, was recorded for land in St. Peter's Parish.

When Elizabeth Waters died, her will, proved July 1700 gave ten shilings to Elizabeth Overton, "now in Virginia", and also the same amount to her son-in-law, William Overton.

James Overton was a Justice of Hanover County, and also a Captain of the Militia.
